Debarment: ASB 2 Enterprises, Inc.

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works debar ASB 2 Enterprises, Inc. ("ASB 2") from being considered for the award of, being awarded, or performing, directly or indirectly, a contract with the State for a period of five years.

Authority: Section 16-307, State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland; Code of Maryland Regulations ("COMAR") 21.08.03.04 and 21.08.04.02.

Remarks: Based on the debarment of Aaron S. Bell (Secretary's Agenda, Item 3, 5/6/2026), ASB 2 is subject to debarment in accordance with State Finance and Procurement Article Section 16-307, Annotated Code of Maryland, which provides that a business is debarred if the Board of Public Works debars an officer, director, controlling shareholder, partner of the business, or employee directly involved in obtaining contracts with public bodies. See also Code of Maryland Regulations 21.08.03.04. The Board debarred Mr. Bell, ASB 2's chief operating officer and, at times, controlling shareholder, who was directly involved in ASB 2's contracting with public bodies, for failure to request a hearing in response to an Administrative Complaint from the Office of Attorney General. The complaint cited debarment grounds based on his guilty plea to two criminal violations of State Finance and Procurement Article Section 11-205.1(a)(3), Annotated Code of Maryland, for using a false writing or document that contained a false or fraudulent statement in connection with a procurement contract. Because of Mr. Bell's debarment and involvement in ASB 2, ASB 2 is subject to debarment to the same extent as Bell.

Public Notice: As required by State Finance and Procurement Article, Section 16-307(d), Annotated Code of Maryland, and COMAR 21.08.03.04.B, the Board gave ASB 2 notice of debarment and the opportunity to request a hearing to establish the debarred person is no longer associated with the business. ASB 2 did not request a hearing within the 30 days allotted. A person subject to debarment who does not timely request a hearing waives the right to a hearing and is debarred, pursuant to COMAR 21.08.04.02.A. Resultantly, ASB 2 is debarred.

Duration: In accordance with State Finance and Procurement Article, Section 16-307, Annotated Code of Maryland, and COMAR 21.08.03.04, ASB Enterprises, Inc. will be debarred for the same five-year period as Mr. Bell.

Debarment: Building Enterprises, LLC

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works debar Building Enterprises, LLC. (“Building Enterprises”) from being considered for the award of, being awarded, or performing, directly or indirectly, a contract with a public body indefinitely.

Authority: Section 16-307, State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland; Code of Maryland Regulations (“COMAR”) 21.08.03.04 and 21.08.04.02.

Remarks: Based on the debarment of Mark Sykes (Secretary’s Agenda, Item 5, 11/19/2025), Building Enterprises is subject to debarment in accordance with State Finance and Procurement Article Section 16-307, Annotated Code of Maryland, which provides that a business is debarred if the Board of Public Works debars an officer, director, controlling shareholder, partner of the business, or employee directly involved in obtaining contracts with public bodies. See also Code of Maryland Regulations 21.08.03.04. The Board debarred Mr. Sykes in accordance with Sections 16-202(a) and 16-304 of the State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland, after he pled guilty to one count of bribery of a public employee in Baltimore County Circuit Court. The debarment of Mr. Sykes, as an officer, director, controlling shareholder, partner, or employee of Building Enterprises that is directly involved in obtaining contracts with public bodies, subjects Building Enterprises to debarment to the same extent as Mr. Sykes.

Public Notice: As required by State Finance and Procurement Article, Section 16-307(d) and COMAR 21.08.03.04.B, the Board gave Building Enterprises notice of debarment and the opportunity to request a hearing to establish that the debarred person is no longer associated with the business. Building Enterprises did not request a hearing within the 30 days allotted. A person subject to debarment who does not timely request a hearing waives the right to a hearing and is debarred, pursuant to COMAR 21.08.04.02.A. Resultantly, Building Enterprises is debarred.

Duration: In accordance with State Finance and Procurement Article, Section 16-307, Annotated Code of Maryland, and COMAR 21.08.03.04, Building Enterprises will be debarred for the same indefinite period as Mr. Sykes.

Debarment: Seabolt & Son, L.L.C.

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works debar Seabolt & Son, L.L.C. (“Seabolt & Son”) from being considered for the award of, being awarded, or performing, directly or indirectly, a contract with a public body for an indefinite period.

Authority: Section 16-307, State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland; Code of Maryland Regulations (“COMAR”) 21.08.03.04 and 21.08.04.02.

Remarks: Based on the debarment of Andrew Seabolt (Secretary’s Agenda, Item 6, 4/22/2026), Seabolt & Son is subject to debarment, in accordance with State Finance and Procurement Article Section 16-307, Annotated Code of Maryland, which provides that a business is debarred if the Board of Public works debars an officer, director, controlling shareholder, partner of the business, or an employee directly involved in obtaining contracts with public bodies. See also Code of Maryland Regulations 21.08.03.04. The Board debarred Mr. Seabolt in accordance with Sections 16-102, 16-202(a), and 16-304 of the State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland. Mr. Seabolt pled guilty to five counts of bribery or attempted bribery of a public employee. The debarment of Mr. Seabolt, as an officer, director, controlling shareholder, partner, or employee of Seabolt & Son who is directly involved in obtaining contracts with public bodies subjects Seabolt & Son to debarment to the same extent as Mr. Seabolt.

Public Notice: As required by State Finance and Procurement Article, Section 16-307(d), Annotated Code of Maryland, and COMAR 21.08.03.04.B, the Board gave Seabolt & Son notice of debarment and the opportunity to request a hearing to establish that the debarred person is no longer associated with the business. Seabolt & Son did not request a hearing within the 30 days allotted. A person subject to debarment who does not timely request a hearing waives the right to a hearing and is debarred, pursuant to COMAR 21.08.04.02.A. Resultantly, Seabolt & Son is debarred.

Duration: In accordance with State Finance and Procurement Article, Section 16-307, Annotated Code of Maryland, and COMAR 21.08.03.04, Seabolt & Son will be debarred for the same indefinite period as Mr. Seabolt.

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6. REGISTERS OF WILLS

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works increase the salaries of the Registers of Wills of the 24 subdivisions as shown on the Salary Table, to become effective at the beginning of the next term of office for the duration of the new term.

Authority: Section 2-205, Estates and Trusts Article, Annotated Code of Maryland. *"Each register is entitled to receive an annual salary, to be determined in each instance by the Board of Public Works."* In determining the annual salary, the Board should consider the following factors: county population, revenue collections and other pertinent data which have relation to the reasonableness of the salary in relation to the work done.

Remarks: The 2026 General Assembly altered the maximum salary from \$146,500 to not more than the salary of a state employee at grade 26, step 20 of the State of Maryland Standard and Bargaining Salary Scale, pursuant to Chapter 565 of the Laws of Maryland. Effective July 1, 2026, the annual salary rate for a state employee at grade 26, step 20 is \$173,382.

The proposed revisions are offered after a comprehensive review of the volume of business and receipts in each jurisdiction and cost of living factors such as median household income and median home value. The goal of the proposed recommendation is to reflect the very high volume of cases and the collection of significant funds, both for the State and local jurisdictions, for which Registers are responsible, as well as the quality of services provided.

The increase for the elected Registers will not be provided until December 1, 2026. The Registers are self-funded through the collection of the inheritance tax and probate and miscellaneous fees, and the increase is accounted for in the Fiscal Year 2027 budget.

Historically, the salary recommendations for each jurisdiction have been tiered according to population size and the relative volume of business and receipts per large, medium-large, medium, and small court classifications established by the Comptroller's Office. However, this proposal has replaced these four categories with five, having conducted additional research on cost-of-living factors in each jurisdiction whose consideration is essential to determining the appropriate compensation for each Register.

Further, while there are several statutory functions that all Registers of Wills must perform, quantitative differences exist in the volume of their daily work. Larger volumes of workload generally require more staff, thus increasing the managerial responsibility of Registers in large jurisdictions. Yet, unlike Registers in larger jurisdictions, Registers in smaller jurisdictions may have to assume at any time the duties of any position in the office due to staff absences and vacancies.

The Registers of Wills are an essential component of Maryland's probate system and are public agencies well-regarded by practitioners and the citizens they serve.

Note: The Board last approved a salary increase for the Registers of Wills as Secretary's Agenda, Item 6 (7/27/2022).

*Wetland Licenses***

Recommendation: The Board of Public Works Wetlands Administrator recommends that the Board grant a license for projects involving dredging and filling in the navigable waters of Maryland.

MDE: The Maryland Department of the Environment concurs with this recommendation.

Authority: Section 16-202, Environment Article, Annotated Code of Maryland: “*The Board shall decide if issuance of the [tidal wetlands] license is in the best interest of the State, taking into account the varying ecological, economic, developmental, recreational, and aesthetic values [the] application presents.*” See also COMAR 23.02.04.

BALTIMORE COUNTY

25-0539 *BALTIMORE COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AND SUSTAINABILITY*– To reduce shoreline erosion by removing an existing deteriorated pier, excavating existing *Phragmites*, filling and grading with sand, planting marsh vegetation, and placing wave attenuation devices with scour protection, vent openings, and obstruction signs.

Remarks (continued):

The incident disrupted multiple operational platforms, including systems supporting Mobility/Paratransit scheduling, dispatch, and call-center functions. These systems are essential for ADA-mandated Mobility services and require immediate stabilization, secure hosting, and continuity support. The compromise of Trapeze PASS and Ranger environments, which enable trip reservations, dispatching, and real-time vehicle oversight, created an urgent need for system and call-center restoration to maintain continuity and compliant operations that mitigate risks to public safety and welfare. The compromise of the system also required that the platforms, which were hosted on-premises, be shifted and quickly deployed to a cloud-based environment.

Basis for Selection: The urgent nature of this situation required bypassing standard procurement timelines and competitive process. MV Contract Transportation, Inc. (MV) was selected because it currently serves as MTA's paratransit operations contractor, managing the affected systems. MV's existing operational role, direct access to the affected systems, and full technical integration made it the only vendor capable of restoring and maintaining service continuity without delay. A contract award to MV is in the best interest of the State.

A fair and reasonable analysis was conducted utilizing historical pricing from multiple MTA contracts for the emergency migration services, software subscriptions, and related IT hardware. As the scope of work for this emergency contract included the migration of proprietary software from on-premises to a cloud-based solution, procurement utilized a previous similar on-premises server migration contract (AGY-21-029-IT) to compare migration service costs. The comparison showed a decrease in service costs for switching from on-premises to cloud-based software, representing a difference of 27%. The laptops and hardware are being provided at costs, and additional market research was done, confirming that the cost is fair and reasonable.

Reason for Late Report: The late submission of this report was due to staffing transitions, lack of access to data due to the cyber incident, necessary changes to the contract Scope of Work (SOW) as emergency conditions changed and operational needs were further identified, changes to supporting contract documentation requirements due to changes in the SOW, and due to an administrative oversight in prioritizing the submission of the report.

The advertisement was for three contracts valued at the following: \$25 million for Contract A, \$20 million for Contract B and \$15 million for Contract C not to exceed \$60 million for program / project management consultant services for Maryland Transit Administration (MTA). A total of 1,435 firms were directly notified via eMMA of which 500 were certified DBEs. Additionally, a total of 63 firms were directly solicited via email. One of three awards are being presented for approval, the remaining two will be presented at a future meeting.

MTA received 11 Expressions of Interest and developed a Reduced Candidate List. From the Reduced Candidate List, MTA invited six engineering consultant firms to submit technical proposals. MTA used a qualifications-based selection and found three firms eligible for contract award. No protests were filed.

The contract provides for program / project management consultant services on a work order basis. The consultant will provide program and project management support, including project scoping, budgeting, scheduling, risk analysis, project oversight, and readiness evaluations. Services also include asset management, engineering and design compliance, cost estimating, stakeholder coordination, federal funding support, and supervision of engineering consultants.

Additional services may include construction management and inspection, project controls, environmental permitting, right-of-way support, ADA compliance review, procurement support, and other engineering, administrative, and project delivery services necessary to support MTA's capital program.

MTA has confirmed the price proposal submitted by Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc.

Although this is an indefinite delivery, indefinite quantity contract, and therefore exempt from BPW Advisory 2026-1 Climate and Sustainability Information, the MTA aims to support and align with Maryland's environmental goals, laws, and policies.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Maryland General Assembly allocated \$2,000,000 from the General Fund in fiscal year 2027, for a new, temporary (pilot) bus route connecting White Marsh to the Tradepoint Atlantic logistics hub in Baltimore County. The Maryland Department of Transportation is required to report the pilot's radar data, cost-effectiveness, and economic impact by June 1, 2027, with any unused funds returning to the State General Fund. The MTA is seeking \$1,893,292.76 for this contract, which reflects the not to exceed cost proposal provided by the incumbent contractor providing bus services.

Route 411 provides weekday service stops between Hickory/Bel Air and Baltimore and consists of five morning trips and five afternoon/evening trips.

The cost to run the pilot service only requires one dedicated coach to run a 12-trip schedule for a continuous 26-mile loop. The base service requires the contractor to schedule coaches and drivers differently than on a continuous service.

Although the appeal was subsequently withdrawn, many documents from the prospective awardee required correction and updates. The award of the successor contract is presented as MDOT 5-S on this agenda. The renewal option will allow time for the successor contract program initiation and mobilization.

A 0.80% Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) and 0.50% Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprise (VSBE) participation goal on the contract management fees were established for this contract based upon the limited subcontracting opportunities and elements of work. Currently, the vendor is meeting the MBE goal with a participation rate of 0.80%. The VSBE participation is associated with specific tasks, and features of work. Requesting Agency Remarks: The Mobility Division of the Maryland Department of Transportation Maryland Transit Administration (MDOT MTA) requires a contract for the provision of services for continued and enhanced Call-A-Ride services for paratransit customers. A Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on August 12, 2022, and 29 vendors were directly solicited. The Pre-Proposal Conference was held on August 25, 2022. There were eight vendors present at the conference, and five timely proposals were received by the due date of October 14, 2022.

The Technical Evaluations were concluded on October 31, 2022, with one of the five offerors being deemed not reasonably susceptible for award. The Financial Proposals were opened once the Technical Rankings were established. On November 17, 2022, a Best and Final Offer (BAFO) was requested of all vendors evaluated as susceptible for award with a due date of November 28, 2022. An extension was later granted until December 2, 2022. Evaluations of the Financial BAFOs and the Financial Rankings were completed on December 13, 2022. The Evaluation Committee made their recommendation for award on November 30, 2022. The Procurement Officer issued a Letter of Intent to the prospective awardee and informed all offerors of their standing.

Upon notice of the apparent awardee, two protests were filed by the same vendor. MDOT MTA conducted a thorough review of the RFP, proposals, and the evaluation process. During this review, certain defects were identified in the performed evaluation process. After careful consideration, in January 2024, MDOT MTA granted the protest in part. Based on the identified defects in the evaluation and the protest, MDOT MTA determined that it would be in the best interest of the State to rescind the award recommendation and re-evaluate the proposals using a new, reconstituted Evaluation Committee and a different Procurement Officer.

MDOT MTA established a new Evaluation Committee with a newly assigned Procurement Officer. The new Evaluation Committee had no access to any information regarding the deliberations or results of the first evaluation process. Evaluation of the written technical proposals began in May 2024 and were completed in July 2024. One offeror was deemed to not be “reasonably susceptible for award” based on the technical evaluation. Oral presentation requests were issued in July to be performed in August. At that time another offeror voluntarily removed themselves from consideration and did not participate in Oral Presentations.

Oral Presentations were completed on August 29, 2024, and a request for BAFO was issued on August 30, 2024, which were due no later than September 13, 2024. However, on September 4, 2024, The Procurement Officer working on this procurement abruptly departed the MDOT MTA. Due to critical staff shortages and high workload within the Office of Procurement, the procurement was not immediately reassigned to a new Procurement Officer and the September BAFOs were not evaluated.

In March 2025 a third Procurement Officer was assigned and commenced the process of review and due diligence of the procurement process accomplished to that date.

In May 2025, it was determined that an additional BAFO was appropriate due to the long delay since the last submission. This set of BAFOs were due and received no later than June 6, 2025. The Evaluation Committee met to review the BAFOs and established a Financial Ranking. The Procurement Officer provided training and instructions to the Evaluation for developing and documenting their award recommendation. While the Procurement Officer was performing due diligence and awaiting the award recommendation from the Evaluation Committee, in August 2025, MDOT MTA experienced a cybersecurity incident which made multiple critical documents inaccessible. Progress on the award process was halted until October 22, 2025, when the procurement documents were made available to the Procurement Officer.

The Procurement Officer restarted the award process, and it was at this time that the Procurement Officer identified an inconsistency with the calculations in the bid form. Working with the project team, it was discovered that critical errors were embedded in the bid form. Crucial sub-totals were not properly included in annual totals resulting in a significantly undervalued total contract amount. It was determined that the error could be corrected by fixing the formulas within the bid form and requesting an additional BAFO utilizing the updated bid form. It was further determined that ridership projections could be updated within the bid form to more accurately reflect program experience since the original bid form was developed. On November 7, 2025, the Procurement Officer requested a BAFO from the three remaining offerors, requiring the use of the updated bid form for continued consideration for award. On November 13, 2025, a third offeror voluntarily removed themselves from consideration and declined to submit a BAFO. Two timely BAFOs were received on November 21, 2025.

The Evaluation Committee met on November 24, 2025, to consider the latest BAFO submission and to finalize the evaluation summary and recommendation which was delivered to the Procurement Officer on November 25, 2025. The Procurement Officer distributed the Procurement Officer Determination for review, comment, and approval on November 25, 2025,

The State Highway Administration (SHA) directly solicited nine contractors. Maryland Works granted a waiver for these services. SHA received five bids, which were opened on March 12, 2026. There were no protests filed for this contract.

On April 13, 2026, the State Highway Administration (SHA) rejected the apparent low bid and determined that it is a non-responsible bidder in accordance with COMAR 21.06.01.01B(1). SHA attempted to contact the bidder several times via phone and email to discuss the bid prices on this contract but did not receive a response. SHA proceeded with award and execution of the contract to the next apparent responsive and responsible low bidder.

The incumbent did not bid on the contract because the scope of work did not align with their current type of work; Additionally, the distance between the contractor's shop and the project sites prevented the contractor from pricing the work competitively while maintaining a reasonable profit margin.

SHA has confirmed Manuel Landscaping, Inc's bid price and the work conducted on this contract will be performed 100% by a State-certified Small Business.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the SHA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and VSBE participation goals, Small Business Preference, as well as a Small Business Reserve designation. A 0% MBE goal was set for this project due to the minimal number of MBE firms located within the geographical area of the work certified with the NAICS codes to perform the project activities.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Department of General Services requests approval to exercise the first one-year renewal option for the Job Order Contracting (JOC) master contracts. The JOC program continues to provide an efficient and effective procurement method for delivering repair, renovation, replacement, and minor construction projects at State-owned facilities throughout Maryland.

Exercising the renewal option will ensure continuity of services and provide State agencies with uninterrupted access to qualified contractors to complete time-sensitive maintenance, capital renewal, and emergency construction projects. The contractors have performed satisfactorily, and the Department recommends exercising the first of two one-year renewal options. Approval of the renewal option is in the State's best interest to maintain the operational effectiveness of the State's facilities and avoid delays in delivering construction services.

To date, overall MBE and VSBE participation across the JOC master contracts has not met the established participation goals. MBE and VSBE participation goals are established for each work order based on the project scope and therefore vary by project. The Department will continue to monitor contractor compliance through the required MBE and VSBE participation reporting and pursue appropriate corrective actions, as necessary, to ensure compliance with the contractual requirements.

The Job Order Contracting (JOC) Program supports the State of Maryland's climate and sustainability objectives by facilitating energy-efficient modernization of State-owned facilities and incorporating opportunities for building electrification, greenhouse gas reductions, and improved building performance where appropriate to the individual project scope. Through task orders issued under the program, projects may include the replacement of aging fossil fuel-based mechanical systems with high-efficiency electric alternatives, installation of energy-efficient equipment, electrical infrastructure improvements to support future building electrification, and roofing or site improvements that accommodate renewable energy installations.

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The program also supports resilient infrastructure through modernization of critical building systems, including emergency power equipment that meets current emissions requirements and applicable environmental standards. Products and materials utilized under the program are expected to comply with applicable energy codes and Maryland's environmentally preferable purchasing requirements, consistent with the State's broader sustainability initiatives.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on January 23, 2026, and sent to 146 prospective offerors, and 13 prospective offerors were directly solicited via email. Four proposals were received in response to the solicitation. All proposals were initially determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award based upon the minimum qualifications. During the evaluation process, one offeror informed the Procurement Officer that the firm would be transitioning to a new technology platform. The offeror's proposal was based on its existing platform, rather than the platform that would be implemented during contract performance. Given the uncertainty associated with this transition, the offeror requested to withdraw its proposal from consideration, and the State determined that it was in the best interest to do so. A second offeror failed to adequately respond to the cure notice and, as a result, their proposal was determined not to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Therefore, leaving only two proposals being determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award.

P&A Administrative Services, Inc. was ranked overall #1 with the higher ranked technical proposal and the lower price. Technical and financial factors had equal weight in the overall determination. Therefore, the award is recommended to P&A Administrative Services, Inc. as having the most advantageous offer to the State.

This contract provides TPA Services for the State of Maryland's FSA plans for State Employees and eligible participants – Healthcare and Dependent Daycare for eligible and enrolled participants of the State's FSA. Requesting Agency Remarks: The Request for Proposals (RFP) was issued by the Department of General Services (DGS) Office of State Procurement (OSP) on behalf of the Maryland Department of Transportation, Maryland Transit Administration (MDOT-MTA) to procure medical and vision plan health benefits and administration services for its approximately 2,510 benefit-eligible represented employees, approximately 2,200 active retirees, and their eligible dependents, in accordance with MDOT-MTA's Collective Bargaining Agreements, coverage of which includes services for a Medical PPO and HMO Plan (Functional Area 5) and a Vision Plan (Functional Area 6). The solicitation was posted on eMMA on August 9, 2025, and directly solicited to 37 prospective offerors. A total of two (2) proposals were received in response to the solicitation; however, only one (1) proposal was determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. The one (1) proposal was determined to be fair and reasonable and is recommended for award.

This is for one (1) contract award for MDOT-MTA Represented Medical & Stop Loss Insurance for a PPO and HMO Plan (Functional Area 5) and a Vision Plan (Functional Area 6) that will include services for medical network administration, claims administration, and population health management (to include case management, utilization review, disease management, weight management, nutrition, and wellness programs). This contract includes firm, fixed unit (administrative fee) prices, with the run-out, audits, and reconciliation processes concluding within 18 months of the last day of the last plan year covered by the Contract.

CareFirst of Maryland, Inc. (CareFirst) received the highest overall technical ranking based on a unanimous decision by the evaluation committee and is recommended for award under Functional Areas 5 and 6 based on its demonstrated technical expertise, proven experience, and comprehensive approach to meeting the State's requirements. The purpose of this agreement is to enhance State revenue by optimizing administrative fee collection across statewide, agency, and cooperative contracts through expanded coverage, improved compliance, and recovery of underreported or unpaid fees where permitted. The Department of General Services entered into a Participating Addendum with KPMG, LLP under the NASPO ValuePoint cooperative agreement to provide revenue generation and administrative fee optimization program management services, including administration of the State's administrative fee program, supplier onboarding and compliance support, collection and validation of supplier sales reports and associated fees, data analytics and reporting, contract marketing, eMarketplace enablement, and support for local government participation. Requesting Agency Remarks: The Maryland Department of Health (MDH) awarded a contract in January 2025 to secure a Dental Benefits Administrator or a Dental Administrative Services Organization to manage dental services for Maryland Medicaid participants. Subsequently, the contract was terminated for convenience, effective April 1, 2026; and the Department entered into a six month contract to maintain continuity of service throughout the remainder of the previous contract.

SKYGEN USA, LLC currently operates a proprietary solution platform that is fully integrated with MDH's operational infrastructure. The uninterrupted administration of dental benefits for Maryland Medicaid recipients depends on the stability and seamless operation of this platform. MDH's procurement history over the last three solicitation cycles demonstrates a highly limited competitive marketplace, with only two offerors responding to the State's solicitations. Based on the operational requirements of the program, the existing system integration, and the need to ensure uninterrupted service delivery, SKYGEN USA, LLC is the only source capable of meeting the State's immediate requirements within the required timeframe without significant operational disruption.

Allowing the current services to lapse would create an immediate gap in dental benefits administration, directly impacting access to care for 1.4 million Medicaid participants.

The price has been determined to be fair and reasonable. MDH compared annual not-to-exceed (NTE) costs associated with active contracts across three other U.S. states for DBA services against SKYGEN's proposed annual NTE cost. When comparing SKYGEN's proposed annual NTE amount to the other listed states' annual costs, this contract for Maryland DBA contains an approximate cost savings of between 25% - 77%.

The MSDE Division of Rehabilitation Services (DORS) is responsible for ensuring that all vehicle modifications comply with applicable federal regulations, including Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) requirements, and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). As part of its mission to support individuals with disabilities in achieving greater independence and mobility, DORS facilitates the adaptation of vehicles to meet specific functional needs. For this effort, DORS requires the modification of a 2026 Chrysler Pacifica Select, in accordance with the specifications outlined in the consumer's Vehicle Equipment Adaptation Prescription Agreement (VEAPA).

On June 23, 2026, MSDE issued this solicitation as a Competitive Sealed Bid (CSB) via the eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) portal. In addition to the commodity vendors in eMMA, seven vendors specifically qualified to perform these vehicle modifications were directly solicited. When bids closed on July 13, 2026, results yielded only one bid submission from Total Mobility Services, Inc.

MSDE has determined that the pricing for the vehicle modification of the 2026 Chrysler Pacifica Select is fair and reasonable in accordance with BPW Advisory 2016-1, which permits agencies to rely upon pre-bid estimates, historical procurement data, and other rationale appropriate to the circumstances of the procurement.

These projects are highly specialized and customized to meet the individual needs of consumers based on their disabilities, adaptive equipment requirements, and vehicle specifications. As a result, no two vehicle modification projects are identical, making direct price comparisons difficult and limiting the usefulness of standardized pricing benchmarks.

For this procurement, the independent pre-bid estimate was \$101,475. The awarded pricing was evaluated against this estimate and determined to be within a reasonable range given the project's customized scope, specialized requirements, and change in the market since the estimate was obtained.

MSDE also reviewed historical procurement data for comparable adaptive vehicle modification projects containing similar components and services. While the historical projects varied in size and complexity, they demonstrated the range of pricing associated with adaptive vehicle modifications depending on the specific consumer needs and equipment installed.

Because there are very few contractors qualified and certified to perform vehicle modifications for DORS clients, no SBR, VSBE, or MBE firms were available for award. The solicitation was publicly posted on eMMA, providing all interested contractors an equal opportunity to bid.

This delayed review by the Department of Information Technology (DoIT), submission to the Office of State Procurement (OSP), and presentation to BPW for approval. Consequently, the required procurement review and approval process was not completed before the prior contract expired. Because the AAVS software is proprietary and Aumentum Technologies/Manatron is the only source able to provide the required maintenance, support, patches, upgrades, and operational services, the fair and reasonable price determination was based on recognized price analysis methods, including comparisons with historical pricing paid by SDAT for the same or similar services, a review of the current scope of services, and a review of the contractor's proposed pricing for continued maintenance and support. The proposed pricing is consistent with the ongoing maintenance and operational support required for the AAVS system, including software patches and upgrades, critical issue response, user support, and ongoing technical coordination. Therefore, the Procurement Officer has determined that the proposed pricing is fair and reasonable in accordance with COMAR 21.05.03.05.

The Department is requesting retroactive approval for services performed from September 1, 2025, through August 19, 2026, and prospective approval to continue services from August 20, 2026, through August 31, 2028, while a competitive procurement is conducted and the replacement system is developed and implemented.

SDAT is currently working with technical writers (since May 2026) to develop an RFP to procure a contractor to create and implement an in-house system to replace AAVS.

The services are necessary to maintain SDAT's real property valuation database system and support the State's triennial assessment and reassessment responsibilities.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Maryland Higher Education Commission (MHEC) requests approval of the second renewal option to ensure the uninterrupted administration of statewide student financial aid programs. Requesting Agency Remarks: A Notice of the availability of a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Professional Licensing Examination Services (Solicitation #: MIA-PL-25-001 / eMMA#: BPM050306) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage on June 23, 2025, and was also sent directly to six vendors from a vendor list.

Two (2) proposals were received in response to the RFP and were determined reasonably susceptible to being selected for award. Upon completion of comprehensive technical and financial evaluations, Prometric was determined to be the most advantageous offeror to the State. Prometric ranked highest technically and submitted the lowest financial pricing. The vendor's proposal is the most responsive and responsible, making Prometric the recommended awardee for this procurement.

The Maryland Insurance Administration (MIA) currently has 11 Examinations and Examination Content Outlines, each available in English and Spanish, which cover all of the Exam lines of authority, and the Public Adjuster license class. Exam content outlines are updated annually. Examination questions include general knowledge questions and Maryland-specific questions. Approximately 30% of each exam consists of Maryland-specific questions.

This contract is a pass-through contract; the end-user pays Prometric directly for services at the predetermined and pre-approved per-course or per-exam fee. Applicants for an examination are required to pay the State a \$25.00 application fee before taking an examination. See Ins. Art. Section 2-112(a)(6)(vi). See also Ins. Art. Agency Remarks: On March 25, 2026, the Department of Human Services (DHS), Baltimore City Department of Social Services (BCDSS) directly solicited three (3) vendors via email who are believed to be qualified to perform the contract, of which two (2) responded. Neither of the companies were Small Business Reserve Enterprise firms, and one Offeror was a Minority Business Enterprise firm.

BCDSS sought to identify and establish a dedicated support structure to provide armed and unarmed security guard services. These services are intended to safeguard the staff, visitors, and property of BCDSS across multiple locations throughout the City of Baltimore. The Contractor will provide highly trained security personnel to support daily operations, maintain a secure environment, deter criminal activity and respond effectively to emergencies, in full compliance with applicable laws and organizational policies.

The BCDSS operates multiple facilities and service centers that provide critical support to vulnerable families, children, and adults. These locations experience high public traffic and regularly encounter situations involving: behavioral escalations, youth requiring crisis intervention, unauthorized entry attempts, threats or aggressive conduct toward staff, property damage or security breaches and medical or mental-health related emergencies., to highlight a few.

Each of these conditions requires trained, responsive, and professional security personnel who can effectively support safety operations in coordination with BCDSS leadership. The unique needs and diverse profile of BCDSS customers and clients, coupled with the identified risk factors, positions BCDSS such that security guards must be skilled and trained in traditional security protocols as well as de-escalation techniques, and trauma-informed interventions to address the identified risks and improve the overall effectiveness of security services delivered at BCDSS facilities.

Proposals were due on April 8, 2026, and two (2) Proposals were received.. After review of the two Proposals, the Department determined that both Proposals were reasonably susceptible for award and recommended Elite Security Services and Solutions, LLC (Elite) as the Offeror who submitted the Proposal that was most advantageous to the State. Elite's Technical Proposal was ranked first technically, and its Best and Final Offeror was also ranked first. Therefore, the Evaluation Committee ranked Elite first overall.

Elite's proposed leadership team and organizational structure demonstrate extensive experience and capabilities. The identified site director possesses over 40 years of experience in law enforcement, executive leadership, and health care security, including relevant experience securing the University of Maryland Medical System in the City of Baltimore. Elite Security utilizes a certified MBE subcontractor, BizTech Fusion, to manage integrated administrative support, compliance, reporting, and coordination. This administrative model allows field leaders to focus solely on operations. Elite Security demonstrated a robust and highly detailed Technical Response, Work Plan, and Oral Presentation. Their operational methodology includes a command-driven, prevention-focused approach designed to identify concerns early and intervene before situations escalate. The company's commitment to quality is underscored by its rigorous training, including mandatory annual certifications in First Aid, CPR, Narcan, Defibrillator use, and active shooter response, along with the proprietary "ELITE System" focused on de-escalation and workplace violence. Their training framework teaches participants to use Listen, Act, and Recover, to manage tense situations; and the organization practices holistic listening (elevated listening in tense environments), which assess body language, tone and emotional cues.

Elite Security maintains a 24/7 operation with available supervisory and dispatch personnel and a standby pool of pre-screened, licensed, and trained backup personnel, ensuring a replacement guard is provided within two hours for any contingency. This staffing model "anticipates" call outs and unplanned absences; and utilizes active field supervision, and real-time monitoring of staffing levels to prevent uncovered posts.

An MBE goal of 15% was established for this solicitation, and Elite Security has agreed to meet the MBE goal.
