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**4. ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS
*Circuit Court Charges, Costs, and Fees***

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works approve the State Court Administrator's four proposed fee revisions to the *Schedule of Charges, Costs and Fees to be Charged by the Clerks of the Circuit Courts* ("the Fee Schedule").

Prior Approvals: Secretary's Agenda Item 24 (10/19/1994)
Secretary's Agenda, Item 8 (9/17/2014)
Secretary's Agenda, Item 2 (5/16/2018)
Secretary's Agenda, Item 1 (9/15/2021)

Authority: Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article, Section 7-202(a)(1)(i): "*The State Court Administrator shall determine the amount of all court costs and charges for the circuit courts of the counties with the approval of the Board of Public Works.*"

Proposal:

1. Section II.A.1(A) – Delete Subsection (1) a certified copy of a pleading giving rise to a lis pendens or a notice of lis pendens;
2. Section II.A.1(A) – Delete Subsection (2) a petition for writ of habeas corpus, except when filed by the Office of the Public Defender;
3. Section II.A.1 – Add Subsection (F) A clerk shall collect no fee for docketing a petition for emergency evaluation under Health-General Article, Section 10-622;
4. Section II.A.1 – Add Subsection (G) A clerk shall collect no fee for docketing a petition for assisted outpatient treatment under Health-General Article, Section 10-6A-04.

Remarks: The first proposed revision is offered to account for Rule changes mandated by the February 9, 2022 Rules Order of the Supreme Court of Maryland on the 209th Report and Supplement of the Standing Committee on Rules of Practice and Procedure, effective April 1, 2022. The revisions eliminated the filing of any lis pendens action in a civil case and requires that a lis pendens only be filed in the land records department of a clerk's office.

Amended Rule 12-102(b) indicates "[I]n an action to which the doctrine of lis pendens applies, the filing in the land records of a county in which real property that is the subject of the action is located of either (1) a certified copy of the complaint giving rise to lis pendens or (2) a Notice of Lis Pendens, substantially in the form approved by the State Court Administrator and posted on the Judiciary website, is constructive notice of the pending action as to the subject real property located in that county."

Remarks (continued):

The Fee Schedule, at Section II.A.1(A)(1), currently requires a circuit court clerk to include a filing fee amount of \$165 in costs assessed for filing a Notice of Lis Pendens complaint. Since Rule 12-102(b) was amended to only allow Notice of Lis Pendens be filed in the land records of a circuit court, and not as a civil complaint, Section II.A.1(A)(1) of the Fee Schedule is no longer needed. Fees for recording Notice of Lis Pendens are governed by Real Property § 3-601(a)(2)(i) and Courts and Judicial Proceedings § 13-604(a).

It is the State Court Administrator's first proposed recommendation that Section II.A.1(A)(1) be deleted from the Fee Schedule.

The second proposed revision is offered in response to confusion caused by Section II.A.1(A)(2) because it singles out habeas corpus cases, but not other, similar civil proceedings arising out of criminal cases – specifically post-conviction and coram nobis proceedings. It is unclear whether the singling out of habeas corpus can be read to imply that no fee should be charged for a post-conviction or coram nobis case. This confusion has resulted in varying treatment of the fee in different circuit courts.

Since habeas corpus, post-conviction, and coram nobis are civil proceedings, they are covered by Section II.A.1(A). Therefore, Section II.A.1(A)(2) is unnecessary.

Further, Section II.A.1(A)(2) notes that a habeas corpus petitioner is exempt from paying a filing fee if represented by the Public Defender. The Public Defender is already exempted from paying fees in cases. (See of the Courts & Judicial Proceedings Article § 7-202(b) and Rule 1-325). Thus, the Public Defender exemption in this section is unnecessary.

It is the State Court Administrator's second proposed recommendation that Section II.A.1(A)(2) be deleted from the Fee Schedule.

The third proposed revision is offered in response to questions raised following the enactment of Health-General Article, Section 10-6A-04 concerning filing fees under Health-General Article, Section 10-622.

In considering the State Court Administrator's recommendation regarding filing fees for petitions for assisted outpatient treatment under Health-General Article, Section 10-6A-04 (addressed below in proposed revision four), questions were raised regarding filing fees for petitions for emergency evaluations under Health-General Article, Section 10-622, which are not currently addressed in the Fee Schedule.

Both petitions for emergency evaluations under Health-General Article, Section 10-622 and petitions for assisted outpatient treatment under Health-General Article, § 10-6A-04 are intended to seek a court's assistance to maintain the health and safety of the respondent and/or community. Requiring a filing fee for these petitions may create a financial barrier that deters

self-represented litigants from seeking a court's assistance to maintain the health and safety of a respondent and/or community. Therefore, the State Court Administrator does not recommend charging a fee for these petitions.

It is the State Court Administrator's third proposed recommendation that the Fee Schedule be revised to preclude a clerk from collecting a fee for docketing a petition for an emergency evaluation under Health-General Article, Section 10-622.

The fourth proposed revision is offered in response to 2024 Maryland Laws Chapter 704 (Senate Bill 453) which established statutory authority for a civil court to order an individual to adhere to outpatient care.

The following is a summary of the relevant provisions of Chapter 704 of 2024.

Chapter 704:

1. Established a new civil case type under Health-General Article, Section 10-6A-05 which gives a civil court the authority to order an individual to adhere to outpatient care upon the filing of a petition for assisted outpatient treatment and a finding of clear and convincing evidence that assisted outpatient treatment is the least restrictive alternative appropriate to maintain the health and safety of the respondent.
2. Authorizes petitions for assisted outpatient treatment to be made under Health-General Article, Section 10-6A-04 by the director of a mental health program receiving State funding under Subtitle 9, Part 1 of the title, or by any individual at least 18 years old who has a legitimate interest in the welfare of the respondent.
3. Did not address the assessment or waiving of a filing fee for petitions for assisted outpatient treatment under Health-General Article, Section 10-6A-04.

Pursuant to Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article, Section 7-202(b), circuit court clerks are not authorized to impose filing fees on petitions filed by directors of mental health programs receiving state funding. However, the current Fee Schedule does not address court costs and charges for civil cases filed under Health-General Article, Section 10-6A-04 by individuals at least 18 years old who have a legitimate interest in the welfare of the respondent.

As indicated in proposed revision three, these petitions are intended to seek a court's assistance to maintain the health and safety of the respondent. Requiring a filing fee may create a financial barrier that deters self-represented litigants from seeking a court's assistance to maintain the health and safety of a respondent.

Modification

Recommendation: The Board of Public Works Wetlands Administrator recommends that the Board approve a modification to Tidal Wetlands License No. 23-0585 authorizing the construction of sand containment sills, stone edging, and riprap revetment, filling and grading with sand, planting marsh vegetation, and planting marsh vegetation. The purpose of this modification is to update the address for the proposed work, increase the number of sand containment sills to be constructed and the associated area to be filled and graded with sand, increase the marsh area to be created, and implement measures to safeguard nearby oyster leases.

MDE: The Maryland Department of the Environment concurs with the recommendations.

Remarks: The Weaver Building was originally constructed in 1889 and is currently occupied by the Maryland Department of Natural Resources. The last time extensive exterior repairs were performed were between 1984 and 1986 during major renovations to the facility when the MD DNR acquired the property. Over the 40 years since the previous renovations, regular aging and deterioration of the masonry joints and exterior surfaces have occurred that need to be repaired in order to prevent water infiltration/damage and the surfaces need to be cleaned to prevent deterioration of the historic stoneworks.

Remarks (continued):

An Invitation for Bids (IFB) was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on April 27, 2026, electronically notifying 968 potential vendors including 149 certified Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) firms and 42 Veteran-owned Small Business Enterprises (VSBE). Four bids were received and opened on June 03, 2026. One bid was withdrawn at the request of the bidder citing an error made during bid submission. Written request for the withdrawal was submitted to the Procurement Officer and subsequently approved by the Department of Natural Resources. Twelve electrical contractors were contacted about the project and four electrical contractors were determined qualified to do the work. One Electrical contractor submitted a bid with the other contractors declining due to insufficient bonding capacity, current workload and MBE requirements.

Remarks (continued):

Each GMP will have a separate goal based upon the availability of MDOT-certified firms. A total participation goal of 17.00% was established for the project which is expected to be met with all of the GMP's combined. GMP-A includes MBE firm participation 61.92% with a cumulative project total of 22.48%. To date, payments made to MBE firms is 0% because the work has not commenced.

The Campus Wide Electrical Upgrades will provide dedicated 34kv feeders from BGE Clifton Park Substation to a new central 34kv substation on the campus. The work includes a new Cold Spring Substation, upgrades to the existing Montebello Substation and a new high voltage Central Substation, including upgraded campus infrastructure to the buildings.

Climate/Sustainability: The power upgrade is needed to meet the power requirements of new facilities and to electrify HVAC systems in existing buildings to meet the Climate Solutions Act. This power upgrade will also provide more resiliency and redundancy for campus as we grow to an R1 Research Institution.

The University requests approval of the contract award amount of \$27,487,783, with a cash limitation of \$10,000,000 until future appropriations become available. The University will return to the Board of Public Works for approval of the remaining GMP A funds once the funds are appropriated and become available.

Remarks: This request is for the Board of Public Works to approve the full contract amount of GMP-G in the amount of \$224,900,972 with a cash limitation of \$95,000,000 and approve the cash expenditure of \$5,859,301 for the previously approved GMP-F Contract of \$30,859,301. GMP-G is the seventh of multiple GMP contracts issued for the construction of the New Science Center. Work in GMP-G includes, but not limited to, the construction of the interiors, mechanical, electrical, plumbing, fire protection systems and site improvements including all hardscaping and landscaping.

Five hundred sixty-one (561) bidders were solicited across the twenty-three (23) trade categories; however, the construction manager only performed scope reviews with the three (3) lowest and responsive bidders for each category.

On April 22, 2026, the Board of Public Works approved the GMP-F Contract in the amount of \$30,859,301 (Secretary's Agenda, Item 20) with a cash expenditure limitation of \$25,000,000 due to available funding at that time. The University is requesting approval of the remaining \$5,859,301 cash expenditure to fully fund the previously approved contract.

Remarks (continued):

Each GMP has a separate MBE participation goal based on the availability of MDOT-certified firms. A total project participation goal of 45.00% was established and was expected to be met with all of the GMPs combined. GMP-G includes MBE firm participation of 30.07% with a cumulative project total of 30.25%. To date, payments made to MBE firms are 18.63% of the total payments to date made to the prime firm, Barton Malow Builders/Warren-Builds. The construction manager in coordination with the University has conducted numerous MBE Outreach Events at the University and at off-site locations to encourage MBE participation.

The existing Science Complex is comprised of four buildings: Carnegie, Calloway, Spencer, and Key Halls. The oldest of these buildings (Carnegie Hall) was constructed in 1919 and the newest (Key Hall) in 1964. Spencer Hall was renovated in 1989, and the three other buildings were last renovated in 1992. The renovations were poorly done and created substandard spaces that do not meet modern-day building codes. The mechanical, electrical, and plumbing systems in the buildings are obsolete and need to be replaced. There is insufficient space in the Science Complex to appropriately serve the Biology and Chemistry departments due to growth in the science disciplines. In addition, the configuration of the building does not lend itself to the type of instructional and research spaces required to support the University's science programs.

The Morgan State University Office of Design & Construction Management will continue to manage the Construction Manager's work with procurement support from the University's Procurement Office.

Climate/Sustainability: This contract supports the requirements of BPW Advisory 2026-1, Climate and Sustainability Information, and the goals of the Climate Solutions Now Act (CSNA). As a new construction project, the facility is designed as a fully electrified building, utilizing electric boilers and high-efficiency building systems to reduce reliance on fossil fuels and associated greenhouse gas emissions. The project supports the State's goal of achieving net-zero greenhouse gas emissions by 2045 and 100% clean energy by 2035. The facility will also be connected to the University's dedicated 34kV BGE electrical distribution system, providing enhanced electrical resiliency and supporting the University's long-term electrification and sustainability goals.

Remarks: This contract is to provide counsel assisting in conducting an investigation of potential violations of the Consumer Protection Act and other Maryland consumer protection laws and, if violations are shown, providing representation, and litigation services to the Attorney General in connection with litigation brought by the Consumer Protection Division of the Attorney General's Office against a large online marketplace challenging its deceptive data collection and advertising practices, including any bankruptcy proceedings.

Background About the Investigation:

The Online Marketplace operates an app and a website that provides consumers access to a wide variety of discounted consumer goods, clothing, electronics, and home items shipped directly from third-party manufacturers and retailers.

The Consumer Protection Division enforces the Maryland Consumer Protection Act, Maryland Personal Information Act, Maryland Online Data Privacy Act, and various other Maryland consumer protection laws. It is alleged that the Online Marketplace deceptively markets the goods offered on its e-commerce marketplace, including deceptive statements about the quality of the goods and where they are manufactured. It is also alleged that the Online Manufacturer makes deceptive statements to consumers about how it collects and uses their data.

The Online Marketplace is already named as a defendant in attorney general consumer protection actions and private class actions in other jurisdictions. These lawsuits claim that the Online Marketplace is deceiving consumers concerning the manufacturing origin of products sold on its e-commerce platform and its data privacy practices.

The Consumer Protection Division has reason to believe the same practices that have been alleged in other lawsuits are impacting very large numbers of Maryland consumers. Under the Consumer Protection Act, the Consumer Protection Division can seek injunctive relief to stop the illegal practices, as well as monetary relief consisting of restitution, penalties and costs.

Assistant Counsel Contract:

The law firm listed above as the contractor was selected to serve as Assistant Counsel to the Attorney General, pursuant to State Government Article §6-105(b), to assist and advise the Office of the Attorney General in investigating and litigating a complex consumer protection matter. As required by the statute, the Attorney General sought prior approval from Governor Moore to procure the services of Assistant Counsel. Governor Moore approved the Attorney General's request by letter dated March 27, 2026. DiCello Levitt was selected to work with the Office of the Attorney General's Consumer Protection Division in this matter in a noncompetitive process due to its familiarity with the subject matter of the case, the depth of its experience in litigating complex technology and privacy cases and its experience working with other Attorneys General Offices.

Remarks: *Nature of Emergency:* The HVAC unit that services the D-Block housing wing of the Metropolitan Transition Center (MTC) has been in a state of failure since early May 2026. Multiple service requests have been submitted to repair the unit in that time. During the most recent service request, it was determined that the unit must be replaced. The Procurement Officer and End User initiated standard procurement procedures to procure a replacement HVAC unit. In the meantime, alternate cooling solutions such as fans and swamp coolers have been implemented to attempt to cool the affected area.

During the week of July 17th, heat dome conditions in the State of Maryland have created a health and safety concern for the incarcerated individuals (IIs) and staff at MTC. IIs cannot be safely housed in D-Block until the HVAC unit is replaced and climate control is restored. Until the unit is replaced there remains increased likelihood of heat related illness due to the lack of cooling and respiratory distress attributable to poor air quality due to lack of air flow and filtration. This sudden condition creates an immediate and serious need for services and materials that can no longer be met through the normal procurement methods.

Basis for Selection: Three vendors were solicited to submit bids to replace the HVAC unit and three quotes were received. Maryland Mechanical Systems, Inc. was selected as the awardee because they were available to respond timely, have completed similar work for the Department under similar conditions in the past, and they submitted the lowest responsive bid.

Requesting Institution Remarks (cont'd): The services provided include marketing, enrollment, student and faculty support, technology and instructional design, and related services. Revenue from new programs will be split evenly (50/50), while revenue from new students in existing online programs will be allocated 50–52.5% to the University and 47.5–50% to the Contractor.

Prior to issuing a Request for Proposals (RFP), the University hired BT Consulting Group to conduct market research on potential programs, market demand and labor force needs, and recommend a portfolio of online offerings to grow Bowie's online student enrollment. Based on the analysis, Bowie determined the need for an external vendor to support the creation and launch of online programs.

The solicitation was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) and was also directly solicited to all OPM providers. By the closing date, the University received three (3) proposals, even after extending the submission deadline. Two proposals were rejected for failing to meet the mandatory minimum requirements. The RFP required experience in higher education, which the University deemed essential to achieving enrollment outcomes. The firms without higher education experience also lacked experience delivering high-quality online programs as well as the capital, expertise and staffing to launch the full suite of programs the University plans to create.

The RFP included a 15% Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) participation requirement. Due to the highly specialized nature of the required services, the Contractor requested a waiver. The firm demonstrated a good faith effort by engaging multiple MBE vendors to assess their ability to provide the required services. None of these firms demonstrated the necessary expertise and the University granted the waiver.

As part of its proposal, Risepoint has committed to investing \$400,000 during the base term in the development of a Virtual Career Development Hub. Should the partnership be extended, the Contractor will contribute up to an additional \$200,000, bringing the total investment to \$600,000 over the life of the contract. This Hub will provide customizable career counseling, skill-building workshops, structured mentorship programs, virtual networking events, and professional development opportunities to enhance student success and support workforce growth in Maryland.

This is a revenue-sharing agreement, not a traditional cost contract. The University will incur no upfront costs to launch this initiative. Instead, initial expenses will be recovered from program-generated revenue, minimizing financial risk to the University. Over the five-year base term, the University is projected to earn more than \$29 million in net revenue, with the potential for additional earnings should renewal options be exercised.

The University prepared an independent cost estimate of \$49,195,460 for the delivery of academic program expansion across its colleges. The Offeror submitted a best and final offer of \$48,364,000, which is \$831,460 lower than the University's projection. The 1.7% variance between the University's estimate and the Contractor's pricing is primarily due to differences in enrollment assumptions, program bundling efficiencies, and revenue share adjustments.

This close alignment demonstrates that the Contractor's pricing is consistent with the University's expectations while providing measurable cost savings. Accordingly, the University determined the Contractor's pricing to be fair and reasonable.

Requesting Agency Remarks: This solicitation was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on December 10, 2025, and received by 621 firms. The MDTA directly solicited 302 prospective bidders. A single bid was received and opened on March 4, 2026. The MDTA reached out to prospective bidders to ascertain reasons for not bidding and received seven responses: five firms noted the subject of the solicitation is not something they ordinarily provide; one firm noted the project is more than they can handle administratively; and one firm noted the work is far from their jurisdiction and the type of work would render this to their economic disadvantage.

The bid amount was 9.64% over the Engineer's Estimate of \$5,067,350.00. The Procurement Officer has determined L.S. Lee's price to be fair and reasonable based on an analysis comparing the bid and Engineer's Estimate. As part of its review, MDTA considered the pricing of the individual bid items and identified higher prices for certain major items, particularly those associated with metal traffic barrier and crash attenuator work. These items can be subject to fluctuations in material costs, fabrication, transportation, labor, and supplier pricing. Based on current market conditions and the project-specific requirements, MDTA considers the pricing for these items to be balanced and reasonable.

This contract provides for repairs, upgrades, and replacement of w-beam traffic barriers and associated hardware on an as-needed basis through on-call services. The MDTA anticipates terminating the current contract when the Notice To Proceed (NTP) is issued for the new contract.

The Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) Goal established for this procurement was 5%, and L.S. Lee, Inc. has committed to meeting the 5% goal.

Requesting Agency Remarks: This project is one of three which will provide DMT with greater resiliency against weather events associated with climate change. The three projects are: the First Street Box Culvert, a box culvert 2,306' long by 5' high by 10' wide, with a storm water pump station and yard storm drain improvements; a Sea Curb, consisting of a 7,269' long, 2'8" high concrete sea wall around the perimeter of DMT; and Tidal Gates, consisting of the construction of 14 tidal gates at 14 existing outfalls at DMT. Combined, these improvements will reduce most of the marine terminal's ponding to 6" or less. These resiliency measures are intended to protect the terminal from a storm surge with wave action up to 10' above base level and from high intensity rainfall events. These projects are being funded with a combination of two federal grants and State funds.

During excavation for a pipe connecting to the culvert, the Contractor uncovered previously unknown existing utilities that were unknown at the time of project design and require the Contractor to offset piles at the 48" storm drain in the middle of the box culvert and at the 4" force main. As such, the Contractor is entitled to an equitable adjustment of \$235,280.30 to complete the work due to differing site conditions in accordance with Maryland Port Administration (MPA) General Provisions (GP) for Construction Contracts.

Additionally, the contractor provided an alternative means and method for phases 4 and 5 of the projects, proposing to utilize an open-cut excavation in lieu of the jack and bore method provided for in the contract drawings, providing \$1,441,480.00 cost savings to MPA.

The facility is undersized and cannot accommodate the existing facilities personnel or maintenance equipment. Facilities personnel currently share offices within the building or are housed in a separate modular building that has exceeded its expected lifespan. As part of the renewed outreach effort, the Procurement Officer directly solicited 241 firms, and a second Pre-Proposal Conference was held on February 25, 2026.

Although two firms initially expressed interest in submitting proposals, one firm withdrew on the proposal due date. As a result, only one responsive Technical Proposal was received. Despite extensive outreach, including direct solicitation of 241 firms and re-advertisement of the solicitation, the Department was unable to generate additional competition.

Although only one responsive Technical Proposal was received, the Procurement Officer conducted extensive outreach to maximize competition, including direct solicitation of 241 firms, removal of the Small Business Reserve designation, and re-advertisement of the solicitation. Despite these efforts, only one responsive proposal was received. The Department evaluated the proposed price through negotiations and determined it to be fair and reasonable based on the negotiated scope of services and current market conditions.

Requesting Agency Remarks: The solicitation for the Subject Project was advertised on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on January 20, 2026, with Technical Proposals due on March 6, 2026. The solicitation was designated as a Small Business Reserve (SBR) procurement. More than 1,000 certified small businesses were notified of the solicitation. Four proposals were received, of which three were deemed reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Requesting Agency Remarks: This is a request for retroactive approval of a voidable Sole Source Contract for the continuity of services for a contract originally approved by the Board of Public Works (DGS-6-AE, 7/19/2018) for which the contract term expired on 7/19/2019. Although the original estimated design duration was twelve (12) months, other reasons for extending the duration include issues obtaining the proper funding to meet the project's budgetary estimate, which required nearly one year to resolve . In addition, there were several unforeseen conditions, including extremely long lead times for electrical equipment due to the continued effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, and the job was constructed over a vast area, requiring a difficult, multilayered coordination effort that necessitated additional design to support ongoing construction.

The contract was initially issued as a Qualification Based Selection contract. Following fee negotiations, the contract was approved by the Board of Public Works on July 19, 2018. The contract expired before execution of all modifications to extend services; however, construction activities and associated A/E support needs continued during this period.

Additional design work is required to support upgrades to the MES wastewater treatment plant, and survey work is required to obtain an easement for the crossing of Brockbridge Road. This project is under construction, and approval of the contract extension would permit the State to continue the construction administration activities, resolve ongoing construction issues, complete the remaining design support services, and process associated A/E invoices. The duration of the requested contract extension is commensurate with the time required to close out the account.

Continuation of the current contract is necessary to avoid disruption to active construction, maintain continuity of design accountability, and ensure timely resolution of field conditions and construction-phase issues through the completion of construction and the two (2) year warranty period.

The A/E firm has continued providing services consistent with the original contract scope and associated modifications. The original contract had an MBE/VSBE participation goal of 30% / 0%. Compliance is at 38.22%.

Price Analysis: The consultant was awarded the underlying IQC contract through the Qualifications-Based Selection (QBS) process. Labor rates and pricing applicable to work orders were negotiated and established at the IQC contract level and were determined to be fair and reasonable. The proposed contract does not modify the original scope of services but provides additional time necessary to administer and complete warranty-related services. The additional compensation associated with this contract is based upon the consultant's existing negotiated IQC rates and the anticipated level of effort required through the warranty period. Given that the contract continues to utilize previously negotiated rates and is limited to services necessary to support the project through completion of the warranty period, the Procurement Officer determined the amount fair and reasonable in accordance with BPW Advisory 2016-1.

A total of 21 potential vendors were solicited and Fourteen (14) were directly solicited by the Department. Two proposals were received on March 11, 2026 and both were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. The Maryland Department of State Police (MDSP) intended to make up to four awards.

Due to the uncertainty in the number of cases for each FA, the Maryland Department of State Police–Forensic Sciences Division (MDSP-FSD) considered technical over financial as turnaround time or additional factors may be of essence. MDSP considered the contracting lab's scope of accreditation for each FA. Also, MDSP will consider the capacity each lab has to analyze cases from each Functional Area, and the turnaround time offered. MDSP will also need to consider the logistics for court testimony to ensure that a chemist will be available for court, if needed.

MDSP-FSD is an accredited, full service forensic laboratory system that receives over 14,000 cases per year for analysis. Approximately 80% require Controlled Dangerous Substance (CDS) or Toxicology (blood drug and/or blood alcohol) analysis. The CDS Units of the MDSP-FSD are responsible for performing analysis on submitted CDS evidence to identify the specific type of drug present. Although the MDSP-FSD operates under the administration of the Maryland Department of State Police, the laboratory is available to provide service to all 142 law enforcement agencies in Maryland. There are three CDS Units located in Pikesville, Hagerstown, and Berlin.

One proposal was received in response to the solicitation for FA II and FA III. The proposal was thoroughly reviewed by the Evaluation Committee and subsequently determined to be both responsive and responsible. The proposed pricing submitted by NMS was found to be fair and reasonable and within the Department's budget. Additionally, based on a recent quote provided by NMS to other government agencies, MDSP will receive a reduced rate of \$4 per test for FAII and \$5.00 per test for FAIII. MDSP will also receive a reduced hourly rate of \$68.00 for Expert Testimony services.

After careful evaluation, it is determined that both vendors (Chesapeake Toxicology Resources and National Medical Services) provide the best value for the State. MDSP believes that the technical proposals submitted clearly demonstrate the capability to complete services requested. The prices submitted are fair based on the quality of the technical proposal submitted and offers the state the best value.

This modification adds new system requirements for prior authorization file transfer, data reporting, and increased staffing to support compliance with The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) Interoperability and Prior Authorization Final Rule (CMS-0057-F). Additionally, the modification adjusts the estimated volume for multiple review types to reflect current activity. This work is within the scope of the contract as it does not alter the fundamental work the vendor does, but rather puts in place additional reporting requirements for existing work as well as instituting shorter turnaround times to complete this work. Given the final rule's compliance date of January 1, 2027, it is not feasible nor prudent to pursue a new procurement.

The Interoperability and Prior Authorization Final Rule (CMS-0057-F) establishes new federal requirements for prior authorization processing, including decision timeframes of seven (7) calendar days for standard requests and seventy-two (72) hours for expedited requests. These requirements apply to Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Plan of Service reviews performed under the Telligen contract.

The current contract structure indicates that the existing staffing model is insufficient to meet the federally required turnaround times required by the Interoperability Final Rule. At present, Plan of Service reviews are completed in an average of approximately eighteen (18) calendar days for standard requests and twelve (12) calendar days for expedited requests. These review timeframes significantly exceed the new federal requirements.

A review of current workload, review volume, and processing timelines determined that Telligen must substantially increase its clinical review capacity to achieve compliance with CMS-0057-F. Under the current model, Telligen utilizes fifteen (15) reviewers and one (1) supervisor to perform Plan of Service reviews. To meet the new federal standards, Telligen proposes adding nineteen (19) reviewers, one (1) additional supervisor, and one (1) support staff position dedicated to supporting the increased review workload and accelerated turnaround requirements.

The proposed rate adjustment for Plan of Service reviews reflects the operational resources necessary to support this expanded staffing model. The increase is not driven by a change in the scope of review activities, but rather by the additional personnel and operational capacity required to process a significantly higher volume of reviews within substantially reduced federal turnaround timeframes.

Without these additional resources, MDH faces a substantial risk of noncompliance with CMS-0057-F, including failure to meet federally mandated prior authorization processing requirements. Approval of the proposed modification will provide the operational capacity necessary to achieve compliance, maintain timely participant access to services, and support continued federal oversight requirements.

Based on the operational analysis conducted by MDH and Telligen, the proposed staffing model and associated rate adjustment are necessary to ensure compliance with federal requirements and continued effective administration of Maryland Medicaid utilization control activities.

Regarding MBE and VSBE participation, Telligen is currently achieving 23.67% of the 30% MBE goal and 0.08% of the 2% VSBE goal. Telligen has submitted separate corrective action plans addressing the shortfalls, including improved internal monitoring, increased coordination with its subcontractors, and prioritizing qualified MBE and VSBE subcontractors for positions added through this modification. The modification supports the established contractual participation goals of 30% MBE and 2% VSBE. The MDH Contract Monitor will review participation monthly and require Telligen to report its progress toward meeting the established goals.

It is commonly used by police, federal agencies, and task forces to turn massive volumes of raw digital data into meaningful insights quickly, helping investigators identify connections, patterns, relationships, and evidence that would be very time-consuming to find manually.

Looking at reviews of the two competing systems to Penlink, Penlink combines OSINT, digital forensics, evidence management, communications data, location data, and analytics. It can ingest things such as CDRs, tower dumps, RTTs, social-media warrant returns, tracking data, and mobile extractions. Shadow Dragon focuses on digital evidence across the internet and the dark web. Venntel on the other hand, focuses on geolocation. Instead of being competitors to Penlink, they are more like compliments to it. The pricing for this sole source contract is considered fair and reasonable as it is a 8% reduction in price compared to the previous contract for the system implementation and maintenance.

Agency Remarks: The Invitation for Bids (IFB) was published as Solicitation No. BPM054602 on eMaryland Marketplace Advantage (eMMA) on April 1, 2026, with a Small Business Reserve designation and a Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) participation goal of 30%. The contract term is three years, starting on October 1, 2026, with two 1-year renewal options.

Direct solicitation emails were sent to seven active SBR- and MBE-certified vendors that serve Anne Arundel County. Automated notifications were sent to 38 active SBR- and MBE-certified vendors through eMMA. Seventeen vendors attended the virtual pre-bid meeting held on April 8th. A site visit was held on April 9th with 19 vendors in attendance.

Three bids were rejected as non-responsive because they failed to complete pricing and/or did not submit bid documents as required. A fourth bid was rejected because it failed to respond to the cure letter sent by the Procurement Officer requesting the missing documents.

Diversified Services Group, Inc., is recommended for the award as the lowest responsive bid from a responsible bidder. The selected bid is fair and reasonable based on the price competition in this procurement and compared to the previous contract for these locations. Diversified Services Group, Inc. has confirmed its bid price and provided a breakdown of its hourly rates. DGS has confirmed the availability of funds.

The contract specifies environmentally preferable products and services in accordance with Green Purchasing Committee specifications.

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**27-EX. EXPEDITED PROCUREMENT REQUEST
*Department of Education***

Recommendation: The Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) is requesting approval to use the Expedited Procurement method as per the Code of Maryland Regulations (COMAR) 21.05.06.03 for the re-solicitation of the Early Learning Information System (ELIS), which is the primary platform for capturing, managing, reporting, and storing child care licensing inspection data. ELIS also supports the Child Care Information System (CCIS) used by MSDE staff and the CheckCCMD public portal, which provides public access to child care center inspection findings.

Description: MSDE utilizes ELIS to support statewide administration of the Child Care licensing and inspection program to ensure children in the care of licensed childcare centers are cared for in a safe and healthy environment. The current ELIS contract was established through a sole source justification executed on a retroactive basis. This contract has been extended multiple times due to the ongoing need for the platform and associated data, with the most recent extension approved through February 5, 2027 with two three-month renewal options. However MSDE has determined there is not a durable or ongoing basis for continued sole source provision of these services because it believes that more than one vendor can offer services that meet MSDE's needs. MSDE has determined that the ELIS requirement is properly suited to full and open competitive procurement and must be re-solicited to ensure the Department's compliance with COMAR Title 21 and to ensure the State is receiving the benefit of competition and receiving the maximum benefit of the purchasing power of the State through such competition.

ELIS supports functions that are time-sensitive and statutorily required, including provider licensing and inspection, and any lapse or disruption in system continuity would directly impact the State's ability to administer these functions without interruption. Development and issuance of a standard competitive solicitation requires substantial lead time for requirements scoping, drafting, agency and Office of the Attorney General (OAG) review, advertisement, evaluation, award, and time to transition to a new system, if applicable. The current contract term approved by BPW will not provide the time necessary to utilize standard procurement processes, as well as transition from the incumbent to a new contractor, if a new contractor is selected. Given the need of transitioning ELIS to a properly competed contract vehicle without disruption to ongoing program operations, MSDE has determined that a standard procurement timeline poses an unacceptable risk of a service gap affecting the critical programs.

Given the need to a competitively awarded a contract for this critical system before the current contract ends on February 5, 2027 to avoid any lapse in service or access to critical data, MSDE has determined that an expedited re-solicitation is necessary to protect continuity of operations for Maryland's early childhood programs and is in the State's best interests. MSDE respectfully requests your approval to use the Expedited Procurement method as per COMAR 21.05.06.03, as it is imperative to maintain uninterrupted administration of the Child Care Scholarship Program and related statutory functions.

Pursuant to Maryland State Finance & Procurement Article (SFP) § 13-108 (d)(1), MSDE's Procurement Officer, with approval of the Agency Head, has determined that this procurement should be expedited because: (1) urgent circumstances require prompt action; (2) an expedited procurement best serves the public interest; and (3) the need for the expedited procurement outweighs the benefits of making the procurement on the basis of competitive sealed bids or competitive sealed proposals. However, the procurement officer shall attempt to obtain as much competition as reasonably possible per SFP § 13-108 (d)(2).
