*Authority:* Section 10-203, State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.

*Proposal:* The Department of Budget and Management proposes updates to the State Fleet Management Manual to support the continued right-sizing of Maryland's fleet.

### Current policy:

• An authorized driver who chooses to use a privately owned vehicle for official business when a State vehicle is available shall be reimbursed at one-half the ordinary standard rate for the use of privately owned vehicle. If no vehicle is available, the authorized driver is reimbursed at the (full) ordinary standard rate for the use of a privately owned vehicle.

Updated policy:

An authorized driver who chooses to use a privately owned vehicle for official business when a State vehicle is available shall be reimbursed <u>at the (full)</u> ordinary standard rate for the use of privately owned vehicle up to 650 miles per month. Reimbursement for mileage in excess of 650 miles per month shall be reimbursed at one-half the ordinary standard rate for the use of a privately owned vehicle. If no vehicle is available, the authorized driver is reimbursed at the (full) ordinary standard rate for the use of a privately owned vehicle.

**Remarks:** The Department of Budget and Management proposes an update to the State Fleet Management Manual to support the continued right-sizing of Maryland's fleet. An analysis by the State's Government Modernization Initiative consultant has determined that the average annualized breakeven point for State fleet vehicles is 7,800 miles (650 miles per month). Below this threshold it is more cost-effective for the State to reimburse travel at the full mileage rate rather than incur the cumulative costs of vehicle operations, maintenance, insurance, and depreciation. The proposed changes will allow for reimbursable mileage at the full reimbursement rate in cases employees use their personal vehicle to conduct state business, up to a mileage cap of 650 miles per month. These updates are intended to ensure flexibility in travel options for state employees while maintaining fiscal responsibility and operational efficiency.

# 9A. <u>WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA</u> Charles County (Cecchini)

**Recommendation:** That the Board of Public Works approve the Department of Natural Resources incorporating a Notice of Federal Participation in the deed to property that will become a newly designated Wildlife Management Area so that the value of the property can be used as match for a federal grant for land management of the Department's statewide wildlife management area system.

Authority:	State Finance and Procurement, Section 10-305, which provides for "Disposal of real or personal property of the State; conditions, consideration".
Prior Approval:	The Board of Public Works approved DNR to acquire 70.56 acres on Swanson Creek from Louis R. Cecchini, <i>et al.</i> as DNR-RP Item 6A (February 12, 2025).

**Description:** This proposal will allow the Department to use the acquisition value of the Cecchini property as a match to a U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service wildlife management grant. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service allows the value of land managed for wildlife and purchased with non-federal funds as match for the operation and maintenance of the State's wildlife management area system. The Cecchini property will be acquired with state Program Open Space funds. A condition of the grant is the Department will identify in the deed the federal interest in the title of the real property and will record with the deed a Notice of Federal Participation that further describes the purpose of the acquisition and outlines the terms and conditions of the grant.

**Background:** The Department's wildlife management area system is comprised of 65 wildlife management areas totaling over 128,000 acres located throughout the state. Land management, grants have been provided by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services for over 35 years to provide funding to these areas for wildlife habitat and public access for wildlife-oriented recreation. The grants have a match requirement of 25% state and 75% federal for total outlay during the grant period. Recognizing the State's purchase value of the Cecchini property will allow the Department to leverage significant federal funds for management of the State's wildlife management area system.



### 9A. <u>WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA</u> (cont'd) Charles County (Cecchini)

*Notice of Federal Participation:* Once acquired, the property will remain state-owned property. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service requires that the property deed include a Notice of Federal Participation. The ramifications of incorporating a Notice of Federal Participation in the deed for this property are as follows:

- 1. The property must remain in the wildlife management area system.
- 2. The property must continue to provide habitat for wildlife and remain open to the public for hunting and other wildlife-oriented recreation.
- 3. If the conditions of #1 and #2 above are not met, mitigation will be required by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service to replace the value of the area.

The Department has reviewed the language of the Notice of Federal Participation and has found it consistent with its management of the State's wildlife management area system.

*Clearinghouse:* The Clearinghouse has previously concluded, after consultation with the Office of the Attorney General, that incorporating a Notice of Federal Participation does not require Clearinghouse review.

*Requesting Agency Remarks*: This consulting contract encompasses comprehensive preliminary and final design services associated with the preparation of construction contract plans and documents as directed by MDTA.

MDTA is requesting approval of this essential modification to ensure the continuation of services for existing assigned tasks, including design and preliminary engineering services for the construction of capital projects, as well as inspection, evaluation, and engineering studies for strategic efforts to maintain MDTA's assets. Additionally, the funding is needed for other critical ongoing tasks. Governor Moore signed an Executive Order on November 17, 2023, that authorizes Project Labor Agreements (PLA) for construction projects. The decision to require the use of a PLA is made on a project-by-project basis after a feasibility study is performed. At the time that this contract was developed, the number of projects MDTA considered for a project labor agreement was small, determined on a case-by-case basis, and outside of the standard project development process. The Executive Order requires that a larger pool of projects consider use of a PLA, becoming a standard consideration in the development of construction projects. Studies performed to consider the use of and demonstrate the benefit of a PLA were not contemplated at the time of contract award and resulted in an increase in contract spend. New regulatory changes in environmental permitting, including resiliency reviews, have necessitated more extensive designs, reviews, and coordination for both new and existing construction projects. There have also been increased wage rates for architectural and engineering design services. Furthermore, there is a heightened focus on project communication for public outreach across various media platforms, leading to increased project development costs. MDTA has determined that the funding for the existing contract will be depleted before the new contract is procured. The contract modification is solely for funding, with an anticipated award date of 2026 for the new contract. The new solicitation was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage on April 30, 2025. Eight modifications were presented to the Board of Public Works: six in August 2024, one in November 2024, and one on July 2, 2025. This will be the final modification in the contract series.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MDTA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and VSBE participation goals. A 24% MBE goal was established for the contract. STV Incorporated/Jacobs Engineering Group, Inc. is on target to reach the MBE goal although current compliance is at 16.73%. This Contract is currently at 20.4% committed for MBE subconsultants use by the Joint Venture. While the current billing amount for MBE is at 16.73%, this percentage will increase as the MBE firms perform work over the remaining term of the contract and invoice for charges on their committed tasks. Work to be conducted by the certified VSBE subcontractor has yet to be assigned and will occur later on the contract to achieve participation compliance of 1%.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** This solicitation was advertised via eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on April 25, 2023, as a Request for Proposal. Proposals were due on August 22, 2023. A total of 139 firms were solicited through eMMA, and 10 firms were directly solicited. A total of five firms submitted technical proposals in response to the solicitation. During the evaluation phase one of the firms American Bus and Truck, withdrew their proposal, due their manufacturer going out of business. After review by the Evaluation Committee, four firms were selected for award for an aggregated contract value not to exceed \$94,814,458.00. The Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) requested an extension to the duration of proposals; the four firms agreed .

These contracts enable the MTA to purchase from four medium sized vehicle types, with trucks and buses as the main vehicle types, to be supplied throughout the contract term, for LOTS, and a maximum of 113 vehicles can be ordered under the contract. The maximum number of vehicles was based on a schedule to replace vehicles whose useful life has been exhausted, or to expand the MTA LOTS fleet on an as needed basis. The variation in vehicle type is dependent upon the different vehicle options, those options include: regular gas; diesel; compressed natural gas; battery electric transmission types.

The MTA manages a number of funding programs comprised of federal and State funds which support transportation providers throughout the State. These programs benefit both public transportation and specialized transportation services, LOTS, the Intercity Bus Program, Rideshare Programs, as well as statewide coordination of Human Services initiatives.

Serving victims of sex trafficking requires providers with advanced training in trauma recovery, cultural responsiveness, and a deep understanding of the coercive control and psychological trauma associated with trafficking. This provider has a demonstrated history of effective service delivery and employs staff trained in evidence-based, survivor-centered approaches.

In addition to their clinical expertise, the provider is well-integrated into the local service network and maintains established partnerships with law enforcement, legal aid, child welfare agencies, and healthcare professionals – ensuring coordinated, wraparound care.

Contracting with this provider not only ensures that victims of sex trafficking receive the comprehensive and responsive services they require, but also expands in-state capacity to support high-needs youth, reducing the reliance on out-of-state or less specialized placements.

This contract provides continuity of care. Originally, the Local Departments of Social Services (LDSS) entered into agreements with the provider for these services. TurnAround Inc. had a federal grant which covered the cost of the services. The grant was eliminated.

MBE Participation was not established for this contract due to the specialized nature of the services, there are no subcontracting opportunities for this procurement. All services as outlined in the Scope of Work are provided by the sole provider.

The price has been determined to be fair and reasonable. Research shows that a few other studies were conducted by Pennsylvania's Department of Education, Charles County Task Force, various school districts, California Regional Transit Agencies, and the National Association for Pupil Transportation. The prices ranged from \$50,000 to \$250,000. The cost of removing the current infrastructure in place (removal and transportation of existing trailers, sidewalks, steps, ramps, IT infrastructure, water and fire alarm systems) would be substantial. In addition, a new provider would need to construct the modular trailers to meet DJS's required specifications. causing disruption to educational services. DJS considered the use of an existing competitively bid procurement with the Baltimore Public School Modular classroom leasing contract JBO-717-19. The analysis showed the cost of a new modular building lease would be \$1,772,047.79 (Lease, Transportation, and installation) with a monthly cost of \$19,933.08. Based on the comparison of costs and the significant disruption of educational services, this would cause. DJS determined it to be in the State's best interest to extend the current agreement for the existing Modular Classrooms. Failing to approve this extension risks creating a gap in education services, jeopardizing compliance with legislative requirements and interrupting vital support for our young people.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** On June 6, 2024, Department of General Services (DGS), on behalf of the Department of Information Technology (DoIT), advertised a notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA). Additionally, DGS sent automated notifications to 3,623 vendors through eMMA, and direct solicited 1,641 vendors, (with 1,530 certified minority-owned businesses from the MDOT MBE Directory included among these figures). Ultimately, DGS received a total of 72 proposals. Thirty six (36) proposals were not reasonably susceptible for award for various deficiencies, including failure to complete and submit with their proposals the required MBE and VSBE forms. Thirty-six (36) proposals were deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award.

The RFP stated that up to eight (8) awards would be made. The eight (8) highest-ranked offerors are recommended for award because their proposals were determined to be the most advantageous to the State. The pool of eight (8) contractors may all perform the full suite of services. This is a Fixed Price / Indefinite Delivery Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contract, pursuant to COMAR 21.06.03.02 and 21.06.03.06, with labor-hour-based Work Orders. Work will be assigned on a rotational basis and priced in accordance with pre-approved labor categories using fully loaded rates proposed by the Contractors.

These offerors submitted proposals that fully addressed the RFP's evaluation criteria, contained little or no material weaknesses, and offered prices DoIT deemed reasonable.

Throughout the term of the Contract, each request for IT resources will be governed by a work order process in accordance with pre-approved Labor Categories with the fully loaded rates contained in the offerors' financial proposals or financial best and final offers. The State will rotate work assignments among the awarded contractors by issuing work order requests in the order of highest to lowest overall ranked Contractor. This sequence will repeat as necessary throughout the life of the Contract.

This procurement is designed to provide State agencies with Contractors who offer a broad range of digital services, including content strategy, web experience, and application system and software development. As a result of the awards from this solicitation, State agencies will obtain digital solutions that meet their specific needs, streamline procurement, and enhance government service delivery. This contracting vehicle is also available to Maryland local and county government jurisdictions and not-for-profit entities within the State of Maryland, as defined in State Finance and Procurement \$13-110(a)(5) - (7). These non-State users may procure goods and services under the same terms, conditions, and pricing as State agencies.

An overall MBE subcontracting goal of 25% applies to all areas with the exception of Fearless, who has committed to exceeding the goal by .5% for an overall 25.5% MBE goal. An overall 5% VSBE participation goal was established. All awardees have committed to meeting the VSBE goal.

As the solicitation progressed, eight (8) protests and three (3) appeals were received. As noted below, one protestor also contacted the MBSCA and was advised to seek a final response from DGS-OSP, which subsequently reaffirmed its denial. Below is a summary of the protests:

Eight (8) protests were received in total. Of these, six (6) were denied and two (2) were sustained. (See Attachment III). The protests raised concerns about alleged flaws in the evaluation process, including improper application of evaluation criteria, misinterpretation of proposal content, unequal treatment of offerors, and procedural inconsistencies such as mid-evaluation changes and unclear oral presentation procedures. Some vendors also alleged bias in favor of small businesses and challenged the responsiveness and responsibility determinations of selected awardees. Two appeals were filed with the Maryland State Board of Contract Appeals (MSBCA). The first appeal was dismissed on February 25, 2025, upon MSBCA's grant of the State's motion for summary decision.

**Requesting Agency Remarks:** The statewide finance and data system capable of supporting fiscal and student information, establishing a method for verifying certain synthesized or compiled school-level and school system data; requiring certain funds to be distributed to certain workforce development boards. The procurement timeline was extended due to ongoing contract negotiations that required additional time to finalize terms and ensure compliance with all regulatory requirements.

The procurement timeline was extended due to the critical need to maintain continuity in the Financial Compliance Reporting system during its first year of live data implementation. This system, mandated by the Blueprint for Maryland's Future legislation, requires all 24 Local Education Agencies to submit baseline compliance data beginning in July 2024. Given the significance of this foundational compliance period, ongoing system issues needed to be resolved to ensure successful data collection. Introducing a new procurement process at this stage could have disrupted operations and jeopardized the accuracy and timeliness of the required reporting.

*Agency Remarks*: This is a sole source and there are no opportunities for subcontracting. The Maryland Coordination and Analysis Center's (MCAC) Criminal Intelligence Section (CEI) monitors open sources and social media sites. MCAC uses this technology to rapidly discover and decipher the multilingual insights they need to complete their missions. MCAC currently depends on direct monitoring and collection, which involves individual employees manually operating on social media sites within the Open-Source Section. This approach significantly restricts MCAC's ability to filter threats, which is crucial to their mission, especially during periods of increased threat awareness, such as elections and other major events in Maryland.

As organizations, social media companies are sophisticated entities that routinely block or minimize the use of application programming interface, commonly called an API, which is the primary method of sharing mass data. MCAC avoided social media research tools whose access to social media API appeared to be unauthorized or in violation of social media platform user agreements. All APIs accessed by Babel Street<sup>®</sup>, Inc. are authorized by social media sites.

#### Agency Remarks (cont'd):

All social media research tools based outside of the United States were considered ineligible because of regulatory and security concerns. Some social media research tools were developed to capture and store user experience searches in order to provide customizable search results, essentially storing law enforcement sensitive data for third-party use; these were also deemed ineligible. Still others used "sentiment" derived from artificial intelligence-based searches. The use of artificial intelligence-based searches by a vendor would conflict with current Department of Justice policy and would bias search results.

Babel Street®, Inc. is the sole vendor that can provide a tool capable of keyword searching of all social media (Facebook, Instagram, Telegram), which is an essential capability required by MCAC. Keyword searching and profile-specific searching were primary requirements when evaluating social media research tools. Babel's platform was the only tool that could search a user name, "John Doe", and a specific keyword, "bomb", simultaneously.

The contract pricing was found to be fair and reasonable under BPW Advisory 2016-1 (4) which states, "Market Price. Proposed price is comparable to verifiable market price.". This fair and reasonable pricing can be confirmed from the comparison quote provided by Babel Street®, Inc. The Maryland Department of State Police is receiving a 57% discount.

MBE and VSBE participation was not established for this contract because there are no subcontracting opportunities.
