Mitigation: Constructing a replacement pile-supported wharf will result in permanent impacts to 3,343 square feet of open water. The project proposes to remove 3,279 existing piles which total 2,585 square feet. MDE will consider the removal of existing piles as mitigation for the new piles which results in a net increase of 758 square feet of impact to open water.

3,343 sf of new impact - 2,585 sf of credit (from existing pile removal) = 758 sf total impact

The Department recommends that the licensee mitigate for 758 square feet of impacts to open water (COMAR 23.02.04.11.B) by paying \$1,569.06 into the MDE Tidal Wetlands Compensation Fund.

758 square feet x \$2.07 per square foot* = \$1,569.06

Project Description: 211 W. 28th Street, LLC, sponsored by Seawall Development, LLC in partnership with MBE/WBE firm Charm City Buyers, will redevelop an underutilized property in the heart of the Remington neighborhood in Baltimore City into a high-impact, mixed-use development with integrated community space. The \$18.5 million project will replace the current structure, formerly occupied by a 7-Eleven, with a newly constructed six-story building containing 60 modern workforce rental apartments, approximately 6,185 square feet of flexible ground-floor commercial space, and a 13,000-square-foot public park and plaza.

The residential units will offer premium finishes and energy-efficient features, including Energy Star appliances, low-flow fixtures, mini-split HVAC systems, LED lighting throughout, and all-electric mechanical systems to reduce carbon emissions. The commercial space is anticipated to be divided into two or three storefronts. This will target locally owned businesses such as a café with indoor/outdoor seating and other neighborhood-serving retail, with a focus on creating community-oriented gathering places rather than national chains.

Project Description (cont'd):

The development will be financed with \$8.75 million in primary funding from Shore United Bank and a proposed \$5 million subordinate NBW-Classic loan, disbursed on a pro rata basis during construction. Shore United Bank has approved financing without requiring pre-leased commercial space, allowing the developer to curate tenants aligned with the neighborhood's character. The project is scheduled to close in late 2025, with demolition beginning January 2026, vertical construction commencing shortly thereafter, and completion anticipated in April 2027.

Upon completion, the project will generate substantial economic and social benefits, including the creation of approximately 100 construction jobs, 20 new full-time positions, and retention of 5 existing jobs. The new residents and retail activity will increase local spending, expand Baltimore City's tax base, and connect seamlessly with other Seawall-led revitalization projects such as Remington Row, R. House, and The Service Center. This transformative investment will strengthen Remington's identity as a thriving, inclusive neighborhood and provide long-term workforce housing and community assets.

Remarks: The State Treasurer's Office (STO) issued an Invitation for Bids (IFB) for financing on a consolidated basis of up to \$16.0 million in capital equipment, that was published on *eMaryland Marketplace Advantage*, posted on STO's website, and emailed to firms known to be active in financing municipal equipment lease-purchase financing agreements. There are no subcontracting opportunities with this financing; however, MBEs were encouraged to respond.

Three bids were received on or before the due date of August 28, 2025 in response to the IFB. One bid did not meet the requirements of the IFB and was therefore rejected as non-responsive. The two responsive bids were evaluated and weighted based on the addition of a spread provided by the bidder to the percentage of an indexed rate with three and five-year terms (based on the amounts expected to be financed for such terms). For purposes of evaluating the bids, 3-month SOFR swap rates from August 7, 2025 were used as the indexed rate. As added context, the non-responsive bid used an indexed rate apart from the 3-month SOFR swap rate identified in the IFB, and hence was not evaluated.

Upon the Board's approval of this agreement, STO will continue to utilize a Master Equipment Lease-Purchase model for financing capital equipment for State agencies. Equipment approved for lease-purchase financing during the term of the contract will be funded under this agreement, eliminating the need for STO to issue individual IFBs and to obtain approval from the Board of Public Works for each takedown. The interest rate for each takedown will be determined at the time of the takedown by adding the spread bid under this solicitation to the applicable percentage of the Index, in each case for the applicable lease amortization term and as set forth in the Master Equipment Lease-Purchase Agreement. The continuation of a master lease model will significantly reduce the staff time spent on the program and allow State agencies to obtain funding for capital equipment more quickly. Additionally, the cost of capital for the Master Equipment Lease-Purchase Agreement is expected to be substantially lower than issuing individual IFBs for each takedown.

There is no guarantee of work given to the lessor and there is no penalty to the State for non-use.

In accordance with Section 8-403 of the State Finance and Procurement Article, this financing request and supporting information was submitted to the Legislative Policy Committee for review and was approved for presentation to the Board of Public Works for its approval in a letter dated June 13, 2025.

Starting on July 1st, 2025, Gilbane advertised the project for trade contractor participation in the following publications/services: eMaryland Marketplace Advantage, Maryland Stadium Authority website, Maryland Washington Minorities Companies Association, and via direct solicitation. An MBE outreach event was previously conducted by Gilbane / Warren Builds and a pre-bid site walkthrough was held at Oriole Park. Attendees were provided with summary projectinformation.

Gilbane / Warren Builds advertised for bids on construction packages for Scaffold/Hoist, Final Cleaning, Demolition, Rough Carpentry, Roofing, Fireproofing, Plaster, Paint, and Carpeting / LVT. Competitive bids were received on varying dates between July 25th, 2025 and July 31st, 2025 by representatives from Gilbane / Warren Builds.

Post-bid scope review meetings with selected trade contractors began on July 30th, 2025 to ensure that the bids were both responsive and complete. Post bid scope review meetings were conducted virtually, and Gilbane / Warren Builds and MSA representatives were in attendance.

Gilbane / Warren Builds submitted GMP #4 Package on August 20th, 2025.

Future GMP Package(s) will be presented to the Board of Public Works for approval.

The overall MBE participation goal for the construction phase of this project was set at 32% with sub-goals of 8% African American-owned and 11% Women-owned. The MBE goal for this project is a total goal inclusive of all GMPs. There are no GMP specific goals. This is the fourth of several anticipated GMPs.

The Authority represented that it would return with a recommendation to enter into a Guaranteed Maximum Price contract for construction services if the performance of the preconstruction services is satisfactory and an acceptable price is negotiated.

The procurement process for this GMP occurred as follows:

On July 1, 2025 Clark advertised bid packages for site demolition, dewatering, concrete (tunnel and retaining walls), waterproofing (tunnel), earthwork, site concrete, asphalt, wet utilities, and dry utilities in the following publications/services: eMaryland Marketplace Advantage, MSA's website, Clark's website, Maryland Washington Minority Companies Association (MWMCA) website and via direct solicitation.

On July 15, 2025 Clark hosted a virtual Trade Contractor Outreach Event at Pimlico. The event was open to the public and allowed trade contractors interested in the packages being procured under GMP#3, as well as future GMP packages, to obtain information specific to the project's scope and schedule and to participate in a site walk of the Pimlico Racing Facility.

On August 8, 2025 competitive sealed trade contractor bids were received and opened using Clark's online bidding system (BuildingConnected) for the following packages: earthwork, site demolition, site concrete, asphalt, wet utilities, and dry utilities. MSA was present for the opening of bids. Post-bid scope review meetings were conducted with MSA present to ensure the bids were both responsive and complete. The earthwork, site demolition, site concrete, and asphalt scopes will be included in a forthcoming GMP.

Clark has demonstrated good faith effort to satisfy the MBE overall goal of 35% as well as the subgoals of 8% African American and 11% Women Owned business established for the Project.

Requesting Agency Remarks: This contract was awarded with two, three-year renewal options. Considering the contractor's excellent performance under the contract to date, the Maryland Port Administration (MPA) Property Management Office has requested that the second renewal option be exercised. Since taking over the contract, the contractor has significantly improved building and operations services at the WTC by delivering quality work in accordance with all technical aspects of the contract, identifying and solving problems effectively, expeditiously recruiting and maintaining qualified and reliable personnel, consistently addressing the tenants' needs in a cooperative and professional manner, and making good faith efforts to achieve Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) participation.

MPA is planning two major tenant expansions that will bring the WTC occupancy rate up from 80% to 100%. One tenant expansion is for the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA). For years MTA has been headquartered at 6 St. Paul Street, Baltimore, but the Maryland Department of General Services recently announced that tenants will be removed from 6 St. Paul, and the building will be sold. MTA currently occupies 7,042 rentable square feet in the WTC for 70 MTA employees. Under the proposed WTC tenant expansion, the remainder of MTA's offices at 6 St. Paul will be moved to the WTC, increasing MTA's occupancy in the WTC to 98,000 rentable square feet for 470 MTA employees. The other component of the WTC tenant expansion is for Mediterranean Shipping Company, which will increase its occupied space from 7,042 rentable square feet for 45 employees to 22,000 rentable square feet for 90 employees. When completed, the two tenant expansions will increase annual revenues to MPA by almost \$2.4 million per year.

To fulfill these plans, MPA needs to design, renovate and consolidate spaces in the WTC. The design work is provided by architects and engineers under contract to MPA. The WTC Building Operations and Management contractor will bid out the renovation work and present the results of that effort to the MPA's WTC Property Manager. Upon MPA agreement, the contractor will proceed to enter into subcontracts for completion of the work. The work must begin as soon as possible in order to meet the tenants' needs and is expected to take four to five years to complete.

The contract currently expires October 31, 2027, under the first renewal option, approved by the Board of Public Works on June 7, 2023. Unless the second renewal option is exercised, extending the contract for the final three-year renewal period through October 31, 2030, the contract will end well before the tenant expansions are complete. It would be highly disruptive to MPA, MTA, Mediterranean Shipping Company, and other tenants of the WTC if MPA is required to bring in a new building operations and management contractor in the middle of the tenant expansion, making it highly desirable that MPA retain the current contractor through the final renewal period.

The contract provides for an annual price increase during each year of the three-year renewal period, calculated as follows:

When available after June 1 of the last year of the original term of the contract (if the first renewal option is exercised by Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) MPA) and after June 1 of each year thereafter, MDOT MPA will ascertain the 12-month % change in the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics Consumer Price Index – All Urban Consumers (CPI-U), Not Seasonally Adjusted, Baltimore-Columbia-Towson, MD, All Items, through April of that year, and prices chargeable under the contract by the contractor may be increased by that 12-Month % Change or 3%, whichever is less, for the 12-month period beginning July 1 of that year through June 30 of the following year.

In June of 2027, MDOT MPA will determine the actual percentage increase under this provision and those contract prices that are subject to increase under the contract will be adjusted accordingly, provided that the not-to-exceed value of the contract will remain as provided under this Modification. The three-year option value of \$18,988,342 includes an allowance of \$6.3 million for other special projects and repairs.

The estimated cost of the tenant expansion is \$23.8 million. The exact cost will not be known until the tenants' plans are finalized, design of the necessary renovations is completed, and the renovations are bid out by the contractor and reviewed and approved by MPA. MPA requests an increase of \$23.8 million to the contract's not-to-exceed allowance for capital improvements and tenant renovations for the period October 2, 2025, through the end of the second renewal period, October 31, 2030.

Due to the complexity and size of the major tenant expansion, MPA requires that the contractor provide a construction manager to oversee the work. In order to begin that work as soon as possible, MPA issued Modification No. 15 to provide the construction manager for the period April 2, 2025, through September 30, 2025, for NTE \$50,000. MPA requests Board approval to add \$515,457 to the NTE contract value for the contractor to provide the construction manager from October 1, 2025, through October 31, 2030.

Improvements in security at the WTC required MPA to add one security guard in the lobby of the WTC starting February 1, 2025. MPA issued Modification No. 14 to provide this additional guard through November 30, 2025, for NTE \$46,868. MPA requests Board approval to add \$318,922 to the NTE contract value for the contractor to provide that additional guard from December 1, 2025, through the end of the second renewal period, October 31, 2030.

As of April 22, 2025, the contractor's verified, overall MBE achievement stands at 32.26%, slightly under the 36% goal. The primary cause of the shortage was the drastic reduction in services at the WTC during the COVID-19 pandemic. Since the WTC reopened and normal operations resumed, the contractor has worked diligently to increase its MBE participation to meet the 36% contract goal. That effort has successfully increased the MBE participation: the contractor has added 21 additional certified MBEs (above the original six).

To continue that improvement, MPA and the contractor have agreed that, as the contractor bids out the work to be performed under the \$23.8 million tenant expansion, the contractor will first seek proposals from and first seek to award subcontracts to only certified MBEs. Proposals will be requested from and contracts awarded to non-MBEs only when no certified MBEs submit acceptable proposals. MPA will ensure that this plan is carried out as promised.

During the tenant expansion, MPA will incorporate energy efficiency and sustainable practices whenever feasible. For example, any overhead lights installed will be LED lights to replace fluorescent fixtures; new restrooms will be installed with low-flow toilets, low-flow aerators on faucets; and new offices will have lights with automatic on/off sensors.

The Maryland Port Commission is expected to approve this action on September 9, 2025.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The thermal radar camera system has failed to perform as originally advertised and does not meet the necessary security standards required for monitoring fence approaches, this system was fully credited back to the State, and the revised system, as identified in PR-12R1, will replace the newly designed failed thermal cameras. The current perimeter microwave and shake systems are at the end of their life cycle and are inadequate to provide the level of surveillance and threat detection essential for maintaining facility security and will now be replaced in lieu of the designed camera system. To ensure the proper approach alarm functionality that aligns with the newly implemented electronic upgrades within the facility, it is imperative to upgrade the existing microwave system. This enhancement will ensure seamless integration with the latest security equipment, providing a more reliable and effective solution for perimeter protection.

A change is necessary due to significant scale removal observed inside the walls of the existing 38-year-old Domestic Hot Water Generators tanks, which could compromise their structural integrity. Given their age, which is at the end of their life expectancy, all parties agree that the removal and replacement should occur while the contractor is already working in this space, avoiding a far more costly replacement in the future.

The perimeter road was already in a deteriorated state prior to the commencement of construction, as they were not originally designed to accommodate heavy construction vehicles. The continuous movement of such vehicles during construction has caused additional damage. To prevent the need for costly full rehabilitation in the future, it would be more practical and cost-effective to address this as part of the ongoing project

Requesting Agency Remarks: A public notice for a Request for Expressions of Interest (REOI) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) and on the DHS website on June 4, 2025. Thirty-three (33) potential Providers were directly solicited, of which only one was a Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) certified company.

Thirty-two (32) Offerors submitted a response to the REOI, and only one Offeror was deemed not responsible. This Offeror did not obtain a rate letter from the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) Inter-Agency Rates Committee (IRC) and therefore did not receive a Contract.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Background - Implementing Rate Reform

Thanks to the support of the Governor and the General Assembly, rate reform for services provided to youth in out-of-home placements by Residential Child Care providers went into effect on October 1, 2024. Our \$27 million dollar investment created a class-based rate structure that is improving providers' ability to meet the needs of Maryland youth and families. This investment has been continued by the Governor and the General Assembly in state fiscal year 2026, and we are grateful to move urgently on the next stage of rebuilding Maryland's child welfare provider network.

Our new way of compensating out-of-home care providers is already improving the breadth of services; these will be described in further detail below. A wider range of in-state services reduces out-of-state placements, hospital admissions, hospital overstays, and hotel stays. With the new rates came clear expectations aligned with the Moore-Miller Administration Values, rooted in being responsive, moving urgently, data-driven and heart-led, and challenging the status quo. Our provider partners are held accountable for timely response to our referrals, accepting Maryland youth to prevent out-of-state placements, and innovative and evidence-based services Maryland youth need. We continue to proactively engage with all of our providers, including regular meetings, and discussions with provider and agency leadership, including as recently as July 2025.

Background - Hospital Over-Stays and Unlicensed Stays

Advocates often testify before the General Assembly about what DHS has not done to reduce the number of youth in hospital overstays and hotels. Since January 2023, we've taken major steps forward to limit the number of youth who experience a hotel or hospital overstay. We are building on and continuing our work in 2025.

We have lowered the number of youth experiencing hospital overstays by increasing communication and closing systemic gaps in our system. A hospital overstay is currently defined under DHS policy and state health regulation as 48 hours or more beyond medical necessity. House Bill 962 (2025) will codify this definition into law on October 1, 2025. As of August 8, 2025, there are 9 DHS youth in hospital overstay status and 10 DHS youth in hotels. For comparison, in February 2024, there were 21 youth experiencing a hospital overstay (2/19/2024) and 54 youth living in hotels (2/16/2024). These numbers were considerably higher prior to January 2023 when there was no consistent tracking of youth statewide.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

No child should stay in the hospital longer than medically necessary. We continue our work to eliminate hospital overstays. We lowered the number of youth experiencing hospital overstays and reduced the need for hotel stays by increasing the continuum of services available using our new incentivized compensation rate structure enabled by rate reform.

We initiated a new protocol of weekly staff meetings between SSA and the local departments of social services to review individual cases, address placement and treatment needs, and identify potential placements before discharge.

We hired a hospital liaison whose sole purpose is coordinating efforts and communicating with all of the hospitals serving our youth. There are weekly staffings between the DHS case team and the hospital to ensure increased communication and to enhance responsiveness.

We implemented a new policy starting March 1, 2025 ensuring that the Social Services Administration and the Office of the Secretary are notified within twenty-four hours of a youth entering an unlicensed setting. The policy requires weekly visits by local departments with a youth in a hospital stay or hotel stay, and clearly outlines educational and wellbeing expectations. We closed systemic gaps in our continuum of care by implementing rate reform, hiring a hospital liaison, increasing communication, and intensifying oversight. We are using our new category based rate structure to incentivize our residential care providers to develop innovative programming when a youth has idiosyncratic needs not well met by our current system of care.

Background - Strengthening Family Relationships

While Maryland safely maintains a low entry rate into foster care, the data shows that once a youth is in Maryland's care they do not leave. As of February 5, 2025, of the 3,699 youth in out of home care, 45.6% (1,688) have been in care for more than two years. This is unacceptable.

We launched Family Matters Case Reviews; our deep-dive into learning why youth are in foster care in Maryland for more than two years. We will continue to prioritize kinship care and facilitate lifelong connections for youth in out-of-home care by implementing a Board of Public Works' approved technology solution that modernizes and automates family finding.

Background - Summer 2025 Request for Expression of Interest (REOI)

We released this REOI to provide Treatment Foster Care (TFC) and Independent Living Program (ILP) services earlier this summer. We sought to solicit, build relationships and capacity, and recommend for award contracts with Providers licensed by the Office of Licensing and Monitoring (OLM) to operate private ILPs that support youth ages 16 to 20, including mother-baby populations, in preparation for independent living. The REOI also included TFC services for children and youth who are medically fragile, part of mother-baby populations, or experiencing significant emotional, behavioral, medical, or psychological challenges.

Offerors were requested to provide an REOI response which included the following documentation:

- (1) A detailed program description of services;
- (2) Staffing plan;
- (3) Caseload description and number of youth to be served;
- (4) The jurisdiction or county where services are provided;
- (5) Valid license, which indicates that the program is in good standing with OLM;
- (6) Company organizational chart;
- (7) Certificate of insurance;
- (8) Child profile information (types of clients you serve);
- (9) Program questionnaire (if applicable); and
- (10) Fiscal Year (FY) 26 rate letters for each program.

Background - Setting Provider Expectations

We expect, and will hold accountable, all of our CPA Providers to the following mutual expectations:

- 1. 24 hours/7 days a week acceptance of referrals and placements.
- 2. No Reject/No Eject all referred youth who meet the criteria specified in the Provider's child profile information must be accepted.
- 3. Unplanned discharges will be rare occurrences, reserved for only the most unusual cases with a high and immediate risk to the child's safety or danger to others.

We will improve our own practices state-wide to ensure that we place youth in the least restrictive environment that will support and enable their success.

Outcome and Recommendation of Awards

This procurement was conducted as a Non-Competitive Negotiated Procurement for Human, Cultural and Educational Services to expand the current capacity of CPA Providers. Prior to the issuance of the REOI, there were 1,920 total CPA beds statewide, of which 290 were designated for ILP placements. As a result of the REOI, and upon approval of the Board of Public Works, statewide capacity will increase to 2,013 beds, with 335 beds designated for ILP placements. This represents an overall increase of 93 beds, or approximately 4.8% statewide, and an increase of 45 ILP beds, or approximately 15.5% in ILP capacity. This expansion is a critical step toward meeting the placement needs of youth in care, particularly for those requiring ILP and specialized TFC services.

Please note that this bed count and the total contract amount is a not to exceed (NTE) amount, and vendors will be paid based on the youth they serve and DHS' needs. Not one provider is guaranteed the full NTE. The NTE amounts for each Contract are also based on a seventy percent (70%) utilization rate of the number of beds allotted.

All Offerors who had a license in good standing with OLM and an FY26 rate letter for their program(s) received a Contract for CPA services. Of the thirty-one Providers receiving a Contract, two of the agencies, National Youth Advocate Program, Inc. and Transforming Youth Into Adults Corporation are new CPA Providers for the State of Maryland. No protests were filed concerning this REOI.

A three percent (3%) MBE subcontracting goal was established for this solicitation. Although most of the funding that CPA providers receive from the State are passed through to foster care parents as stipends, DHS implemented a three (3) percent MBE goal per the Governor's Executive Order concerning the State's socioeconomic goals. All of them met the goal except one provider. all Providers have agreed to meet the three percent MBE goal. DHS granted one waiver of the 3% MBE goal to one Provider since the Provider made good faith efforts to meet the MBE goal but the subcontractors that they contacted were not able to provide the services needed or were unavailable.

DHS has included a total two-year option amount of \$186,112,096, but the actual amounts for the two-year renewal option will be dependent upon the IRC rates and the state's budgetary landscape.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Office of Finance, Maryland Department of Health, (Medical Care Program), believes it is in the best interest of the state to modify the contract to cover payments made beyond the approved original contract amount. This contract provides services including automated data processing to identify liable third parties; audits; third party liability (TPL) payment recovery; identifying new third-party resources to offset Medicaid expenditures, Cost Avoidance and Data Matching; and conducting third-party recoveries based on newly identified resources.

Federal and State laws require Medicaid to pay secondary to any third-party benefits to which a Medicaid beneficiary is entitled. A state's Medicaid program is the payer of last resort, and although Medicaid beneficiaries or their authorized representatives are required as a condition of eligibility to provide information regarding the availability of third party resources, it is the role of the state's TPL program to identify potentially liable resources and to recoup from them covered costs that have been paid by the Medicaid program or, based on established criteria, from the providers of service. Timely identification of these potentially liable resources also permits the Medicaid program to avoid inappropriate payments when adjudicating claims for services and is considered a very high priority for MDH.

The fundamental aim of this contract is to recuperate payments associated with waste, fraud, and abuse. The contractual payment structure entails the vendor receiving a percentage of the recovered funds. Initially, the vendor submitted an estimated proposal of \$2,161,616. The vendor, however, has surpassed this estimate and successfully recovered more funds than originally projected.

Requesting Agency Remarks: Orijin is the only vendor offering a fully proprietary secure tablet system for correctional environments. Unlike other providers, Orijin does not rely on third-party Mobile Device Managers (MDMs) or Wireless Access Points (WAPs). Instead, they have developed a fully proprietary network tunnel that restricts access exclusively to non-porous, preapproved websites. This end-to-end proprietary solution eliminates reliance on third-party technologies that can introduce security vulnerabilities. Other vendors depend on external MDM or WAP systems, which are not fully controlled by the provider and may inadvertently allow access to inappropriate or unauthorized content. This poses a significant risk in correctional settings, particularly with youth populations.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

Orijin's approach ensures tighter control, enhanced data security, and a reduced risk of exposure to unsafe digital content. Their purpose-built system is designed with correctional facility requirements in mind and represents a higher standard of accountability and safety. Due to its proprietary nature and security-first design, Orijin is uniquely positioned to address the specific needs of this engagement. No other vendor provides an equivalent level of integrated, self-contained technology tailored to correctional use.

An investigation conducted by the Division of Workforce Development and Adult Learning - Correctional Education (CE) supports the recommendation to award the contract to Orijin based on both technological compatibility and educational service delivery. As part of this review, CE evaluated several competing vendors, with GTL and Edovo emerging as the most notable alternatives. However, both platforms utilize a supplemental, stand-alone educational model that is fully self-paced and does not align with Maryland Department of Labor's (MD Labor) instructional strategy. Unlike Orijin, GTL and Edovo do not offer live virtual learning environments, do not support custom course content tailored to CE curricula, and are incompatible with the 736 tablets currently deployed within MD Labor facilities. In contrast, Orijin's platform integrates seamlessly with existing infrastructure and instructional models, including traditional and virtual learning formats, making them uniquely capable of supporting the state's correctional education program without additional investment in new hardware or major infrastructure overhauls.

It should be noted that the specialized tablets initially installed in the correctional facilities were done by Orijin. As such, Orijin and the cellular service needed to ensure these tablets are operational, was also curated by Orijin for specific functions within these institutions. To use another vendor would mean that the previous tablets will go to waste, which will lead to a financial waste of state funds and having a completely new system developed to accommodate the needs of the inmates. What other vendors may provide will be incompatible to what is currently in place and will lead to an overhaul of the existing system and getting new tablets and cellular services. It is fiscally advantageous to have the vendor who began the process, continue it.

The price has been determined to be fair and reasonable based on comparison to the joint contract Orijin, PBC has with the Department of Labor and Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services. MD Labor currently does not have funding allocated to purchase new tablets and the \$400,000 worth of tablets currently owned would become unusable with zero resale value.

The SMART program was established to provide grants to eligible public sector agencies to conduct demonstration projects focused on advanced smart community technologies and systems in order to improve transportation efficiency and safety. The MTA received a SMART grant award for the MTA Cloud Based Signal Priority project.

The project is a prototype that will be used to develop a plan for the deployment of cloudbased Transit Signal Priority (TSP) technologies along bus route corridors within northwest Baltimore that can communicate with buses in shorter time intervals and with reduced installation and maintenance costs compared to current TSP systems, leading to a service that is overall cheaper, more efficient, and more reliable.

Overall, the Project will prototype, measure, and communicate how cloud-based TSP technology may provide the following major benefits:

- Higher frequency of communication between buses and traffic signals to maximize efficiency of green time priority to buses, improving travel time savings and on-time performance.
- Higher reliability of the overall transit system during everyday traffic and special events.
- Reduced costs for equipment installation and maintenance by utilizing AVL systems and wireless cellular modems.
- Coordination with MTA partners on how the technology could be used for additional road users (e.g., emergency vehicles).

This system was designed to be fully interoperable with standards-based third-party systems used by transit agencies, traffic agencies, police departments, fire departments, and other municipal services, creating a seamless plug-and-play environment with no vendor lock-ins. Business rules are completely customizable based on the needs of the transit agency and city. Once implemented, LYT's solution begins monitoring the base metrics used to feed the artificial intelligence machine learning algorithms. These algorithms continue to learn over time, predicting bus arrival times at intersections with greater accuracy while maintaining years of highly calibrated operations.

The LYT speed Cloud Platform will securely integrate with Baltimore City Department of Transportation's traffic ecosystem to provide the MTA buses with signal priority based on any business rules implemented without requiring the installation of additional equipment. The ninety selected intersections are along the CityLink Red, Green, Brown, and Lime bus routes in Baltimore Maryland. The period of performance will be one year from the time of full deployment, following a 30-day data-gathering period to initially train the AI machine learning algorithms.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The requirement to conduct a Risk Limiting Audit (RLA) was established during the 2025 legislative session. Initially, the State Board of Elections (SBE) did not begin the contract process, believing the total value would fall within its procurement delegation. This belief was based on information from Voting Works and the U.S. Election Assistance Commission (EAC) indicating that the Arlo software was open source and could be used free of charge, with only ancillary service costs.

When SBE attempted to obtain and deploy the software, it became clear that there are two distinct options: (1)an open-source codebased version or (2) a hosted Arlo application. Due to system limitations, SBE cannot self-host the software and therefore required the hosted version to meet the statutory audit requirements. Although the RLA software will first be used for the 2026 election cycle, it must be procured at least one year in advance to allow sufficient time to select the audit type, develop regulations and operating procedures, update election processes, and train local boards of elections. Given these requirements, immediate procurement was necessary to ensure compliance with the new law and to safeguard statewide election administration for 2026.

The selected software, Arlo, is the only commercially available solution capable of managing and conducting risk limiting audits (RLAs). It supports multiple audit types, including ballot polling, batch comparison, ballot comparison, and hybrid RLAs, for audits ranging from a single jurisdiction to statewide implementations. The cost of implementation support services covers drafting operating procedures for the State Board of Elections (SBE) and local boards of elections to implement the RLA program, assistance with drafting forms and documentation necessary to implement the program, and training for SBE and local boards of elections.

SBE confirmed the sole source determination through market research, outreach to other states, and by posting the specifications twice eMaryland Marketplace. VotingWorks is the only vendor offering a hosted and supported software package for Arlo. While the open-source version of Arlo software is available, it is not an option for SBE due to system requirements (specific OS and database versions, a Postgres database, and secure server hosting) and in-house technical limitations. Two states have attempted self-hosting, but only for limited, single jurisdiction pilots that did not meet full operational or security requirements.

SBE consulted with other states using Arlo, including Georgia, Rhode Island, and Pennsylvania, to evaluate pricing. The proposed cost from Voting Works aligns with market expectations and reflects Maryland's larger voter population, inclusion of statewide training, county-level support, and longer contract duration. Based on these factors, the pricing is determined to be fair and reasonable.
