In seeking approval of the Board of Public Works for award of a contract under a specific appropriation under this Act, the using department or agency shall formally advise the Board of Public Works that efforts have been made through proper administative procedures to obtain such federal funds, and the reason, if any, why federal funds were not obtained. Availability of federal funds where allocated is intended to defray the cost of the approved project, not expand its scope, except in the case of projects for State parks and recreation areas of the Department of Natural Resources. These latter projects may be expanded in scope beyond that proposed in the specific appropriation in this Act if the addition of Federal funds makes this possible, but not beyond the total park acreage or area to which it applies, as evident from the master plan for State parks and recreation areas adopted by the Department of Natural Resources."

4. BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS - WETLANDS LICENSES:

Submission of a report by Trident Engineering Associates, Inc. to the Board of Public Works, dated December 27, 1984, covering the inspection of the Steuart Petroleum Company pipeline crossings on the Wicomico River and Swanson Creek.

The Board of Public Works, at its meeting on December 5, 1973, charged Trident with conducting regular inspections of the Steuart Petroleum Company's pipeline crossings on the Wicomico River and Swanson Creek. These pipeline crossings are in the line supplying fuel oil from Steuart's Piney Point depot to the Morgantown and Chalk Point electric power generating plants of the Potomac Electric Power Company.

The pipeline is now the property of the Potomac Electric Power Company. Steuart operates and maintains the line.

This report covers the result of the inspection conducted on December 8, 1984 which was successfully completed. Conditions at the four value stations, which are located one on each side of the two river crossings, were checked and tested. These tests prove the ability of the crossing segments and their isolation valves to retain pressures to 350 PSI. This is five times the normal operating pressure of the line. The valves, installed for the purpose of isolating the crossing in the event of a leak in the wetland segments, have been and should continue to be capable of performing their job.

7. BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF STATE UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES: LEASE-LEASEBACK PROPOSAL-SALISBURY STATE COLLEGE)

Resubmission of a request by the Board of Trustees of State Universities and Colleges for preliminary approval by the Board of Public Works of its proposal to utilize the lease-leaseback process for acquisition of two projects at Salisbury State College: (1) a 300 bed dormitory; and (2) a student union. This proposal is submitted in accordance with the "Interim Procedures for Sale-Leaseback and Lease-Leaseback Transactions". Since Chapter 368 provides that funds expended prior to June 1, 1984 may be used as matching funds, Cecil County has satisfied the matching fund requirement of the statute.

By its action of October 10, 1984, the Board of Public Works approved the transfer of \$95,000.00 from the Capital Improvement Retainage Fund to the Cecil County Detention Center/Sheriff's Office Loan of 1984.



BACKGROUND

The Solid Waste Facilities Loan of 1983 authorized the creation of a State Debt of \$4,000,000 to be used to provide State grants or loans to assist in the acquisition, design (including project feasibility studies), construction, equipping, and improvement of certain facilities or systems for the collection, transportation, reduction, processing, reprocessing, recycling, separation, and disposal of solid wastes.

MES is authorized to solicit and review applications for grants and loans under this loan act, and to annually prepare (in consultation with the Departments of Health and Mental Hygiene and State Planning) and submit to the Board of Public Works a statement of priority projects to be funded during the ensuing calendar year.

High funding priorities were granted for facilities serving statewide or regional needs, and for facilities subject to corrective orders issued by the Secretary of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene. Priority was also given to systems or facilities which implement alternatives to landfilling of solid wastes.

Financial assistance may be provided for facilities of the Maryland Environmental Service, and municipalities (as defined in the Natural Resources Article of the Code.) Grants or loans may not exceed 87 1/2 percent of eligible costs, with an individual applicant award limit of \$1,000,000; awards for feasibility studies may not exceed 50 percent of eligible costs. Loans must carry the same interest rate as the bonds issued under this loan act, and the loan term cannot exceed the life of the facility. All facilities receiving assistance must be included in the municipalities solid waste plan.

Submission of a request by the Maryland Environmental Service (MES) of the Department of Natural Resources for approval of a \$1,000,000 reimbursable grant under the Solid Waste Facilities Loan of 1983 for the implementation of the Harford County Solid Waste Management System.

BACKGROUND

The Solid Waste Facilities Loan of 1983 authorized the Board of Public Works to grant or loan up to \$4,000,000 for the development and implementation of solid waste disposal facilities. No single project can receive more than 25% or \$1,000,000. The Harford County Solid Waste Management System (System) will include the construction and operation of a waste-to-energy facility at Aberdeen, and the acquisition and construction of a centrally located residue disposal landfill. The Scarboro Central Landfill has been granted high funding priority status by the Board in its recently approved Statement of Priority Projects for Calendar Year 1985.

Financial assistance in the amount of a \$1,000,000 reimbur sable grant is required to make the System economically viable, and competitive with conventional landfilling. The capital intensive nature of the System, together with weak energy prices in the current market make the System more expensive for Harford County to implement than a conventional disposal system.

The \$1,000,000 reimbursable grant will be a necessary part of the projected \$20,000,000 total System cost. Harford County has committed over \$1,500,000 for development of the residue disposal site. A competitively procured, experienced resource recovery firm will contribute approximately \$4,300,000 to the project. The balance of System costs will be funded by Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority revenue bonds. To date, Harford County and the Northeast Authority have expended over \$1,000,000 to develop the System.

The development stage of this project is now nearing completion. Construction is scheduled to begin this fiscal year. The System will provide a long-term, environmentally sound solution to Harford County's solid waste disposal needs. It is projected that the refuse derived fuel generated by the System will save over 3 1/2 million gallons of fuel oil per year.

The Baltimore City Solid Waste Program (Program) will include the operation of the new Southwest Incinerator waste-to-energy facility, and the acquisition and construction of a solid waste disposal site at Hawkins Point. The Hawkins Point City Landfill has been granted high funding priority status by the Board in its recently-approved Statement of Priority Projects for Calendar Year 1985.

Baltimore City has recently completed negotiations for the acquistion of a parcel of property for solid waste disposal in Hawkins Point from the W.R. Grace Company. The acquisition cost will be \$9,025,000. A \$7,100,000 deposit has been placed with the courts for condemnation proceedings; the City seeks a \$1,000,000 reimbursable grant to assist in meeting the negotiated price.

The development of a solid waste landfill facility on this site is an integral part of Baltimore City's long-range Solid Waste Program. This landfill will provide capacity for the residue from the Southwest Incinerator as well as for non-combustible solid waste. In addition, the site is large enough to accommodate any unforeseen need to dispose of solid wastes should problems arise at the local incinerators.

Reimbursement will be paid to the State upon the sale of all or portions of the solid waste landfill site back to W.R. Grace Company under a right of first refusal. All sale proceeds derived from the sale of this property shall be first used to reimburse the State.

Submission of a request by the Maryland Environmental Service (MES) of the Department of Natural Resources, for approval of a reimbursable grant under the Solid Waste Facilities Loan of 1983 for a test burn of refuse derived fuel (RDF) at the PEPCO Dickerson Power Plant in Montgomery County to verify the possible use of such a full scale system to handle the majority of Montgomery County solid waste upon the expiration of the current county landfill.

BACKGROUND

The Solid Waste Facilities Loan of 1983 authorized the Board of Public Works to grant or loan up to an aggregate total of \$4,000,000 for the development and implementation of solid waste disposal facilities. No single project can receive more than 25% or \$1,000,000. The Dickerson Test Burn will cost between 1.7 and 2.0 million dollars, depending upon the length of the test. The necessary funds, in addition to the moneys requested from the loan act, are being contributed by Montgomery County, PEPCO, and National Ecology, Inc. This project has been granted high funding priority status by the Board in its recently-approved Statement of Priority Projects for Calendar Year 1985.

The initial interest in a test burn of RDF at the Dickerson Power Plant came from Montgomery County. The County is currently studying its options for solid waste disposal after the completion of the Oaks Landfill sometime in 1990. The use of trash as fuel in a "resource recovery" project is rapidly becoming a proven technology in the United States. In the past, the County has studied a mass burn facility such as that now beginning operations in Baltimore City. The use of RDF as a supplemental fuel in an existing electric power plant is currently being very successfully demonstrated at the Baltimore County Resource Recovery Facility owned and operated jointly by the Maryland Environmental Service and Baltimore County.

RDF from the Baltimore Facility is burned at the Crane Generating Station of the Baltimore Gas and Electric Company. In a public announcement last year, BG&E estimated potential fuel savings to its customers over the next ten years of approximately \$3 to \$5,000,000 due to the use of RDF. At the same time, the purchase of RDF by BG&E results in a significant reduction in the overall cost per ton of the solid waste disposal system.

An additional benefit of an RDF solid waste disposal system is a dramatic decrease in the amount of landfill requirements for a county. For each 100 tons of solid waste, approximately 70 tons is converted to RDF, 10 tons of glass and ferrous materials are recovered for sale, and the remaining 20 tons of waste is effectively compacted to half of its volume. Consequently, an RDF disposal system results in a 90% reduction in landfill requirements. In the case of the current Montgomery County Landfill, if an RDF disposal system could be implemented in the County prior to the 1990 completion date of the landfill, then the landfill may serve as the only necessary landfill for the County up through the year 2000. This reduction in landfill space or, for Montgomery County, the possibility of avoiding the need for a new landfill for a significant period of time, has obvious economic as well as environmental benefits.

Although the Baltimore County RDF system is working well, all parties agree that a test burn is necessary at the Dickerson Plant due to a basic difference in the type of boiler involved. The Crane Generating Station uses a cyclone furnace, whereas the Dickerson Plant employs a tangentially fired boiler. The critical issues for any power company exploring the use of RDF at an existing facility are (1) the percent of RDF which can be mixed with coal, (2) the operational impacts on the plant as a result of the RDF, such as increased ash or differing boiler characteristics, and (3) possible changes in the air emissions of the facility. For these reasons, BG&E performed a test burn at the Crane Generating Station prior to making any long-term commitment for the burning of RDF. Likewise, the test at Dickerson will be set up to measure all the critical parameters as a result of the RDF burn.

Montgomery County has committed in the test burn contract to reimburse the \$500,000 grant requested for the test burn from the proceeds of any borrowing incurred by the County to implement a full-scale RDF disposal system.

BACKGROUND

The Solid Waste Facilities Loan of 1983 authorized the Board of Public Works to grant or loan up to \$4,000,000 for the development and implementation of solid waste disposal facilities. No single project can receive more than 25% or \$1,000,000. The Smith Island Incinerator will alleviate a serious solid waste disposal problem for that community. This project has been granted high funding priority status by the Board in its recently-approved Statement of Priority Projects for Calendar Year 1985.

Somerset County plans to purchase and install an incinerator on property owned by the Somerset County Sanitary Commission between Rhodes Point and Ewell, Smith Island. The incinerator would also serve Tylerton, Smith Island.

Total Costs for the project will be approximately \$155,000, and will include the purchase of a solid waste incinerator, a metal building and concrete pad, ash disposal equipment, and other associated costs. This grant will represent $87\ 1/2\%$ of all eligible project cost, as provided in the loan act.

Somerset County needs to establish an acceptable means of disposing of solid waste on Smith Island and eliminate the existing unsightly dump located within wetlands. A ninety-nine year lease has been secured from the Somerset County Sanitary Commission as a site for the incinerator on the land adjacent to the Island sewer plant. The County plans to purchase an 11.9 acre parcel adjacent to the Sanitary Commission property to be used for ash disposal.

Chapter 564 of the Laws of 1983 authorized the creation of a State debt in the amount of \$1,500,000.00 to be used for the renovation, construction and equipping of laboratory and teaching facilities for the Whiting School of Engineering at the Johns Hopkins University, subject to the requirement that the Johns Hopkins University provide at least an equal and matching fund for the same purpose. No part of the applicant's matching fund may be provided from State funds either directly or indirectly, in whole or in part. No part of the applicant's matching fund may consist of real property or in kind contributions.

The President of the Johns Hopkins University has certified in a letter dated January 3, 1985, but delivered to the Board Secretary on January 16, that the University has committed matching funds in support of this project as required and that these funds will be provided from a combination of private gifts and U.S. Government grants.

In addition to the certification, the Johns Hopkins University has also submitted a Board of Public Works Capital Project Grant Application for approval. The projected cash flow is included in the grant application.

Approval by the Board of Public Works of each of each of these documents will allow the authorization of \$1,500,000.00 to be encumbered.

No State funds will be disbursed until after such time as the loan recipient has presented suitable evidence to the Comptroller that it has expended its portion of the required matching funds for this project. B) Submission of a request by the President of the Johns Hopkins University that a portion of the funds due to the University, as authorized by Chapter 564, be provided from the Capital Improvements Retainage Fund until such time as the balance of funds would become available through the sale of bonds.

The University, by means of the Capital Project Grant Application, has advised that the project commenced in October of 1983 and is expected to be completed in July of 1985 at a total cost of \$4,000,000.00. Johns Hopkins has incurred project expenditures of approximately \$2,846,000.00 through December 31, 1984.

Since Johns Hopkins anticipates requesting reimbursement from the State beginning in February of 1985 and since no bonds for this project have been sold, the request for the use of the Capital Improvements Retainage Fund is being made.

After due process, discussion between local representatives and the staff of the Interagency Committee, and evaluation, the Interagency Committee recommends to the Board of Public Works the State School Construction Program for the Fiscal Year 1986. Generally, the recommended program responds to the local top priority requests on the basis of their being (1) construction projects which can be realistically expected to be brought to bid prior to April 1986, (2) equipment for those projects now under construction, and (3) projects which are in compliance with the evaluation criteria for assessing the need of projects. The program also includes seven (7) new projects for planning which the Committee has recommended, with all design costs to be paid by the LEA as required by the Rules, Regulations, and Procedures for the Administration of the School Construction Program.







The Board is requested to approve an extension of the sales agreement whereby land on the campus of the University of Maryland at Baltimore, and the Fayette Street Parking Garage sited on the land, was deeded to the Veterans Administration of the United States for the purchase price of \$4.500.000.

The sales agreement, that was effective February 20, 1980, provided that the land and structure would revert to the University of Maryland if construction of a Veterans Administration hospital should not commence on the property within five years. The sales agreement was approved by the Board of Public Works and executed by the members of the Board of Public Works on February 14, 1980.

A Deed of Amendment has been prepared by the Veterans Administration that would extend the agreement to February 20, 1990. The deed has been executed by the Chairman of the Board of Regents of the University of Maryland. The deed has been reviewed for legal sufficiency.

Dear Governor Hughes:

At your January 30th meeting of the State Board of Public Works, you will have before you approval of a Memorandum of Understanding between Montgomery County and the City of Gaithersburg that provides for Montgomery County a solution to a serious need, namely, the temporary storage of abandoned cars. As the result of extensive cooperation with the City of Gaithersburg, we have worked out an arrangement under which Montgomery County would obtain access to ten acres of property owned by the City for the temporary storage of cars. In exchange, Montgomery County would turn over to the City use of our old Gaithersburg Library site which will provide an excellent recreation opportunity for City residents. The matter comes before you because the ten acres the City wishes to make available to Montgomery County are covered by a covenant under which State Board of Public Works approval is required for any use made of that site.

It is my understanding that you have identified, after a site visit by two of your members, and informal discussion, the conditions under which you would approve this use by Montgomery County. I understand further that you have been supplied with all materials you have requested.

I would like you to know my full support for this intergovernmental agreement. It will serve important public service needs for both jurisdictions. In particular, I am pleased that this site we have agreed to for the temporary storage of cars is already heavily screened from public view and our planned addition of fencing and trees will further benefit the surrounding area.

The reverter language as recorded by the Applicant is considered a prior encumbrance against the title which is unacceptable to the B. F. Saul Company, Inc., which will become the new mortgagee. Execution of the Subordination Agreement by the Board will permit the Rock Creek Foundation for Mental Health, Inc. (Applicant) to proceed with its new mortgage.

On September 16, 1972, State of Maryland, Department of General Services entered into an Architect/Engineer Agreement with Nes, Campbell and Partners, Inc. for design-related services for the construction of the ten-building complex now known as the Potomac Center in Hagerstown. Nes, Campbell retained Century Engineering, Inc. for all mechanical engineering and structural engineering services. On May 13, 1976, the State of Maryland entered into a Construction Agreement with Thomas P. Harkins, Inc. to build the complex.

In 1978, the Department of General Services building inspector first noted heating problems in some of the constructed but unoccupied buildings. Nes, Campbell prepared a report, and, on that basis, some changes were made to the insulation seal of the buildings by Harkins at no cost to the State. In 1979, the heating problems reoccurred, some of the residents had to be evacuated, temporary repairs were made and further investigations were conducted by Nes, Campbell and Century. Based upon these reports and investigations, vestibules were added and additional insulation was blown into a number of the buildings in the complex. However, in mid-1979, a DGS engineer discovered design errors and recommended major changes to the heating systems for the buildings. These changes were subsequently made. In addition, an engineering survey was commissioned by DGS which ultimately confirmed engineering design error. In 1981, the State of Maryland sued Nes, Campbell and Century for breach of contract and negligent design. The State alleged \$800,000 in damages. Nes, Campbell and Century both sued Harkins alleging construction error. In August 1984, the State of Maryland amended its Complaint and added a cause of action for alleged error in the building envelope design and a cause of action for negligent misrepresentation in the conduct of Nes, Campbell's investigation of the heating problems. The case is presently scheduled for trial beginning on February 4, 1985 in Washington County Circuit Court in Hagerstown.




