Recommendation: The Board of Public Works’ Wetlands Administrator recommends the Board:

- (1) Grant a wetlands license for a project involving horizontally directionally drilling under State tidal wetlands and installing a conduit with a telecommunication line; and
- (2) Assess annual compensation of \$875 to be deposited into the Maryland Department of the Environment’s Wetlands and Waterways Program Fund.

MDE: The Department of the Environment concurs with this recommendation.

Compensation: This license contains a recommendation that the Board assess compensation. The licensee seeks to horizontal directional drill a bore hole under 350 linear feet of the Pocomoke River and install a 4-inch conduit with a .75-inch telecommunication line. Compensation is due for the telecommunication line under the State’s tidal wetlands and the Wetlands Administrator recommends annual compensation of \$875 calculated as follows:

$$350 \text{ linear feet} \times \$2.50 \text{ per linear foot of tidal wetland impact} = \$875.00$$

***Wetlands License -- #23-0971 (R1) – Maryland Port Administration
Modification***

Recommendation: The Board of Public Works Wetlands Administrator recommends that the Board approve a modification to Tidal Wetlands License No. 23-0971 authorizing hydraulically or mechanically maintenance dredging ship berthing areas, transporting dredge material to disposal sites, performing offshore soil borings, and installing a temporary pipeline. This modification to the Hawkins Point Marine Terminal and Hawkins Point Staging Area portion of the license alters the following: the total dredged area on the west side of the pier increases from 20.0 acres to 21.8 acres, the total dredged area on the east side of the pier increases from 4.3 acres to 6.2 acres, and total dredge material to be transported from this site increases from 161,500 cubic yards to 210,000 cubic yards.

MDE: The Maryland Department of the Environment concurs with the recommendations.

Fifty-nine units will be restricted to households earning 60% and below area median income. The project is sponsored by the Howard County Housing Commission.

Five Phase 2 Technical Proposals were received, and Oral Presentations were conducted with the five firms. After the Oral Presentations and evaluating the Phase 2 Technical Proposals, the committee recommended Cooper Carry, Inc., with Lake Flato Architects as the most qualified firm. The fee was the result of a negotiated agreement. The A/E selection process, inclusive of the fee negotiations, was approved by the University's Executive Review Group, which includes a public member. The initial contract will be issued for the concept/program verification through schematic design phases and subsequently amended for the design development through post construction phases as funding becomes available. The award amount includes all phases of design.

Sustainability: The University has an ambitious goal of achieving USGBC certification of LEED Platinum and net zero energy consumption. The design principles guiding this effort will include optimizing energy performance, protecting and conserving water usage, reducing the environmental impact of construction materials, and enhancing the indoor environment. Environmentally sustainable materials and systems will be identified and explored vigorously throughout the design and into construction by the University and the design team.

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works declare as surplus property a State-owned building and associated land located at 55-59 E. Main Street, Frostburg, Maryland, consisting of approximately 0.23 acres and a structure containing approximately 10,807 square feet above grade (15,900 square feet total including basement).

Properties: 55-59 E. Main Street, Frostburg, MD

Grantor: State of Maryland for the University System of Maryland on behalf of its constituent institution, Frostburg State University

Background: Frostburg State University has determined that the subject property has no current or future institutional use. The building has been substantially gutted, and all major systems—including plumbing, electrical, HVAC, and mechanical infrastructure—have been removed. The structure is not habitable in its current condition and would require significant investment to restore or repurpose.

The University evaluated the property for potential institutional use; however, due to the extent of required renovations and associated costs, retention of the property is not feasible. The University intends to list the property for sale. If the University System of Maryland Board of Regents determines that a sale is advantageous, the University will return to the Board of Public Works for approval of the disposition.

State Clearinghouse: The Clearinghouse conducted an intergovernmental review of the project under MD20251202-0726. It is recommended that the property be declared surplus to the needs of the State. No State of local agency expressed interest in acquiring the property.

*Real Property Joint Venture***

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works approve the University of Maryland, College Park (the “University”) entering into a second phase joint venture (“Phase 2”) with an affiliate of St. John Properties, Inc. (“SJP”). Phase 2 mirrors the transaction structure previously approved by the Board of Public Works on July 27, 2016 (Item 5-RP), for development of the College Park Academy and flex research and development (R&D) space (two buildings with approximately 110,000 square feet). Phase 1 is currently fully leased. Acknowledging market demand, the proposed Phase 2 will add approximately 57,960 square feet of new R&D space.

Phase 2 Property: Approximately 6.4 acres of University-owned land located at the intersection of River Road and Rivertech Court in the University’s Discovery District, immediately adjacent to the future Purple Line Riverdale Park North—UMD Station.

Lessor: State of Maryland for the use of the University System of Maryland on behalf of its constituent institution, University of Maryland, College Park.

Lessee: A Maryland limited liability company joint venture comprised of the University and an affiliate of SJP (the “Company”).

Project Description: Phase 2 consists of the design, construction, and operation of approximately 57,960 square feet of additional R&D space located in two new buildings. The new R&D space is intended to support technology-oriented companies.

Terms: The Phase 2 transaction structure mirrors that of Phase 1. The University will contribute the property through a 99-year unsubordinated ground lease at nominal rent to the joint venture entity. SJP will provide all development capital and serve as developer and manager of the project. Net cash flow will be distributed equally between the University and SJP as members of the Company. The ground lease grants the Company the right to assign the ground lease—without further Board of Public Works approval—to an unrelated third party. Before doing so, SJP must provide the University with a right of first offer to purchase SJP’s interest in the Company.

Appraisals: The University obtained two independent appraisals of the Phase 2 property: Newmark Valuation & Advisory (\$8,300,000 as of March 31, 2026) and John R. Fowler, Inc. (\$7,505,000 as of March 27, 2026).

County and Local Process: The development application has been submitted to Prince George’s County under Mandatory Referral Case No. MR-2026-0005. No Planning Board hearing has yet been scheduled.

Fiscal Impact: The University’s financial return will consist of its 50% share of net cash flow generated by Phase 2. The projected net present value of the University’s cash flow from the Phase 2 development is \$8,474,840. This projected return exceeds the appraised value of the Phase 2 real property. The estimated cost to SJP to build Phase 2 is \$12,800,000. The ground lease will also make the Phase 2 Property taxable, providing *ad valorem* real property tax revenue to the state, county and municipality.

Requesting Institution Remarks: The Phase 2 development will expand the University’s Discovery District economic development strategy by leveraging private capital while retaining long-term University land ownership. Phase 2 responds to strong market demand demonstrated by the fully occupied Phase 1. Phase 2 also will advance the State’s Capital of Quantum Initiative. Its “first floor on slab” space is the gold standard for quantum infrastructure, a technology sensitive to vibration. The “flex” nature of the R&D product also preserves the option to locate transit-friendly retail opportunities near the new Purple Line station. As with Phase 1, there is risk to an equity investor deal structure not present in a traditional fixed rent lease. That being said, Phase 1 (on real estate originally valued at \$7.3 million) has already generated income to the University of \$7,355,417 bolstering confidence in this model.

Board of Regents Approval: The University System of Maryland Board of Regents approved the Phase 2 joint venture and ground lease on November 22, 2024.

This agreement provides the financially sustainable framework for cost recovery which generates sufficient cash flow to achieve the following goals while maintaining competitive costs for the Airlines:

- Fund MAA’s capital costs using a mix of PAYGO and bond financing.
- Address aging infrastructure, protect operational capacity, and keep the airfield in a state of good repair.
- Fund major maintenance to keep Airport assets in a state of good repair
- Provide ongoing annual capital funding for matches and small projects on-Airport.
- Achieve financial metrics to maintain or improve existing credit ratings.
- Maintain reasonable airline payments per enplaned passenger levels as compared to the competitive set of regional airports.

Recommendation:

1. To approve a new Standard Airline Use and Lease Agreement for signatory airlines (Attachment 1) at BWI Marshall Airport.
2. To provide delegated authority for the Maryland Aviation Administration (MAA) to make non-material changes to the contract provisions, such as modifications made to leased space and other changes, implemented from time to time in the normal course of business which do not materially impact the contract, be made without requesting further BPW approval. In the event material changes are made to the terms and conditions of this contract, MAA will present the resulting contract to the BPW for its approval.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The new Standard Airline Use and Lease Agreement establishes the methodology for calculating signatory airport standard rates and charges, designates leased space to the signatory airlines, and confirms the rights and responsibilities of the Airport and signatory airlines. This new Standard Airline Use and Lease Agreement replaces the following contracts, which were approved by the BPW on May 22, 2019, Item 9-GM, and will expire June 30, 2026.

The new Standard Airline Use and Lease Agreement reflects improved cost accounting and cost recoverability. Airlines cover the costs of facilities and services they use; therefore, MAA closely examined the cost allocations among airport cost centers to derive a more accurate representation of where costs are incurred.

The signatory airlines (Attachment 1) agreed to pre-approve certain capital projects totaling approximately \$1.1 billion, including the Air Traffic Control Tower, Baggage Handling System, and C/D Connector Program as well as various passenger terminal and airfield pavement improvements. These projects are subject to BPW approval.

The new Standard Airline Use and Lease Agreement establishes the non-signatory airline rate of 125% for landing fees, baggage fees, and space rent, and BWI Marshall Airport's Tenant Directive 401.1 establishes the non-signatory fees and charges pursuant to the 125% rate. This conforms with industry practice.

Since 1973 and consistent with industry practice, MAA has taken a Standard Airline Use and Agreements to the BPW. The agreements have had varying terms and commitments to ensure a financial framework sustainable for the Airport. This provides business continuity.

This type of revenue-producing contract at a transportation facility is outside the scope of the State Procurement Law (State Finance and Procurement Article §11-202(3); COMAR 21.01.03.03.B(1)(d). However, the contract and any modifications must be approved by the BPW because the contract constitutes a lease and use of State Property under State Finance and Procurement Article, §10-305.

Requesting Agency Remarks: This contract provides maintenance and support to Maryland Transit Administration’s (MTA) for its Transit Information Contact Center (TICC) and Mobility Operation Contact Center (MOCC) custom reporting and monitoring solution developed by GL Communications, Inc (GL). The scope of work includes software updates, equipment leasing, and technical support. This comprehensive IT solution consolidates call data from multiple systems into a single report, enabling real-time monitoring and performance analysis.

Requesting Agency Remarks (cont'd):

GL's reporting and monitoring system is a proprietary solution custom-built to integrate data from multiple legacy platforms, including the Voice over Internet Protocol Session Initiation Protocol (VoIP SIP) and T1 Primary Rate Interface (T1-PRI) analysis equipment, the Hi-Path 4000 switch, and the Interactive Voice Response (IVR) system.

The reporting and monitoring tool developed by GL is a custom-built solution that cannot be replicated or substituted with off-the-shelf products. No other vendor in the telecommunications test equipment industry offers a comparable solution that integrates data from the specific systems used by MTA. The tool is critical to the functioning of TICC and MOCC, providing both real-time alerts and consolidated reporting that support service reliability and customer satisfaction.

A lapse in this service would disrupt the real-time alerting and consolidated reporting functions that TICC and MOCC rely on to manage daily operations and maintain service reliability. TICC is essential to handling general transit inquiries, while MOCC schedules door-to-door paratransit services. The GL solution remains critical for maintaining service reliability, customer responsiveness, and operational efficiency.

Pricing was determined to be fair and reasonable based on GL Communications' historical pricing. The total contract value represents a 14.6% increase over the previous contract term. This increase is attributable to normal inflation over the five-year period and the addition of session initiation protocol/internet protocol (SIP/IP) monitoring services that were not included in earlier contracts. GL provided a quote showing approximately \$20,540 in software-related costs associated with enabling SIP monitoring. However, this only reflects software acquisition. The additional ongoing monitoring, integration, and support required for SIP functionality, combined with normal inflation since 2020, account for the 14.5% increase over the previous annual cost.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the MTA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) and Veteran-Owned Small Business Enterprise (VSBE) participation goals. No Small Business Reserve designation was made, as this is a sole source. No MBE or VSBE participation goals were established for this procurement, as it is a sole-source contract with a single element of work for maintenance and software. Therefore, it was determined that no subcontracting opportunities exist for this contract.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The MTA is requesting approval of this contract modification to support required upgrades to MARC's I-ETMS PTC system. Federal regulations (49 CFR § 229.136) mandate that passenger railroads maintain an operational and compliant PTC system. MARC operates on CSX and Amtrak territory, both of which require interoperability with the I-ETMS platform.

The additional authority will fund upgrades necessary to replace I-ETMS components and implement hardware and software updates for the 4G cellular modems which are reaching end of useful life and support. Rather than replacing the existing 4G equipment with a newer model, an upgrade to 5G modems will represent cost savings by avoiding the need for an additional equipment refresh in three to five years. The replacement components will improve Global Positioning System (GPS) signal in Washington DC and other poor GPS signal track areas adding to I-ETMS Emergency functionality.

Additionally, the system upgrades include updates of the Video Hardware PTC Event Recorder to maintain Federal Rail Administration (FRA) regulatory compliance per CFR § 229.136 and ensure continued operation of the PTC system. These improvements are essential to maintaining system reliability, interoperability with host railroads, and the safe operation of MARC service.

The PTC system evolves based on federal mandates and host-railroad requirements. These upgrades were not included in the original procurement because the obsolescence of specific I-ETMS technology components and the timing of required FRA-driven software updates could not be identified in advance. PTC system requirements are continually updated by the host railroads FRA, CSX, and Amtrak collectively to maintain interoperability and safety compliance, as a result these necessary changes were identified after the initial contract was executed.

The Procurement Review Group's evaluation determined that no subcontracting opportunities existed for this sole source contract, as it is a single element of work that can only be provided by Original Equipment Manufacturer Wabtec, which has proprietary rights to the drawings, parts, and software. Consequently, no MBE nor VSBE goal has been established for this procurement.

This Contract is to provide Cycles of Tractor Mowing, Trimming and Litter Pickup on MD 128, MD 129 and MD 130 in the Owings Mills Shop area in Baltimore County.

The single responsive bid of \$125,750.00 submitted by the Manuel Landscaping, Inc is justifiable and based on our analysis against the Engineer's Estimate. The Engineer's Estimate did reflect the average cost for this operation; however, after speaking to the contractor about their bid prices for items in Category 7 (7001, 7002, 7003, 7004 & 7005), it was determined that the Engineer's Estimate was not the true cost to perform this work by a contractor. However, the decreases were mainly due to the general understanding of the contractor's appreciation of the actual material and labor costs, and the nature and complexity of the contract scope of the contract.

An analysis of the major difference between the low bid and the Engineer's estimate was performed. There were five line items that were significant for variations from the Engineer's Estimates. These items had major individual cost overruns and combined totaled \$50,500.00; accounting for 40.16% of the total difference between the Engineer's Estimate and the low bid. This, however, did not have an overall impact on the bid price which was only 28.55% under the Engineer's Estimate.

Therefore, the prices submitted by contractor reflect a fair market value and are competitive for performing statewide traffic operations. SHA has determined the bid submitted by the contractor to be Fair and Reasonable.

This project is to support SHA's mowing program to promote safety for the travelling public by controlling undesirable brush and noxious weeds; and maintaining adequate sight distances and the free flow of water. The project benefits the environment by removing litter before it can enter waterways and natural habitats. Proper mowing and trimming promote healthy vegetation, control invasive species, and reduce soil erosion. Mulching grass clippings returns nutrients to the soil and minimizes waste. Efficient equipment use and regular maintenance help lower fuel consumption and reduce emissions, supporting overall environmental sustainability.

The State Highway Administration (SHA) has confirmed Manuel Landscaping, Inc.'s bid price and the work conducted on this contract will be performed 100% by a State-certified Small Business.

SHA then proceeded with award and execution of the contract to the next apparent responsive and responsible low bidder.

On February 16, 2026, the second low bidder requested withdrawal of its bid, citing inability to meet contract requirements and to schedule the required equipment inspection with SHA. On February 20, 2026, SHA rejected the second apparent low bid and determined the firm to be non-responsible in accordance with COMAR 21.06.01.01B(2). SHA subsequently proceeded with award and execution of the contract to the only responsive and responsible bidder.

The single responsive bid of \$280,940.00 submitted by Manual Landscaping Inc. is justified based on comparison with the Engineer's Estimate.

Manual Landscaping Inc. was contacted by District 4 staff and confirmed that it has the necessary equipment and personnel to complete the work. The contractor indicated that this work is labor-intensive and time-consuming, which contributed to higher pricing—particularly for items in Categories 7 (7001 and 7003). It was also determined that the Engineer's Estimate was based on historical contract data and does not reflect current market conditions for this type of work.

Manual Landscaping Inc. has successfully performed similar work for other districts and has previously held this contract, with satisfactory performance.

Based on this evaluation, the contractor's pricing reflects fair market value and is competitive for performing tractor median and roadside mowing, trimming, and litter pickup along various roadways west of I-83 in the Hereford Shop Area of Baltimore County. SHA has determined the bid to be fair and reasonable.

This project supports SHA's mowing program through median and roadside mowing, trimming, and litter removal to maintain safe sight distances and proper drainage. Work will be performed using targeted, environmentally responsible practices that minimize disturbance, control noxious

Requesting Agency Remarks: This solicitation was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on September 09, 2025, notifying 1,444 potential contractors, 28 of which were MDOT-certified Minority Business Enterprises (MBEs). The State Highway Administration (SHA) directly solicited seven vendors. Maryland Works granted a waiver for these services on February 12, 2025. SHA received a single bid and opened on October 09, 2025. There were no protests filed for this contract.

The search by SHA indicated a significant pool of small businesses available in this area. The search of the surrounding counties revealed 34 small businesses that could have bid on this contract. Thus, there was enough potential competition envisaged prior to bid opening. This Contract is to provide maintenance of traffic / protection vehicle services for Cecil County. The single bid of \$171,800.00 submitted by the Professional Facility Services, LLC is justifiable based on our analysis against the Engineer's Estimate.

The Engineer's Estimate did reflect the average cost for this operation; however, after speaking to the contractor about their bid prices for items in Categories 1 & 4 (1001, 1002, 1004, 1006, 1007, 4001, 4004, 4014, & 4005), it was determined that the Engineer's Estimate was a true cost to perform this work by a contractor. Since the contractor's bid was close to the Engineer's Estimate, SHA believes that the contractor has accurately understood the scope and complexity of the contract along with the associated material and labor costs involved.

An analysis of the major difference between the low bid and the Engineer's estimate was performed. There were eight line items that were significant for variations from the Engineer's Estimates. These items had major individual cost overruns and combined totaled \$17,172.50; accounting for 23.28% of the total difference between the Engineer's Estimate and the low bid. This, however, did not have an overall impact on the bid price which was only 2.85% under the Engineer's Estimate. Therefore, the prices submitted by contractor reflect a fair market value and are competitive for performing traffic operations. SHA has determined the bid submitted by the contractor to be Fair and Reasonable.

This project is to support State Highway Administration's protection vehicle program to promote safety for the travelling public by controlling work site accidents.

The State Highway Administration (SHA) has confirmed Professional Facility Services, LLC.'s bid price and the work conducted on this contract will be performed 100% by a State-certified Small Business.

Per BPW Advisory 2001-1, the SHA Procurement Review Group reviewed the contract scope of work to determine the potential for establishing MBE and VSBE participation goals, Small Business Preference, as well as a Small Business Reserve designation. A 10% MBE goal was set for this project based on the minimal number of MBE firms located within the geographical area of the work certified with the NAICS codes to perform the project activities.

The solicitation was publicly advertised on September 30, 2025, on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA), the State’s official procurement advertisement platform. In addition, 34 vendors were directly notified via email to promote vendor awareness and encourage participation. Proposals were opened on December 12, 2025.

Three proposals were received in response to the solicitation. Following the initial evaluation, one proposal was determined to be not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award due to limited experience supporting large-scale Advanced Traffic Management Systems comparable to the State’s CHART platform, and deficiencies in the technical approach and proposed staffing, which did not adequately demonstrate the offeror’s ability to successfully perform the contract requirements and resulted in a high risk of unsuccessful performance.

Sustainability features of the new facility are that it will achieve a minimum of LEED Silver certification or other certification programs allowed by the State of Maryland and Montgomery County. As good stewards, it is Montgomery College’s goal to furnish and maintain sustainable facilities, which are safe, reliable, life cycle cost effective, environmentally friendly, and resilient. The project scope includes a comprehensive and iterative analysis of building occupancy and programming, building envelope components and assemblies, and the building electrical, mechanical and plumbing systems. The College will assign an energy budget for the project. The budget figure will include all metered energy use at the facility, including energy for HVAC systems, lighting of the building and grounds, elevators, motors, water heating, and receptacles. The A/E is responsible for identifying cost-effective energy conservation strategies that will meet this Building Energy Budget.

The Comptroller of Maryland, Compliance Division, Unclaimed Property Unit, is responsible for the administration of the Maryland Uniform Disposition of Abandoned Property Act. The law is custodial in nature and requires that the Comptroller take possession of the unclaimed property and attempt to locate the rightful owners.

Stock certificates are classified as unclaimed when the owner has not claimed it or corresponded in writing with the business association concerning it within three years after the date prescribed for payment or delivery. At that time, the property was presumed abandoned. This results in a large number of small stocks that must be sold.

This contract creates a large number of transactions, but each transaction consists of only a few shares of stock to be sold. Most firms do not have the capacity to handle the research to determine if the company is still in existence and the stock is still being traded. Much time and effort can be invested in the research, to find out in the end that there is no market for the stock. This causes significant expense with no guaranteed payment of commission.

The price has been determined to be fair and reasonable. The vendor has kept the commission rate unchanged from 2021 to 2026. Given inflation, increased research workloads, higher trading volumes since 2021, maintaining a flat rate indicates cost competitiveness.

The HAF Program is scheduled to complete winding down by September 30, 2026. To comply with federal auditing requirements, DHCD must maintain license and support for Maryland HAF Program system in order to access the data housed within for five years following the conclusion of the HAF Program. DHCD explored the possibility of extracting the raw data from the system and utilizing state personnel to manually untangle it for use as needed, but ultimately determined that this was not in the best interest of the state due to the impracticability and expense of such a project.

HOTB is the developer and only vendor capable of providing maintenance and technical support to their software and they do not resell the software to third parties.

If DHCD were to generate its own system and maintain it in-house, it would likely need to dedicate one of its Database Administrators and/or System Administrators to the project full-time. The average salary of these classifications is \$130,000 - \$140,000 annually.

For building a custom portal and administering it internally, DHCD would additionally need to engage software developer contractors and estimated the cost of this to be approximately \$105,000 per year. The migration of the data from external to internal, mapping it and providing assistance in making sure the content is properly linked would require a consultant which would likely cost \$120 - \$150 per hour as an average industry rate for the contractor to help migrate, map data fields, and assist in developing an in-house portal that is comparable to the existing system. Migrating the system would incur many labor hours due to the complexity of recreating the portal. The annual cost to handle this internally would exceed the cost of maintaining it at the current location, and would provide additional strain on resources. DHCD finds the pricing to be fair and reasonable, as the salary of a System's Administrator alone would come to \$700,000 over five years.

Recommendation: The Comptroller of Maryland (COM) is requesting approval to use the Expedited Procurement method as per the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 21.05.06.03.

Contract Description: Consultant to perform a comprehensive assessment of heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) systems and prepare a detailed report of root causes of chronic HVAC system failures, provide recommendations for remediation, conduct cost analyses of potential solutions, and evaluate design, installation, operations, and maintenance issues contributing to system failures at the following 21st Century School facilities in Baltimore City:

- Arlington Elementary
- Arundel Elementary
- Govans Elementary
- Pimlico Elementary/Middle.

Background: The Fiscal Year 2027 Budget enacted by the Maryland General Assembly (Chapter 4 of the Acts of 2026) directs COM's Office of Policy, Public Works and Investment to perform a comprehensive assessment of heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) systems at the Baltimore City School facilities listed above.

HVAC system failures at these facilities over the past several school years have resulted in chronic classroom discomfort, ventilation issues, and emergency disruptions, raising immediate concerns for the health and safety of students and staff.

The intent of the study is to assess root causes of chronic HVAC system failures, provide recommendations for remediation, conduct cost analyses of potential solutions, and evaluate design, installation, operations, and maintenance issues contributing to system failures. The findings of COM's study must be submitted to the General Assembly by December 1, 2026.

Reason for Request: COM does not have the existing internal capacity or expertise to conduct this assessment and report on the findings by December 1, 2026. If COM were to pursue a standard competitive procurement timeline, the report could not be completed by the legislative deadline and further prolong unsafe and unstable environmental conditions in actively occupied school buildings.

Requesting Agency Remarks: Following the successful implementation of the Kaizen Laboratories, Inc. (Kaizen) digital access system at five Maryland State Parks, the DNR has determined it is in the best interest of the State to award a sole source revenue-sharing contract to maintain and expand the platform across additional DNR properties.

Last year, Kaizen was awarded a pilot contract after being ranked best overall in a competitive procurement. The pilot successfully integrated Kaizen’s proprietary platform and QR-scanning equipment programming with gate systems at five parks, significantly reducing wait times and improving traffic management for visitors and local residents. Following the successful pilot program conducted during the summer of 2025, the Department intends to expand the Kaizen digital reservation and entrance access system to additional State Parks. To ensure consistency and cohesion across the park system, a single platform using Kaizen’s proprietary software is required. This expansion will allow for real-time adjustments to park availability and messaging across all locations, building on the effective integration demonstrated during the initial pilot phase. The benefits of reduced traffic and stressors of unknown availability, realized by park visitors, park staff, and Maryland residents living along the roadways leading to the parks where the system was implemented, will be exponentially greater with the expansion of the all-inclusive integrated reservation service system.

DNR and Kaizen have agreed to a 23% transaction fee for daily access reservations. This pricing has been determined fair and reasonable, as the fees collected from Maryland residents are lower than those in neighboring state park systems and comparable to non-resident fees elsewhere. Due to the proprietary nature of the platform and configured equipment, no MBE or VSBE subcontracting opportunities were identified; therefore, no subcontracting participation has been applied to this contract.

Prior to the expiration of this contract and the new procurement starting, DNR will conduct market research to identify new innovations and other potential vendors with the capabilities to meet DNR’s specifications and requirements, as well as to review the procurement method to determine the most appropriate procurement method, and if a new competitive procurement is required.
