24-0626 *TOWN OF CHARLESTOWN* – To stabilize an exposed sanitary sewer line by temporarily installing gabion baskets and also repairing and replacing another portion of the sewer line by constructing concrete collars.

Special conditions: Requirements for cofferdam removal, if a water-filled cofferdam is used, and design and construction of gabion baskets. Restrictions on filling a water-filled cofferdam.

Note: Issuance of this wetlands license will ratify Emergency License #24-WL-0626EX(R1) issued to the Town of Charlestown September 6, 2024, authorizing replacing sewer pipes with concrete collars, excavating substrate, constructing gabion basket breakwaters, and temporarily placing water filled cofferdams.

2. Require mitigation for impacts to submerged aquatic vegetation to be accomplished by constructing an emergent tidal wetland area in an upland farm field.

MDE: The Maryland Department of the Environment concurs with the recommendations.

Mitigation: Installing mooring piles to dock a barge and installing an access ramp to the barge will result in permanent impacts to 895 square feet of submerged aquatic vegetation (SAV). MDE recommends that the licensee mitigate for the SAV at a 6:1 ratio (COMAR 23.02.04.11.B) by constructing a 5,370 square foot area of emergent tidal wetlands.

895 square feet of impact x 6 (6:1 ratio) = 5,370 square feet of required mitigation
Mitigation provided = 5,370 square feet

DORCHESTER COUNTY

22-0051 *638 TAYLORS ISLAND ROAD, LLC* – To provide an access point for loading and unloading barges servicing dredging and restoration projects by installing mooring piles and an access ramp, and constructing an emergent tidal wetland area to mitigate for SAV impacts.

Established in 1995, the *Neighborhood Business Development Program*, now operating as *Neighborhood BusinessWorks (NBW)*, is a Smart Growth tool for revitalization through business creation or expansion in designated revitalization areas.

Loan Amount: \$1,968,144

Project Description: The Baltimore Museum of Industry (BMI) is requesting a loan through the Department of Housing and Community Development's Neighborhood BusinessWorks (NBW) Program to refinance existing mortgage debt secured by two contiguous waterfront properties located at 1425 and 1437 Key Highway in Baltimore City. The properties comprise BMI's primary museum campus and are located within a designated Priority Funding Area along the South Harbor waterfront. This loan will help stabilize this important community asset located along the City of Baltimore's historic harbor.

BMI is a Maryland-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that has operated continuously since 1977. The Museum serves as a regional cultural and tourism asset, attracting nearly 100,000 visitors annually, including Maryland residents, school groups, and out-of-state visitors. Located along a prominent waterfront corridor, the Museum contributes to Baltimore's visitor economy by supporting tourism activity and nearby small businesses.

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9. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT (cont'd)

Project Description (cont'd):

This financing helps to preserve approximately seventeen full-time and thirty part-time positions and ensures continued public access to historically significant facilities and rental space that host over 140 private events annually. Enabling BMI to advance its strategic goals related to expanded exhibits, student engagement, and community programming.

The proposed Neighborhood BusinessWorks loan in the amount of \$1,968,144 will be used solely to refinance existing mortgage debt. The transaction will replace existing financing with a fixed-rate, long-term loan that improves debt service stability and aligns repayment obligations with the Museum's operating revenue profile. DHCD will hold a first lien position on the collateral, and the transaction is supported by a low loan-to-value ratio of approximately 18.74 percent, resulting in limited financial exposure to the State.

BMI's operating revenues are derived from admissions, educational programming, facility rentals, contributed income, and special events. These recurring revenue sources support ongoing operations and will serve as the source of repayment for the NBW loan. Underwritten projections demonstrate the Museum's ability to meet debt service requirements under conservative assumptions.

This State is in a unique position to offer this refinance on terms that are not available via conventional lenders for nonprofits such as BMI. This loan is consistent with the Neighborhood BusinessWorks program's and Department's mission to preserve historic sites and support cultural institutions with public-serving missions.

Project Description: SJB Diversity Management / The Oaks Hospitality Group, LLC, a certified minority and woman-owned business, is seeking financing through the Neighborhood BusinessWorks (NBW) Program to expand The Oaks Inn Annapolis, a boutique bed and breakfast located at 172 Green Street in the Annapolis Historic District. The property, built in 1860, features seven guest rooms and six bathrooms. Since opening in December 2023, the business has demonstrated strong performance, generating sizable revenue between January and July 2025 from both lodging and event rentals.

The proposed 172 Green Street Addition Project will construct a rear garden room with a covered porch, ADA-compliant bathrooms, and a commercial catering kitchen. The expansion will create a fully accessible, state-of-the-art event and meeting space accommodating up to 50 guests. Planned technology upgrades include integrated audio-visual systems, high-speed Wi-Fi, and smart controls for lighting and climate management. Interior enhancements will ensure full ADA compliance and improve overall guest accessibility. The project will also feature upgraded HVAC, plumbing, and electrical systems, along with historic finishes consistent with the standards of the Annapolis Historic Preservation Commission and the Maryland Historical Trust (MHT).

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10. DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT (cont'd)

The project will strengthen both the financials and the community offerings of the existing business by adding dedicated space for events and retreats, supporting workforce growth, and increasing visitor activity in downtown Annapolis.

Located within a Priority Funding Area and Sustainable Community, the project supports the Department's goals of community revitalization and small business development. It is expected to create six new full-time jobs, sustain eight existing positions, and generate eight construction jobs. Construction is projected to conclude by Winter 2027, financed through private investment and a \$455,100 NBW-Classic loan.

The entrepreneurs behind The Oaks Inn Annapolis are Sharon Jackson Wilder and Bernard Quinton Wilder.

Ms. Wilder is the co-owner (85%) and co-founder of The Oaks Hospitality Group. Ms. Wilder has 40+ years' experience as a dynamic business leader and hospitality professional with extensive experience in event planning, project management, boutique lodging development, and public-private partnerships. In addition to her role with The Oaks Hospitality Group, Ms. Wilder is the co-founder and President of Indigo Mid-Atlantic. Prior to co-founding The Oaks Hospitality Group, Ms. Wilder was the Chief Equity and Inclusion Officer for Montgomery College for seven years where she established and led the Office of Equity and Inclusion. Her prior experience includes Vice President at a full-service engineering, architecture, and program management firm in Washington DC. She served in a Cabinet position as a Director and Senior Policy Advisor in the Executive Office of the Mayor of Washington DC. Ms. Wilder holds a Juris Doctor (J.D.) from Georgetown University, a Master of Public Administration (MPA) and a Bachelor of Arts (BA) in Political Science and Environmental Science from University of Massachusetts, Amherst. She is a Certified Public Manager (CPM) and Certified Maryland Equity and Inclusion Leadership Professional.

Mr. Wilder is the co-owner (15%) and co-founder of The Oaks Hospitality Group. Mr. Wilder is a seasoned hospitality professional with over 40 years of experience in the food service, events management, and hospitality industries. He has proven expertise in overseeing day-to-day operations, ensuring exceptional guest experiences, and managing all aspects of hospitality services. He has a strong operations, guest relations, and event coordination. Experienced in maintaining high standards for service, food quality, and property management. Prior to co-founding The Oaks Hospitality Group, Mr. Wilder managed a family catering business for 20 years where he managed events from conception to execution, coordinated all aspects of hospitality services and trained and mentored staff. Mr. Wilder holds a Bachelor of Science in Mass Communications, Hospitality Business minor from University of Massachusetts, Amherst.

Remarks: On September 4, 2025, the Maryland Department of Natural Resources (DNR) issued an Invitation for Bids (IFB) on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) electronically notifying 346 potential vendors. The solicitation included a 15% Minority Business Enterprise subcontracting participation goal.

Four bids were received and opened on September 9, 2025; however, three bids were deemed non-responsive due to deficiencies in MBE form completion, lack of documented commitment to meet the MBE goal, or failure to provide required waiver documentation and demonstrate good-faith efforts as required by COMAR 21.11.03.11 and 21.06.02.04. The project was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) for a period of seventy-three calendar days. A pre-bid conference and a site visit were conducted during the solicitation period. The University received eight proposals, of which three were deemed non-responsive. A Technical Evaluation Committee evaluated the remaining five proposals and recommended that four offerors advance to the price proposal phase. Scope reviews were conducted with these four offerors. The lowest-priced offeror demonstrated adequate technical capability and submitted the most responsive and responsible proposal.

Following a procurement review, it was determined that Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) sub-goals were applicable to this project. Due to the specialized nature of the work, the University established an overall MBE participation goal of 28.00%, including sub-goals of 8.00% for African American-owned MBE firms and 11.00% for woman-owned MBE firms. The selected contractor's MBE participation meets the established overall goal and all applicable sub-goals.

The University considered the inclusion of a VSBE participation goal. Based on the scope of work, project schedule, and availability of certified VSBE firms capable of performing the required specialized construction services, totaling 24 firms, it was determined that a VSBE goal was not appropriate for this solicitation.

Remarks: Nature of Emergency: On August 21, 2025, the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) learned of a potential cybersecurity incident. Upon detecting the incident, which involved unauthorized access to certain MTA systems, the State of Maryland's cybersecurity teams at MTA and the Maryland Department of Information Technology (DoIT) immediately acted to investigate the nature and scope of the incident, to contain the threat, and to secure MTA systems. MTA systems have been negatively impacted by the incident and necessary actions were taken in response. Urgent procurement activities are needed to maintain and continue MTA operations and to mitigate potential harm to public safety and welfare.

MTA performs semiannual reviews of bus routes each year, in late August, early February, and mid-June. The reviews typically result in service changes to adjust routes, trips, and operator work assignments in response to service performance, ridership, and operational needs. These schedule updates are done in advance and are foundational to MTA's ability to provide reliable transit service, in addition to compliance with the established collective bargaining agreement between MTA and the Amalgamated Transit Union, Local 1300. The Office and Planning and Programming was unable to utilize the existing on-premises scheduling platform, which was offline due to the cyber incident and was estimated to not be operational until November or December 2025, after the publication deadline.

MTA contacted two vendors known to provide transit planning software modules on October 29, 2025. Of the two directly solicited vendors, Optibus, Inc (Optibus) was the first to respond with a proposal package including pricing, and demonstrated the ability to perform the required scope of work, and mobilize within the following week.

This contract will provide, a software platform and associated services that include the following:

1. Scheduling Platform Deployment

A comprehensive scheduling solution that includes modules or tools for managing Trips, Blocks, Runs, Rosters, and Timetables to fully re-establish MTA's scheduling capabilities.

2. Cloud-Based Hosting and Support

A secure, cloud-hosted Software-as-a-Service (SaaS) model that ensures system accessibility independent of MTA's internal infrastructure.

3. Training and Implementation Support

Hands-on training, configuration, and implementation support for MTA scheduling staff to ensure rapid adoption and operational readiness.

4. System Integration Capabilities

Ability to integrate with existing MTA systems, including:

- Real-time performance analytics and schedule adherence tools (e.g., Swiftly or equivalent).
- Operations and dispatch systems (e.g., Trapeze OPS or equivalent) to support daily operations and operator assignment workflows.

Although Remix Software, Inc. (Remix) offers scheduling software, Remix did not demonstrate examples of deploying in a large-scale agency while Optibus demonstrated examples of successful implementation in large scale agencies, comparable to MTA and across Transit Agencies in United States and abroad. Ultimately, Optibus was selected for contract award based on extensive prior experience in transit scheduling projects of similar size and scope and the vendor's ability to mobilize and begin work promptly. The procurement officer analyzed the pricing provided and determined that while Optibus was 3.5% higher in price, their experience in successful project delivery represented best value to MTA considering the critical nature of timely schedule delivery and maintaining compliance with Union requirements.

Requesting Institution Remarks: The solicitation was advertised on *eMarylandMarketplaceAdvantage* and the University's eBid Board. Twenty-one (21) proposals were received for MEP Commissioning ("Cx") Services, and eleven (11) proposals were received for BE Commissioning Services. The proposals were evaluated by an Evaluation Committee which included representatives from UMB's Design and Construction group, UMBC's Department of Facilities Management and TU's Department of Facilities Management. After review by the Evaluation Committee, six (6) MEP Cx Firms were shortlisted and five (5) submitted price proposals consisting of hourly rates for a variety of consulting positions. Four (4) BE Cx Firms were shortlisted and all four submitted price proposals that consisted of hourly rates for a variety of consulting positions. For analysis and evaluation purposes, the hourly rates were applied to three sample projects using hours for various staff positions based on prior Commissioning projects done for UMB.

Awards are recommended to the five (5) MEP and four (4) BE technically qualified commissioning firms which provide the best overall value to UMB based on the results of the technical and financial evaluation.

After the committee evaluated the oral presentations, all four (4) offerors were invited to submit price proposals. The evaluation committee, in collaboration with the procurement officer, determined an opportunity to reduce costs by inviting all four (4) offerors to submit a best and final offeror. In doing so, all four (4) offerors submitted lower price proposals.

Contract award is recommended to Mission Media, LLC, who had the highest overall rank and was ranked highest technically and had the lowest price proposal. The recommended firm is also the incumbent contractor with strong performance during the previous contract period.

Of the \$11 million contract value, it is estimated that \$8 million be spent for the direct cost of advertising (pass through dollars). There is an 11% Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) goal for the professional services under this contract. The total services costs estimated for the life of the contract are \$3 million and the 11% MBE goal is based on the services portion of the contract only.

Requesting Institution Remarks: This solicitation was advertised on *eMaryland Marketplace Advantage* as well as posted on the University's electronic bid board. In addition, eight firms were directly invited to participate, resulting in five (5) submitted proposals. All submissions were reviewed, and the Evaluation Committee shortlisted the top four ranked firms for further technical and financial evaluation. Only two firms progressed to the Best and Final Offers stage, as their proposals were deemed responsive to the service requirements, a determination that was reinforced by their financial submissions. Following this process, Liaison International emerged as the highest-ranked firm based on both technical merit and cost and is recommended for award as the most advantageous option for the University.

Although services in this sector are predominantly delivered in-house due to reliance on proprietary tools, a Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) participation goal of 5% was established to foster inclusivity and encourage subcontracting opportunities. This target was designed to incentivize firms to identify and engage qualified MBE partners within their service offerings. Liaison requested a waiver from the 5% MBE goal and the University granted this waiver as the firm demonstrated good faith efforts to meet the goal. This documented effort included outreach to forty (40) MBEs via email, phone calls, and formal correspondence. The outreach focused on firms classified under NAICS code 32311 – Commercial Printing, Digital Printing, specifically targeting professional on-demand printing services.

Following the withdrawal of this item from the December 3, 2025 BPW meeting, UBalt's Director of Procurement conducted an independent verification by contacting all 40 MBE firms on December 10–11, 2025. Most calls either failed to connect due to invalid contact information on file, or the calls went unanswered and a voice message was left. Of those that connected, approximately one-third confirmed an inability to provide the required services. Three firms requested additional details via email, which UBalt provided on December 11, 2025. Only one firm, Toyo, Inc. (Toyo), responded to UBalt's email. Upon joint evaluation by UBalt and Liaison to assess Toyo's operational capacity, it was determined that the firm does not maintain in-house printing, finishing, or mailing capabilities, but instead intended to subcontract all services to a non-MBE vendor in Michigan.

In addition, thirteen firms were directly solicited, resulting in fourteen (14) proposals received. The resulting contract will be established as an indefinite-quantity contract, allowing University System of Maryland institutions to obtain Title IX services on an as-needed basis throughout the contract term. Because this is a multiple-award contract, no technical ranking of the selected firms was conducted. However, all recommended firms met technical requirements and evaluated costs were based solely on the Offerors' proposed rates for each category of service, ensuring pricing transparency and comparability across all awarded vendors.

USM institutions must follow the USM procurement policies and procedures when utilizing the contract. USM encourages secondary competition when appropriate.

Due to the highly specialized and sensitive nature of Title IX service, single element of work (subcontracting tasks increases privacy risks and compromises investigative integrity), a Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) goal was not established. However, one of the one recommended awarded firms (Terry-Todd) is a certified small business (CSB).

Requesting Agency Remarks: On April 22, 2025, the Maryland Transportation Authority (MDTA) advertised a solicitation in The Daily Record and on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA). The solicitation sought five contracts valued at \$14 million each for architectural and engineering design, inspection, and analysis services. A total of 1,912 firms were notified through eMMA, with 91 receiving direct solicitations. MDTA received and evaluated seven technical proposals.

MDTA followed a qualifications-based selection process and ultimately identified five consultants as eligible for contract award, two of which are being presented here for award. No protests were filed.

The contracts will provide physical, on-site inspections and miscellaneous comprehensive engineering design services of MDTA facilities. The facilities include I-95 (John F. Kennedy Memorial Highway including the Express Toll Lane and Travel Plazas), I-895 (Baltimore Harbor Tunnel Thruway), I-395 and I-95 in Baltimore City (Fort McHenry Tunnel), I-695 (Francis Scott Key Bridge), the Harry W. Nice Memorial/Senator Thomas "Mac" Middleton Bridge, the Thomas J. Hatem Memorial Bridge, the William Preston Lane, Jr. Memorial Bridge (twin structures) and the Intercounty Connector (ICC) in Prince George's and Montgomery Counties. Additional services include inspections of bridges, tunnels, roadways, and ancillary structures; utilization and maintenance of the Structures Inspection and Repair Management (SIRM) system through subcontractor and vendor agreements with the system developer; asset management services; provision of access equipment and maintenance of traffic for inspections; non-destructive testing; construction inspection services; structural evaluations, analyses, and load ratings; surveying; structural and other engineering design services; and project management services.

The MDTA Procurement Review Group reviewed the scope of work to assess the potential for Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) and Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprise (VSBE) participation. Based on this evaluation, MDTA established a 28% MBE goal and a 2% VSBE goal for the contract. Both joint ventures have committed to meeting both the MBE and VSBE goals.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Maryland Transportation Authority (MDTA) is an independent State agency that acts on behalf of the Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT). The MDTA is responsible for financing, constructing, operating, and maintaining Maryland's toll facilities. It also provides MDOT with conduit financing for other revenue-producing transportation projects.

MDTA is seeking approval from the Board of Public Works to extend the contract for 18 months beginning March 1, 2026 to allow for continuation of critical MDTA Department of IT (MDTA DoIT) tasks including services for financial management, operations and engineering, GIS, web services, MDTA Police, fair practices, health and safety, human resources, communications, and capital planning while MDTA prepares a Request for Proposal (RFP) for a similar scope of work. Requesting Agency Remarks: On September 19, 2025, the Maryland Port Administration (MPA) advertised a Request for Proposals on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage, which notified approximately 910 vendors of the solicitation. A combined preproposal meeting and site visit was held on September 25, 2025, with 20 contractors from seven firms attending. MPA received five proposals, and all were found to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award.

The work to be performed under this Contract consists of the furnishing of all materials and equipment and the performance of all labor to complete the BGE Feeder Upgrade which includes constructing a new duct bank at the DMT to house upgraded electrical feeders. This duct bank will connect from BGE's manhole EMH-485 to MPA's substation on DMT. The project involves open trenching, jack and bore, dewatering, coordination with existing utilities, hauling, and maintenance of traffic.

Joseph B. Fay Co.'s (Fay) technical proposal was deemed to be Excellent by the evaluation committee and was the highest technically ranked offeror. The project history they offered showed experience in every facet of this project which is further supported by the Project Approach provided as part of their Technical Proposal and specific utility experience at MPA terminals. Financially, Fay submitted the second lowest price proposal. Fay's price proposal was within 1% of the Engineer's Estimate, and as such, the line-item pricing provided by Fay as compared to the Engineer's Estimate gives MPA a high degree of confidence that the price proposed was inclusive of all work required under the contract at a price that is fair and reasonable. All Offerors were notified of MPA's selection and two requested a debriefing; debriefings were conducted, and no protests have been received.

In January 2025, MPA was awarded an Environmental Protection Agency Clean Ports Grant of approximately \$147M. This is the first of three utility infrastructure improvements that provide imperative electrical infrastructure improvements to provide increased power capacity to the Dundalk and Seagirt Marine Terminals. With this increased power capacity our tenants are able to expedite decarbonization efforts and benefit from the procurement of approximately 220 pieces of zero emissions vehicles and cargo handling equipment through grant funding. The combined efforts of the infrastructure improvements and zero emission vehicles provide operational efficiency while significantly reducing greenhouse gas emissions which will directly benefit the air quality for surrounding communities.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MPA Office of Fair Practices and Procurement Review Group (PRG) reviewed this contract for potential Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) and Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprise (VSBE) goals and Small Business Reserve designation. The contract was not designated as a Small Business Reserve nor were VSBE goals assigned due to federal grant terms and conditions. *PRG recommended a 25% DBE goal, and the RFP was advertised with a 25% DBE goal on September 19th, 2025. However, an Addendum was issued on October 7, 2025, to remove the DBE goal from the contract, consistent with the Interim Final Rule issued by the United States Department of Transportation on October 3, 2025.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The MPA advertised a Request for Proposals (RFP) on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage which notified 2,500 vendors of the solicitation, of which more than 500 were Certified Small Businesses (CSB). The Procurement Officer also directly solicited nine vendors via email. Four CSBs attended the preproposal meeting. Two proposals were received by the RFP deadline; however, one proposal was deemed not susceptible for award because they failed to meet the minimum requirements of the RFP. The offeror did not file a protest and deadline for filing a protest has passed.

The Procurement Officer reached out to the CSBs that attended the pre-proposal meeting to inquire why they did not submit a proposal; one vendor was a subcontractor to the successful offeror; one vendor could not find a partner with port/maritime experience; and the other stated that the Small Business Reserve (SBR) designation put them in a non-competitive position.

John C, Martin Associates' technical proposal demonstrated a strong understanding of the scope of work and MPA's requirements. In addition, Martin Associates has years of experience and in-depth working knowledge of the Port of Baltimore, as well as the national and international maritime industry.

The MPA provided an estimated number of hours for each labor category and required Offerors to submit an hourly rate for each labor category in the financial proposal. These estimated hours were estimated for evaluation purposes only, at 2,000 hours per year, based on the scope of work. The MPA did not guarantee the number of hours for each labor category.

A request for financial Best and Final Offer (BAFO) was sent to John C. Martin Associates. In addition, MPA requested clarification for two labor classifications included in the financial proposal, and two labor classifications were updated with new estimated hours for each. Martin Associates submitted its BAFO and reduced its total evaluated price by \$26,000.

John C. Martin Associates' hourly rates and total evaluated proposal price have been determined to be fair and reasonable by conducting a price analysis. Since 2020, the shipping industry has undergone COVID disruptions, in addition the cumulative consumer price index has increased by approximately 26%. MPA has a current contract for Planning and Economic Consulting services that has similar labor categories, however the scope of work under that contract is primarily for the Port of Baltimore's economic impact analysis and other economic tasks such as performing benefit-cost analysis on projects submitted under a federal grant application. The hourly rates submitted for this contract were compared to the hourly rates under the Planning and Economic Consultant contract; the rates proposed under this contract were higher but are acceptable because the scope under this contract is specialized, more technically challenging and time sensitive, requiring extensive knowledge of maritime construction activities as well as other port trends. The total evaluated price is within MPA's budgeted amount. In accordance with BPW advisory 2016-1 and for the reasons stated above, MPA determined the pricing offered to be fair and reasonable.

4-S. **MARYLAND PORT ADMINISTRATION** (*cont'd*)

Requesting Agency Remarks (cont'd):

The goal of this project is to create a range of strategies that will enhance the Port's competitiveness and the long-term sustainability of the assets of the MPA. A clear and achievable implementation strategy shall be developed to expand and improve Port facilities and operations over five, 10 and 25-year time frames. The project will address a broad range of issues impacting the Port, including roadway and transportation networks, access management and gate efficiency, truck origins and destinations, rail service optimization, sustainable development, emerging technologies, and other potential issues that may arise as the process unfolds.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MPA Office of Fair Practices and Procurement Review Group (PRG) reviewed this contract for potential Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) and Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprise (VSBE) goals and SBR designation. It was determined that it was not feasible to establish both an MBE and VSBE goal for this contract. PRG designated this contract for SBR because there were at least two CSBs that could perform the services under this contract. PRG recommended a 10% MBE goal, which was met by the successful offeror in the proposal.

With regular maintenance, the UPS chassis and internal components typically last seven to 10 years between refresh or replacement, as such, these units are nearing the end of life and warrant replacement of internal components to extend the unit's lifespan and ensure appropriate power redundancy.

To ensure the additional 10-year warranty is provided, MTA must utilize the manufacturer's authorized regional maintenance representative, Weiss Acquisition, LLC.; because no other entity is permitted to perform the work.

In accordance with BPW Advisory 2016-1, a fair and reasonable price analysis was performed. The analysis included a review of historical pricing from Contract No. T-1521-0150 in 2022 and the price provided in the Engineer's Estimate (EE). Comparing the 2022 historical pricing from Contract No. T-1521-0150, in which MTA procured UPS replacement services, revealed that the current pricing provided in the vendor's quote increased by only 5% percent and is 9.32% lower than the EE. Part A (Retroactive): Retroactive approval is requested to ratify this contract authority of \$584,087.30 for the retro payment. This agenda reflects that the contract was utilized without TSO's delegated authority and without BPW approval, and that TSO seeks ratification of this retroactive contract. MDOT TSO is requesting that the Board of Public Works (BPW) approve the retroactive contract MDOTTS2611 for the Oracle Java SE Universal Subscription, which will allow for reconciliation of services utilized after the prior contract ended.

Part B (Proactive): TSO recommends the continuation of this sole source contract for 10 months and 10 days, to allow time to complete a competitive procurement.

The MDOT, The Secretary's Office (TSO), has a need for a sole source contract for Oracle Java SE Universal License Subscription. Oracle is the sole owner and developer of their proprietary software; Oracle Java is used in a wide variety of computing platforms from embedded devices and mobile phones to MDOT enterprise software.

In September 2023, Oracle changed its licensing model for Oracle Java SE, separating it from existing software bundles and requiring an additional paid subscription based on total agency employee count (10,000), rather than individual user subscriptions (1,895). MDOT's previous bundled software contract expired on November 30, 2023, and due to budget constraints and limited awareness of the impacts from the licensing change, the subscription was not renewed.

As a result, end users across MDOT unknowingly triggered license obligations by continuing to use software systems that depend on the Oracle Java for essential functions such as system maintenance, patching, and performance monitoring. These tools are embedded in many of MDOT's enterprise applications and could not be disabled without compromising system stability and security. Based on these actions and under the new subscription model, the software reseller, Mythics LLC, invoiced MDOT for these additional licenses and past unlicensed usage.

Although the pricing has increased based on Oracle's new pricing model, the price is determined to be fair and reasonable with a negotiated decrease over the original 2023 yearly price quote of \$1.9 million. Although the three-year annual charge has increased in price by \$724,890.02 or 762.16% and annually by \$178,223.35, the increase is much less costly than the initial \$1,525,500.00 three-year charge originally submitted which was a \$1,430,390.02 or 187.39% increase over the \$95,109.98 annual charge before the pricing model was changed. MDOT negotiated a saving of \$705,000.00 or 216.38%.

The MDOT is seeking approval from the Board of Public Works for a sole source retroactive contract required to pay for two years, one month and 18 days of retroactive services December 01, 2023 – February 18, 2026, and 10 months and 10 days of proactive services February 19, 2026 - November 30, 2026, for Oracle Java SE. Because services have already been rendered and because only one source exists to provide the required software, this is a retroactive sole source

Requesting Agency Remarks: The Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) on behalf of the Maryland Transportation Authority (MDTA) issued a Task order Request for Proposal (TORFP) solicitation on October 21, 2024, to obtain the services of one Master Contractor to provide up to 16 resources. The originally solicited TORFP had a base contract period of three years. The Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) services cover dynamic message signs, closed circuit tv cameras, highway advisory radio, speed detectors, and zone alert message signs (SHAZAM), and the Land Mobile Radio (LMR) Maintenance, Repair and Systems Support Services cover communication towers, shelters, compound, and associated equipment. Each category was awarded separately. This contract provides the necessary expertise and labor for systems troubleshooting, maintenance, repair and support services directly related to ITS and/or LMR communications towers facilities, equipment, applications, support systems, ancillary and associated systems devices and/or components including wireless communications systems.

On May 1, 2024, MDOT and Communications Electronics, Inc. executed a novation agreement to address their business acquisition and name change from Communications Electronics, Inc. to Mobile Communications America, Inc.

This modification extension is to allow for the re-procurement of this contract, and to ensure no services interruptions while the contract is solicited, awarded, and transitioned. Requesting Agency Remarks: On November 5, 2025, the Maryland Department of Transportation, The Secretary's Office (MDOT TSO) requested approval to use the Expedited Procurement method as per the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 21.05.06.03 to procure United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) and Airport Concession Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (ACDBE) reevaluation review services via one or more qualified firms in order to comply with recent updates to Federal regulations.

On October 3, 2025, an Interim Final Rule (IFR) was published in the Federal Register that made significant changes to the DBE and ACDBE programs. Among changes, the IFR removed the use of race- and sex-based presumptions of social and economic disadvantage in the certification process, contained new requirements that replace race- and sex-based presumptions of social and economic disadvantage, and required that all businesses currently certified as DBE and ACDBE must be reevaluated in accordance with the new rules. To mitigate harm to the more than 9,700 DBE and ACDBE businesses certified in Maryland (up to 25% of the national total of all certified USDOT DBE/ACDBE firms) MDOT requested Board approval to conduct an Expedited Procurement. On November 5, 2025, that request was approved.

These new Federal rules have created urgent circumstances under which an Expedited Procurement is determined to be in the public's best interest. This procurement was advertised on November 18, 2025. The Procurement Officer conducted intensive market research using all available means and directly solicited 14 potential prime contractors via email and phone.

A Pre-Bid Conference was held on November 25, 2025, and an abbreviated open solicitation period of 14 days ended on the bid due date of December 2, 2025. Thirty-Five questions were received and answered by the Procurement Officer from the vendor community. A total of six bids were received, including two from dually-certified Minority Business Enterprises/Certified Small Businesses, one from a Certified Small Business and one from a Minority Business Enterprise.

Two no-bid forms were received, with reasons for not participating including the limited time to respond, ambiguous contract specifications, and lack of available internal resources to apply to the project.

The recommended awardees, Aurora Technical Systems, LLC (ATS), and Cool & Associates LLC, will assist the Office of Minority Business Enterprise (OMBE) within the Department of Social and Economic Mobility (DoSEM) with reevaluation of firms impacted by the IFR. The IFR made significant changes to the regulations associated with the DBE program in Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Parts 23 and 26, including removing race and gender-presumptions of disadvantage, requiring reevaluation of all currently certified DBE firms to determine if a disadvantage exists, and preventing departments of transportation from setting DBE or ACDBE goals or monitoring compliance until a reevaluation process has been conducted by the Uniform Certification Program, OMBE. ATS and Cool & Associates will provide the necessary resources that will allow OMBE to review reevaluation requests from thousands of businesses.

This Expedited Procurement did not include MBE or VSBE subcontracting goals due to a single element of work, however, a Small Business Preference of 5% was applied to this procurement. Two potential MBE prime contractors and no VSBE potential prime contractors were identified in market research; both of the MBE firms directly solicited submitted a bid and both received an award.

Requesting Agency Remarks: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on January 7, 2025, and ten (10) firms were directly solicited. Eight (8) proposals were received on February 11, 2025, and seven (7) were initially deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. DGS commenced fee negotiations with the top six (6) CSM firms, of which four (4) are MBEs. It was determined that one of the top seven firms submitted its D-1A form without the participation percentages for the subcontractors filled out, which is a material deficiency that cannot be fixed post-submission under COMAR 21.06.02.04. As a result, that firm's proposal was rejected for being ineligible for award in accordance with COMAR 21.05.03.03(B). Following this determination, the Evaluation and Negotiation Committee proceeded with negotiations and successfully reached an agreement on a fair and reasonable fee with the firm that was ranked seventh prior to the elimination of the firm that was originally ranked sixth. The price proposal submitted by each firm reflected billing rates for each discipline required. The hours for each project/work order awarded under the agreement will be negotiated, and the individual work orders will be executed individually.

Requesting Agency Remarks: During construction, issues with the newly installed T-10 transformer and equipment in the switchgear kept the generator from transferring power to the facility. Due to the acuity of the resident population at Potomac Center / Secure Evaluation and Therapeutic Treatment (SETT), the facility required constant power for safety and security. Given the critical effects of a power outage, Maryland Department of Health requested that three (3) additional 150 KW generators be on hand for the infirmary, the activities building, and SETT Unit #4.

Agency Remarks (cont'd):

It was determined that a change in the new transformer was required to get the equipment working as intended, and the newly installed T-10 transformer was replaced at Dvorak's expense. Dvorak remained committed to rectifying this situation, and the temporary generators remained on site until early January 2025. On January 27, 2025, Dvorak submitted a Proposed Change Order in the amount of \$642,373.23 for additional costs Dvorak incurred due to the replacement of the transformer and the provision of temporary generators, fuel cells, fuel, load banks, fencing, and labor. DGS and Dvorak agreed to a negotiated amount of \$430,975.40 in June 2025. Change Order 14 for \$430,975.40, based on its value, requires BPW approval. However, during this negotiation and approval period, the contract expired on March 11, 2025. The project had reached substantial completion with only minor punch list items remaining. An extension until May 6, 2026, is required to complete necessary project close-out activities, which include processing this new sole-source contract and issuing the final payment to Dvorak. The work associated with this contract has already been completed and no additional work beyond what has already been performed is anticipated. A proactive term is required to allow for final payment, retainage release, and completion of close-out documentation.

DGS conducted a detailed review of Dvorak, LLC's Change Order #14 for \$430,975.40 and determined the price to be fair and reasonable. This determination is based on the following factors: Market-Competitive Equipment Rates: Dvorak's generator and equipment rental prices were compared to other companies and found to be within 5–10% of market averages, consistent with industry standards after adjusting for 24-hour operation and secure site conditions. Prevailing Wage Compliance: Labor rates match Maryland's prevailing wage requirements for electricians and laborers in Washington County and reflect reasonable hours for setup, monitoring, fuel management, and demobilization. Comparable Vendor Review: Pricing was benchmarked against GEMCO, Generac, and Thompson Power Systems for similar emergency power deployments. Dvorak's costs fall within the median market range, confirming no excessive premiums. Negotiated Cost Reductions: The original proposal of \$642,373.23 was reduced by 32.9% through DGS negotiations, removing duplicative and non-compensable costs. The final amount represents only verified and necessary expenses. Independent Validation: DGS staff verified quantities, rental durations, and fuel usage with site records and delivery documentation to confirm accuracy and legitimacy of billed costs.

Requesting Agency Remarks: DHCD advertised the solicitation on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage to 142 vendors on March 19, 2025, and held a pre-proposal conference on April 4, 2025, which representatives from a single vendor attended. The RFP closed on May 6, 2025. DHCD received a single proposal from the contract's incumbent, Atlantic Auctions, Inc.

Although response was limited, DHCD conducted an analysis to determine whether the pricing and terms offered were fair and reasonable. Market research included a review of national and regional buyer premium benchmarks, which generally range from 5% to 25% depending on asset class and auction format. Atlantic Auctions' proposed buyer's premium is lower than the price on DHCD's current contract for these services and well below the national average, which typically falls between 10%-20% for real estate. The single proposal DHCD received was deemed to meet all technical and financial requirements. Given Atlantic Auctions' satisfactory past performance and the lack of alternative submissions despite a wide solicitation effort, DHCD determined it to be in the best interest of the state to award the contract to Atlantic Auctions, Inc.

Requesting Agency Remarks: Maryland's horse racing industry generates significant economic activity, with Ocean Downs playing a key role in supporting jobs and revenue. This single bid procurement was conducted through a competitive process in accordance with State procurement regulations. The Invitation for Bids (IFB) was publicly advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on October 29, 2025, providing notice to 869 potential bidders. This solicitation is consistent with prior procurements for similar services, which have historically resulted in a single responsive bid due to the limited number of qualified vendors operating in this market. While 869 vendors are registered in eMaryland Marketplace Advantage under related commodity codes, only a small number possess the expertise and capacity required to perform the scope of work. The most recent procurement for this service also resulted in a single bid, despite not being designated as an SBR procurement. LABOR will continue to conduct market research and engage in targeted outreach to promote increased competition in future procurements.

The bid price of \$152,640 was reviewed and determined to be fair and reasonable, based on comparisons to historical pricing for veterinary services at Maryland harness racing facilities. The prior veterinary services contract for Ocean Downs Raceway was awarded in the amount of \$115,000, and the current pricing reflects increased service demands, regulatory requirements, and prevailing market conditions. In addition, Rosecroft Raceway procured comparable veterinary services at a contract value of \$147,600.00 for a similar scope of work and regulatory environment.

It is in the State's best interest to approve this contract in advance of the 2026 live harness racing season at Ocean Downs, which is scheduled to begin on May 18, 2026.

The Contract is to provide a license for the Maryland State Lottery & Gaming Control Agency (MLGCA) to use the the Baltimore Ravens marks and logos in its instant lottery games, advertising, and marketing, as well as, for the purchase of Baltimore Ravens ticket packages and experiential prizes to be utilized as part of MLGCA's instant ticket promotion. They include approximately six different second chance drawings associated with two scratch-off ticket games and one Fast Play game. These prizes include Baltimore Ravens season tickets, pre-game access to the sidelines, opportunities to participate in an on-field activity during home games, and a trip with the team to attend a Baltimore Ravens regular season NFL away game during each identified season (2026 and 2027).

The MLGCA anticipates producing one scratch-off ticket game using the Baltimore Ravens' NFL marks and logos that will have a quantity of 3,120,000 tickets, at a \$2.00 price point and a total retail face value of \$6,240,000; and a second game that will have a quantity of 3,120,000, at a \$10.00 price point and a total retail face value of \$31,200,000. These games need to be submitted for production by early April 2026 in order to have the tickets produced and available for distribution mid-summer 2026. This contract also allows the MLGCA to produce a terminal based instant ticket game known as Fast Play with the Baltimore Ravens' marks and logos.

The proposed contract is for the 2026 and 2027 NFL seasons. These seasons are the eighteenth and nineteenth consecutive years, respectively, that the MLGCA has produced instant ticket games using the Baltimore Ravens' logos and marks. In many of the previous years, the Baltimore Ravens instant ticket games are among the more popular and highest performing at their price point categories. The second chance prizes are also quite popular, as unique player entries into these contests are generally very significant.

By law, instant ticket game players have 182 days after an instant ticket game has closed-out to claim their prize. As such, the MLGCA must allow for that period to elapse before the Contract expires, but during which time no additional tickets are produced or sold. This Contract provides the MLGCA with the ability to produce the specified instant ticket games, procure associated experiential prizes, and use the Baltimore Ravens' logos and marks until December 31, 2028.

The MLGCA reviewed the overall prices and terms of other similar promotions it has done in the past that involved the licensing of proprietary properties and tickets or other exclusive prizes (e.g., Ravens, Powerball Power Cruise, Willie Wonka, Monopoly, The Price is Right, MGM, Royal Caribbean). The amount of this license contract compares favorably with those similar projects and was determined to be fair and reasonable.

Outsourcing the Medicaid Medicare Part B claims has significantly reduced the backlog of claims to be keyed, resulting in faster payment to the Medicaid providers. Requesting Agency Remarks: Since 1990, ICF has consulted with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) on Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS). During that same time, ICF has provided Computer-Assisted Telephone Interviewing (CATI) services for 25 state BRFSS programs and has completed over one million BRFSS interviews. ICF has worked with other large public health surveillance systems, including the Youth Risk Behavior Survey and the National Alcohol Survey, and has contracted with the State to provide CATI and other public health survey support.

The CDC funds each state to conduct BRFSS, which is a random telephone interview survey on chronic health conditions and related risk and proactive factors. BRFSS began in 1984 with 15 states, but now collects data in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, and three U.S. territories. Data is collected from over 400,000 adults each year. The longevity of the survey, reach of geographic areas, and number of interviews collected make BRFSS the largest continuously conducted health survey system in the world, according to the CDC.

Interviews are conducted by telephone (landline and cell phone) with randomly selected Maryland adults (ages 18 and older). Stratification methods are used to ensure sufficient sampling by age, gender, race/ethnicity, jurisdiction, and other demographics to ensure accurate and reliable data that can be used to identify and address health disparities.

Maryland has administered the BRFSS continuously since 1987. Maryland plans to complete up to 20,000 interviews per year over the next five calendar years. Like most states, Maryland contracts with a calling services contractor to provide CATI data collection. This includes CATI programming of the data collection system, staffing a call center, conducting telephone interviews, and processing data to be submitted to the CDC.

Data from Maryland BRFSS is used to inform the Department, Maryland universities, national, state, and local agencies, and others on the prevalence, course, and impact of conditions such as: Diabetes; Cardiovascular disease; Asthma; Cancer screening, diagnosis, and treatment; and Tobacco use. Risk and protective factors such as health care access, fruit/vegetable consumption, physical activity, and immunizations are also included. Emergent issues such as Zika and electronic smoking devices are also included in Maryland BRFSS.

In order to provide accurate data about health, BRFSS data must be collected proportionally throughout the year. Certain conditions, such as asthma, may worsen during months with high pollen; outdoor physical activity may be limited during winter months; cancer prevention activities such as sunscreen use may vary throughout the year, availability of fruit and vegetables may be lower in winter months, etc. Missing data collection for 1-3 (or more months) can skew the data. For example, prevalence of asthma may seem to be higher; physical activity may seem to be lower; sunscreen use may seem to be higher; fruit and vegetable consumption may be reported as higher than the true values, etc. Data may also be missed for emergent public health issues such as ecigarettes and vaping that have rapid increases and decreases. Incorrect data can lead to the selection and implementation of strategies that do not truly address population needs. Additionally, BRFSS data is collected in all months in all other states. CDC analysis methodology and data weighting relies on this consistency. Lack of Maryland data for several months could limit the ability to provide accurate data for Maryland and/or the country.

Through a review of the Department of Information Technology ANSWERS Financial Reporting, DGS identified that funds supporting the Blanket Purchase Order (BPO) were overdrawn by \$41,142,209.02. Although the State's Financial Management Information System (FMIS) reflected a positive balance of more than \$31,000,000, DGS-OSP was aware, based on a prior occurrence, of existing technical limitations within FMIS. As a result, ad hoc, manual ANSWERS reports have been used to supplement FMIS reporting. These more detailed ANSWERS reports revealed that the BPO had, in fact, been overdrawn.

DGS recognizes that retroactive contract actions are not desirable and has taken steps to strengthen oversight and financial controls. Monthly expenditure reviews have been reinforced by assigning a primary reviewer and a designated backup reviewer to ensure continuity and accountability. In addition, the monthly expenditure report will be distributed to senior management to further bolster oversight, continuity, and accountability. The contract will be closely monitored to ensure spending remains within approved limits, and future funding needs will be addressed proactively to avoid the need for retroactive requests.

Approval of this funding request is critical to maintaining uninterrupted statewide access to essential COTS products and services throughout the remaining term of the contract.

Recommendation: The Department of Human Services (DHS) is requesting approval to use the Expedited Procurement method as per the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 21.05.06.03.

Description: DHS requests approval to contract for a firm that can provide both uniformed armed and unarmed security guard services for our Baltimore City Department of Social Services (BCDSS) locations.

The request to use the Expedited Procurement method is driven by the necessity to immediately obtain more advanced guard services than available under the Statewide Guard Services contract to improve the safety and security of BCDSS staff, customers, to mitigate operational and compliance risks, and ensure DHS's facilities remain secure, supportive spaces for government employees and the citizens they serve. The current security guard services contract ends on June 30, 2026, and DHS will need two months to facilitate the transfer of services to a new firm. Therefore, due to the need for more advanced services and the time to procure and transition to a new firm for these services warrant the use of the Expedited Procurement method to ensure that a security guard service responsive to customer needs is in place by May 1, 2026.

BCDSS is housed in 13 buildings across eight locations across the city. There are 1,297 employees, and the agency presently manages more than 159,000 Family Investment Administration cases and has more than 4,000 child welfare clients.

The BCDSS security environment operates within the complex and demanding context of a large human services agency, serving a significant number of vulnerable citizens, including families in crisis and child welfare clients. This environment presents unique operational and security challenges that necessitate a highly specialized service model.

While our current security partner has provided service, the evolving and sensitive nature of BCDSS's operations requires a security guard service firm that is specifically aligned with our complex needs. Maintaining a consistent safety standard across all locations demands security personnel with specialized communication and advanced de-escalation training, which is a new focus for the agency, and a security partner whose organizational capabilities and personnel training are fully aligned with BCDSS's specific mandate to maintain a professional, supportive, and secure environment.

To enhance the safety and support provided to our staff and clients, BCDSS is actively incorporating principles of trauma-informed care into its security service requirements. This specialized operational context requires immediate and consistent response capabilities to high-stress situations, unauthorized entry, and disturbances, and a partner whose service model is equipped to deliver this new standard of care.

Pursuant to Maryland State Finance & Procurement Article (SFP) § 13-108 (d)(1), DHS' Procurement Officer with approval of the Agency Head has determined that this procurement should be expedited because: (1) urgent circumstances require prompt action; (2) an expedited procurement best serves the public interest; and (3) the need for the expedited procurement outweighs the benefits of making the procurement on the basis of competitive sealed bids or competitive sealed proposals. However, the Procurement Officer shall attempt to obtain as much competition as reasonably possible per SFP § 13- 108 (d)(2).

Requesting Agency Remarks: This software is proprietary and allows the Board of Pharmacy to maintain a record of licensed pharmacists, interns, pharmacy technicians, pharmacies, manufacturers, and distributors in the pharmaceutical industry. Personnel changes (retirements and new personnel) significantly delayed the solicitation of this contract. Due to the critical nature of this software, the Board of Pharmacy's functions and the continuing functions of pharmacies across the state uninterrupted use of the software and maintenance for this period was required despite the absence of a replacement contract. A price analysis was completed. The price was compared to historical pricing and current market conditions. The increase is reasonable and supports the continued delivery of the required services.

MDH regrets this retroactive contract and has already established a new contract covering the period of 2/1/2026 through 1/31/2027. MDH is working diligently to avoid future retroactive activities by improving tracking for current and expiring contracts, creating instructions and standard operating procedures for staff, and ensuring that all employees are aware of the location of applicable procurement templates moving forward.
