Remarks: The Carter Grant Wilson Administration Building is located at the gateway to the campus on Hillen Road and Cold Spring Lane. The building is also located on the corner of the historic Quad of Morgan's campus which has received the designation of National Treasure in 2017. Carter Grant Wilson was constructed in 1963 and has 26,079 gsf. When renovated this building will support the continued advancement of the programs and services for The School of Graduate Studies and the International Affairs Division.

The University is currently requesting design funding for the Architect. We anticipate utilizing the remaining approved design/construction funding to award the Construction Manager Pre-Construction services contract and to award the Commissioning Agent design services. The University is currently requesting approval of the full contract amount of \$4,477,000 for the Architect and a cash expenditure of \$3,506,930.77 for A/E design. The University anticipates utilizing the remaining design funding to award Pre-Construction Services for the Construction Manager at Risk and the Commissioning Agent's Design Services, and will authorize the expenditure of the additional A/E contract for construction when the funding is provided.

The building has been vacated since 2021 due to plumbing, mechanical and other infrastructure failures. A renovation will be provided to completely replace aging infrastructure and create spaces for Morgan's growing graduate student programs and growing international student enrollment.

The solicitation was advertised on e*MarylandMarketPlace*, 15 firms responded. The Qualification Review Committee evaluated the technical proposals and six firms were shortlisted to advance to the oral presentation phase. The University then entered into fee negotiations with the highest-ranked firm. The University recommends GWWO Architects, Inc. for award.

Based upon subcontracting opportunities for these services, an MBE participation goal of 40.00% was established for this contract. GWWO has committed to achieving the MBE goal.

This procurement was conducted pursuant to the provisions of Morgan State University Policies and Procedures Manual. The Morgan State University Office of Design & Construction Management will manage the work with procurement support from the University's Procurement Office.

Starting on March 7th, 2025, Gilbane advertised the project for trade contractor participation in the following publications/services: eMaryland Marketplace Advantage, Maryland Stadium Authority website, Maryland Washington Minorities Companies Association, and via direct solicitation. An MBE outreach event was previously conducted by Gilbane / Warren Builds and a pre-bid site walkthrough was held at Oriole Park. Attendees were provided with summary projectinformation.

Gilbane / Warren Builds advertised for bids on construction packages for demolition, structural steel, HVAC equipment, electrical equipment, LED video boards / ribbon boards, and AV integrator. Competitive bids were received on March 28th, 2025 by representatives from Gilbane / Warren Builds.

Post-bid scope review meetings with selected trade contractors began on April 1st, 2025 to ensure that the bids were both responsive and complete. Post bid scope review meetings were conducted virtually, and Gilbane / Warren Builds and MSA representatives were in attendance.

The University has determined that it is in the best interest of the project to continue with the same firm for schedule efficiency and due to their familiarity with the project needs. Because the original contract has expired, the University recommends award to Hord Coplan Macht as a sole source. This award is based on the unique qualifications and expertise of the vendor. Hord Coplan Macht has a proven track record and specialized experience in similar projects.

The firm has extensive knowledge of the university requirements, making them uniquely capable of meeting the specific needs of this project. Engaging a different firm at this stage would cause significant disruption, potentially delaying the project and increasing costs due to the need for a new firm to familiarize themselves with the project's specific requirements and existing progress. The University's Executive Group, which includes a public member, approved the negotiated fee and price analysis. The contract award is for all phases of design.

The Towson Center, built in 1977, currently includes multipurpose spaces and an athletic training facility that serves various teams. This project will expand and modernize the 4,000 square foot athletic training facility to 7,200 square feet, addressing the current limitations in space and equipment. Key improvements include upgraded treatment areas, expanded hydrotherapy capabilities, and increased functional space for both athletic trainers and student-athletes. These changes will enhance the quality of care, increase rehabilitation capacity, and better support the overall wellness of student-athletes.

The Fieldhouse, built in 2003, supports a variety of Athletic Department functions. This work will address the Athletics Academic Achievement Center (AAAC), and Athletic Sports Medicine Facilities located within. Expansion will address the space needs of the AAAC, resolve existing office shortages, use operable partitions allowing flexible use as study halls or a large event space as needed, and replace lost classroom and storage areas from the Fieldhouse renovation. Football, lacrosse, field hockey, track and field, and cross-country student-athletes utilize the Athletic Sports Medicine Facility daily. The renovation will address updating high-demand hydrotherapy equipment and enhance the physician exam room, chiropractic and massage rooms, conference room, and staff offices. By expanding the upper floors on the existing footprint, no additional site work or impervious surfaces will be required.

The goal established for this project was 20%. The MBE commitment exceeded the goal by 4.88% for a total of 24.88%.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Maryland Port Administration (MPA) requests approval to extend the contract term and to increase the contract authority amount for the third and final phase of the construction of the Cox Creek Expanded DMCF, an MPA-funded and sponsored constructed in incremental phases and is advancing as planned. Phase III represents the final phase of construction. The MPA uses the Maryland Environmental Service's (MES) statutory authority and substantial experience in managing operations and construction at the Hart-Miller Island DMCF, Cox Creek DMCF, Poplar Island Environmental Restoration Project, and the Masonville DMCF.

Modification No. 3 will enable the implementation of the Cox Creek Expanded DMCF construction elements scheduled for the Phase III completion which includes dike raising to +80 feet above MLLW (mean lower low water level) of the original DMCF and of the lateral expansion upland cell of the DMCF. Phase II of the project included demolition of existing structures and remediation of the property upland of the existing DMCF, construction of a base dike, and dike raising to +60 feet for the existing and DMCF as well as lateral expansion upland of the DMCF. There are sufficient funds in the current contract to complete the Phase II tasks. Phase III tasks will include engineering support services including design review and preparation, survey and GIS support, preparation of bid documents, geotechnical support, coastal engineering and DMCF design, permitting, site development and operations planning services, CAD services and raising the dikes to the ultimate elevation of +80 feet above MLLW. Work is anticipated to commence in FY 2026 using Modification No.3 funding.

Construction of the mitigation and enhancement elements of the Cox Creek Expanded DMCF project includes mitigation for impacts to non-tidal wetlands and impacts to the Critical Area as a result of DMCF construction necessary per regulatory requirements. Community enhancements include: the design and construction of a walking trail at the Cox Creek site. Remediation of petroleum, metals, and PCB-impacted soils in the upland has been substantially completed.

The dredged material placement option responds to mandates of the Dredged Material Management Act of 2001. The Cox Creek DMCF provides essential placement capacity for Baltimore Harbor channels, berths, and anchorages, especially after the Hart-Miller Island DMCF closed for placement of dredged material at the end of 2009.

The MPA-owned Cox Creek property includes a 133-acre operational DMCF, a 115-acre upland DMCF cell and 126 acres of preserved land which includes 11 acres of tidal wetlands created by MPA. The Cox Creek DMCF has been operational since 2005 with containment dikes at 36 feet in elevation. The estimated annual placement capacity is 0.5 - 1.0 million cubic yards.

Additional dredged material placement capacity is needed because navigation channels in the Baltimore Harbor and around the Chesapeake Bay must be routinely cleaned of accumulated sediments that come from the Susquehanna River basin, the Patapsco River, shore erosion and resuspension by tidal circulation. Keeping the Port of Baltimore's 50-foot deep channel navigable is critical for the larger vessels entering the Port from international destinations via the Suez Canal

and the increase in larger ships carrying more cargo from expanded Panama Canal. Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works determine that extraordinary circumstances exist so that the State Highway Administration may fund a growth-related project near Grantsville, Garrett County, not in a Priority Funding Area (PFA).

Project: The Maryland portion of the proposed improvements associated with the US 219: Old Salisbury Road, Maryland to Meyersdale, Pennsylvania Study. Approximately 1.4 miles of the proposed 1.8-mile road realignment in Maryland are outside of any Priority Funding Area.

Authority: Article–State Finance and Procurement, 5-7B-05 (a)(1)(i); and 5-7B-05 (a)(2)(i)(ii)

§<u>5–7B–05 (a):</u>

(1) The State may provide funding for a growth-related project not in a priority funding area if:

(i) the Board of Public Works determines that extraordinary circumstances exist in accordance with the requirements of paragraph (2) of this subsection;

(2) In order to determine that extraordinary circumstances exist under paragraph (1) of this subsection, the Board shall determine by a majority vote that:

(i) the failure to fund the project in question creates an extreme inequity, hardship, or disadvantage that clearly outweighs the benefits from locating a project in a priority funding area; and

(ii) there is no reasonable alternative for the project in a priority funding area in another location within the county or an adjacent county.

Extraordinary Circumstances:

(1) Failure to Fund the Project Creates an Extreme Inequity, Hardship, or Disadvantage that Clearly Outweighs the Benefits from Locating the Project in PFAs

Because the project would complete the final segment of Corridor N of the Appalachian Development Highway System (ADHS) to improve the roadway linkage in the Appalachian Region and provide a safe and efficient new four-lane roadway to support economic opportunities in the Region, failing to fund the project would leave a gap in Corridor N of the ADHS and lose the opportunity to facilitate economic development in the Appalachian Region including Garrett County and other Appalachian areas in Maryland. Additionally, failure to fund the project would create intrastate and State and federal funding agreement conflicts. The current inter-state agreement states that engineering is funded 85% by PennDOT and 15% by SHA.

Extraordinary Circumstances (cont'd):

(2) There is no Reasonable Alternative for the Project in PFAs in Another Location Within the County or an Adjacent County

It is not reasonable for the proposed highway connection to be within a PFA in adjacent Allegany County, Maryland because no such highway is currently planned in any designated PFA that borders Pennsylvania. Somerset County, Pennsylvania has planned to extend Corridor N from the designated growth area of Meyersdale, Pennsylvania to connect to US 219 near the Grantsville PFA, and ultimately to I-68 in Garrett County. Neither Somerset County, Pennsylvania or Bedford County, Pennsylvania have plans to extend Corridor N to connect to Allegany County. As such, appropriate supporting infrastructure for such a connection is also not planned. Additionally, the purpose and need of completing a connection of Corridor N (ADHS) would not be met and safe and efficient access for US 219 motorists would not be provided if the project were to be in an Allegany County PFA.

Estimated Project Cost:

This proposed major capital project is funded by both PennDOT and the Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT). The current MDOT FY 2025 - FY 2030 CTP shows:

- Preliminary Engineering is fully funded at \$10 M
- Right of way acquisition is fully funded at \$5.5 M
- Construction for Maryland portion is currently not funded
- > The current construction estimate for Maryland portion is approximately \$62.4 M

Maryland plans to fund most of the construction amount by utilizing federal ADHS funds. The total construction cost for the project is approximately \$332 M. Pennsylvania's construction estimate is approximately \$270 M. Maryland's total estimated project cost is approximately \$78 M.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Board of Public Works on November 18, 2015 approved a Settlement Agreement (Agreement), under which the parties agreed that the Department's compliance with the Agreement's substantive provisions would be assessed by three mutually agreed-upon "Monitors", whose responsibilities include, but are not limited to, inspections of Baltimore Central Booking and Intake Center (BCBIC) to monitor the implementation of the agreement and reviewing evidence relating to compliance. Each monitor manages a specific provision of the Agreement, with one for the medical provisions (Medical Monitor), one for the mental health provisions, and one for the physical plant provisions.

According to the Agreement, the parties must agree to the appointment of a Medical Health Monitor (Monitor). In the event any of the Monitors ceases to function as a Monitor before the termination of the Agreement, then the parties shall confer in an attempt to agree upon a successor Monitor. However, if the Court finds none of the proposed candidates qualified, then the Court shall make whatever further orders it deems necessary to identify an appropriate successor Monitor. As a result, a competitive source selection method cannot be used as there is only one available source for the contract.

In December 2023, the Department became aware that Dr. Michael Puisis, DO was no longer able or willing to perform his assigned duties as Medical Monitor. Beginning in March 2024, the parties began considering Medical Monitors for selection. An in-person hearing was scheduled for December 20, 2024, for Plaintiffs and Defendants to provide a memorandum containing the names and summary of qualifications for one or more candidates to serve as the Medical Monitor. On December 23, 2024, the Court appointed Dr. Muthusamy Anandkumar, M.D., M.B.A., CHCQM, CCHP through Mangai, LLC, as Medical Monitor.

The price has been determined to be fair and reasonable based on historical pricing. The previous Sole Source contract with Dr. Michael Puisis, D.O. was for a term of 48 months with a cost of \$179,386.95. This represents a 2.5% price increase which is consistent with the 3% Consumer Price Index (CPI) rate of inflation for medical services.

The Contract will provide a license to MLGCA to use the Baltimore Ravens marks and logos in its instant lottery games, advertising, and marketing. The contract also purchases Baltimore Ravens ticket packages and experiential prizes to be utilized as part of instant ticket promotion, including approximately six different second chance drawings associated with two scratch-off ticket games and one Fast Play game. These prizes include Baltimore Ravens season tickets for 20 years, Baltimore Ravens 2025 and 2026 season tickets, pre-game access to the sidelines, opportunities to participate in an on-field activity during 2025 home games and a trip with the team to attend a 2025 Baltimore Ravens regular season NFL away game.

The MLGCA anticipates producing one scratch-off ticket game using the Baltimore Ravens' NFL marks and logos that will have a quantity of 3,120,000 tickets, a \$2.00 price point and a total retail face value of \$6,240,000 and a second game that will have a quantity of 3,120,000, a \$10.00 price point and a total retail face value of \$31,200,000. These games need to be submitted for production by early-June 2025 in order to have the tickets produced and available for distribution mid-summer 2025. This contract also allows the MLGCA to produce a terminal based instant ticket game known as Fast Play with the Baltimore Ravens's marks and logos.

The 2025 NFL season will be the seventeenth consecutive year that the MLGCA has produced instant ticket games using the Baltimore Ravens' logos and marks. In many of these previous years, the Baltimore Ravens instant ticket games have been among the more popular and highest performing at their price point category. The second chance prizes are also quite popular, as unique player entries into these contests are some of the highest seen.

By law, instant game players have 182 days after a game is closed-out to claim winning tickets. As such, the MLGCA must allow for that period to elapse before the Contract expires but during which time no additional tickets are produced or sold. This Contract provides the MLGCA with the ability to produce the specified instant ticket games, procure associated experiential prizes, and use the Baltimore Ravens' logos and marks in 2025 and 2026.

The MLGCA reviewed the overall prices and terms of other similar promotions that it has done which involved the licensing of proprietary properties and tickets or other exclusive prizes (e.g., Ravens, Powerball Power Cruise, Willie Wonka, Monopoly, Price is Right, MGM, Royal Caribbean). The amount of this license contract compares favorably with those similar projects and was determined to be fair and reasonable.

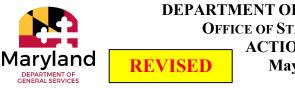

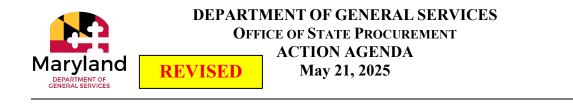

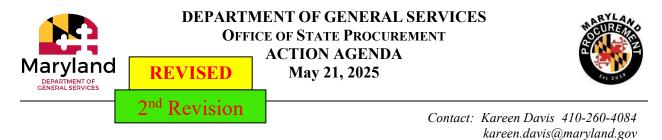

Requesting Agency Remarks: The original agenda item approved on 12/18/2024 inadvertently listed the awardee's one-year price instead of the Statewide Contract's Not-to-Exceed (NTE) amount. Additionally, while the RFP noted the contract would be available for statewide use, the scope and pricing documents did not adequately reflect projected demand. As a result, the procurement will be re-solicited to include historical usage and clarity around scope and pricing. In the interim, the NTE amount of \$1.5 million is necessary to maintain continuity of services while DGS conducts the new procurement.

The award amount differs from the evaluated price because the evaluated price is based on a model in the RFP solely for evaluation purposes. The call center contract financial page included perminute and per-unit costs multiplied by an estimated number of calls. The award amount represents an estimate of the amount to be paid to the contractor, which may vary depending on the actual usage of the contract by State agencies. However, the per-minute and per-unit prices remain fixed for the duration of the contract.

Call center services are established by work orders based on the individual needs of each agency. The Contractor provides various agencies with general program support and fulfillment services related to the Call/Contact Center. Services include distributing information packets to individuals who have contacted the Call Center. These call center services allow agencies to enhance customer service to citizens through a toll-free number and, in some cases, by sending emails to a general email account. Under the call center arrangement, citizens reach an answering point located in Maryland that is staffed between 8:00 AM and 8:00 PM Monday through Friday, except for State holidays. In addition, citizens are provided some information 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. This contract is used by several agencies, including DBM, DHCD, MDH, MDOT, SBE, SRA, and the Governor's Office, and each agency maintains its toll-free call center number independently. MBE compliance is not yet available as this contract was approved on 12/18/2024 with the incorrect contract value. Therefore, no work has been approved.

This new engagement with KPMG represents a pivotal transition toward stabilizing and enhancing eMMA to fully support a modern, end-to-end Source-to-Pay procurement model.

KPMG brings extensive and proven experience as a system integrator for Ivalua, having successfully implemented the platform in eight other states. They will deploy highly qualified resources to support the State's ongoing procurement reform initiatives, in alignment with both the State's regulatory requirements and the Governor's Executive Order issued in December 2024.

Under this contract, KPMG will:

- Stabilize and upgrade the State's version of Ivalua, currently more than 20 versions behind and at end-of-life;
- Remediate long-standing system defects and data inconsistencies;
- Develop and implement enhancements to support statewide procurement operations, including AI-enabled features;
- Create new dashboards and reporting tools to support the Governor's Executive Order and improve transparency and adoption of eProcurement;
- Deliver enhanced reporting to support recovery of the State's 1% procurement fee and GOSBA's oversight goals;
- Facilitate operational stabilization and prepare the eMMA system for integration with the Office of State Financial Integration (OSFI) project;
- Support organizational change management and business transformation to promote vendor participation, procurement standardization, and increased competition.

The contract is being awarded through an Intergovernmental Cooperative Purchasing Agreement (ICPA) under the NASPO ValuePoint Master Agreement, which was competitively procured by the lead State of Maine in 2022 in accordance with applicable Maryland statutes. That national procurement effort received 35 proposals, and 15 awards were made across four categories based on responsiveness and final rankings against pre-established evaluation criteria. This cooperative purchasing method provides access to best-in-class vendors while leveraging the volume and competition of a nationally conducted procurement.

As a result of this process, the State has negotiated highly favorable pricing with KPMG, receiving a 59.6% discount off their published list pricing for annual licensing and maintenance. This significant cost benefit underscores the value of the cooperative procurement approach. Additionally, the total contract cost remains within the originally planned budget for the eMMA project.

KPMG has also committed to meeting the State's Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) participation goal of 29% and the Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprise (VSBE) goal of 3.47%, reinforcing the State's commitment to inclusive economic growth.

Approval of this contract will allow the State to move forward with a stable, modern eProcurement platform that fully supports Maryland's procurement goals, regulatory obligations, and strategic vision for digital government.
