On items where payments are to be made from proceeds of the above listed bond issues, full regard is given to the provisions of each Act and its prospective amendments.

Except as otherwise provided in these Acts, before the State agency or institution responsible for an individual item may begin work with funds secured under the Act, the agency or institution shall provide satisfactory assurances to the Board of Public Works that the work described in the individual items can be completed with the funds specified for that item.

If federal funds are available to help accomplish any project identified in these Acts, the State agency or institution responsible for the project shall make efforts through proper administrative procedures to obtain these federal funds. Before spending any funds secured under these Acts, the agency or institution shall certify its efforts to the Board of Public Works and state the reason for any failure to obtain federal funds. If federal funds are obtained, they shall be used to defray the costs of the project described in these Acts, not to expand its scope, except in the case of projects for State parks and recreation areas of the Department of Natural Resources funded from the proceeds of the General Construction Loans of 1973 through 1980. These latter projects may be expanded in scope beyond that proposed in the specific appropriation in these Acts if the addition of Federal funds makes this possible, but not beyond the total park acreage or area to which it applies, as evident from the master plan for State parks and recreation are as adopted by the Department of Natural Resources.

REMARKS

The contract time will reduced by ninety-eight (98) calendar days. The previous completion date of August 12, 1999 will be revised to May 7, 1999.

This Change Order is necessary for the Using Agency to receive a credit for work the General Contractor deleted from the contract scope of work. The contract drawings indicate the use of continuous welds for the attachment of the steel baffle plates to both sides of steel support angles. The General Contractor omitted the continuous welds in the shop drawings, and they were replaced with 2" stitch welds, one foot on center. This change allows water to enter the void between the steel baffle plate and its support angle thereby causing rusting to exist. In order to eliminate this problem, caulking was used in lieu of the weld to seal this void.

A Unilateral Change Order is being issued due to the contractor's refusal to submit back-up documentation justifying cost break-down.

REMARKS

At the June 1, 1999 public meeting of the General Professional Services Selection Board, the Chairman of the Qualification Committee recommended five of seven firms as potentially eligible to provide contractual services for this project based upon the firms' qualifications. Of the five firms, the Qualification Committee recommended the firm of Gipe Associates, Inc. as the most qualified firm. The difference in scores between the first ranked and the second ranked firms was in the categories of "special experience" and "minority business participation." The proposed minority business participation by the second ranked firm was less than the 14% minimum goal established in the request for proposals. The category of "special experience" considers experience with projects similar to the subject project.

At the December 7, 1999 public meeting of the General Professional Services Selection Board, the Chairman of the Negotiation Committee recommended award of this contract as indicated. The price proposal for the services to be rendered was based upon the scope of services outlined in the project program for the Boiler Plant/Central Laundry Facility project, subsequent addenda to the project program, a detailed scope of architectural/engineering services specific to the project, and the Department of General Services' procedures for providing architectural/engineering services.

The price proposal derived was the result of a negotiated agreement with the Selection Board's Negotiation Committee (which consists of professional architects and engineers from within the Department of General Services and the Using Agency Representative) and the A/E firm of Gipe Associates, Inc. The chairman of the Negotiation Committee certified to the General Board that the negotiations were conducted in accordance with the regulations governing the Negotiation Committee and that the price proposal was determined to be fair, competitive, and reasonable.

The price proposal and the scope of services represented by the price proposal were reviewed by the General Professional Services Selection Board. The price proposal was accepted by the General Board as fair, competitive, and reasonable as required by Title 13-308 of the State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.

REMARKS

The Negotiation Committee's recommendation was approved by the General Professional Services Selection Board on December 7, 1999 and is recommended to the Board of Public Works for approval.

By letter dated January 5, 2000, the Joint Budget Committees were advised that current funding is insufficient to award the full six phases. By letter dated February 10, 2000, the Joint Budget Committees approved the award of phases one through three with funding for the remaining phases considered during the year 2000 legislative session. Approval is therefore requested for all six phases with the initial award being for the first three phases only.

Of the total fee, 96% will go to firms located in the State of Maryland and 4% will go to out of State firms.

Minority Business Enterprise participation is 35%.

The Office of the State Comptroller has verified, under Control Number 99-9901-0111, that the recommended firm **has no known deficiencies** in the payment of its Maryland tax obligations. 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

<u>REMARKS</u>

Pursuant to BPW Advisory P-01-99, this is a request to the Board of Public Works for the approval to use the Design/Build method for the construction of the above referenced project. Use of the Design/Build method will provide the most expeditious process to address severe overcrowding in the Department's detention centers by bringing additional beds on line as soon as possible. Originally scheduled in the capital improvement program for design funds for FY2001, the Department requested design and construction funding for FY2001 and desires to use the design/build procurement method to promptly address deficiencies in capacity.

The Western Maryland Detention Center is a 24-bed, 27,789 GSF facility, which will provide for secure confinement of juveniles, to be built on a State-owned site adjacent to the Hagerstown Armory in Washington County. The facility will include space for housing, education, recreation, medical, dietary and administrative functions. It will serve Area III of the Department of Juvenile Justice, which includes Allegany, Garrett, Washington and Frederick Counties. It will provide a more accessible detention facility which will shorten travel time for DJJ staff, local law enforcement, social service providers, attorneys and the detainee's families in the region and will alleviate severe overcrowding at the Noyes Center.

GENERAL/MISCELLANEOUS

ITEM 5-GM

REMARKS

Overcrowding at DJJ detention centers creates deficiencies in service provisions and compromises security. The need to address these deficiencies is urgent. Ongoing construction and design of facilities in Baltimore City and Wicomico County, respectively, are a part of a comprehensive strategy to provide additional beds resulting in a state-wide and localized/regional impact.

The Western Maryland Detention Center will contribute to reducing the state-wide deficiency as well, while providing regional detention capacity for the western area of the State.

Documents for the procurement of design/build services are currently being developed and planned for completion by mid-April. Solicitation for bids would shortly follow, assuming General Assembly approval of the funding for the project. The transfer of property from the Military Department to DJJ is being processed. Both the Baltimore City (under construction) and the Wicomico County (design) projects are similarly programmed facilities, from which many issues regarding design concepts, detail and project planning have already been addressed, and can be applied to the development of this project. This will contribute to a cost-efficient and timely design/build process.



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

Reference is made to Item 11-RP on this Department's Agenda of the October 27, 1999 meeting of the Board of Public Works wherein approval was given to the Department of Natural Resources to acquire 783 +/- acres from Blain Frantz, et al. for consideration of \$3,500 per acre subject to final boundary survey. A subsequent survey finalized on December 15,1999 revealed an additional 206.544 acres. The ownership by the Frantz family of 128.494 acres of the additional acreage was in dispute. In Handcarried Item 43-RP on this Department's Agenda of December 15, 1999, Board of Public Works approval was granted to purchase the non-disputed acreage. The Board of Public Works is now requested to approve an Amendment to the Agreement of Sale in which the contract is modified by the following:

- 1. Closing on 861.988 non-disputed acres shall occur no later than March 15, 2000;
- 2. Closing date on the remaining 128.494 acres is extended to March 15, 2005 in the event that a court of competent jurisdiction issues a final, non-appealable order stating that the Blain Frantz, Inc. is the owner in fee simple of such property. Conversely, should a court order issue that Blain Frantz, Inc. is not the owner in fee simple of such property, this Agreement shall automatically terminate.
- 3. On the 240 acres of land for sale by the State to Blain Frantz, Inc. (referred to as "Former Combs Property"), the parties agree to execute an access easement agreement pursuant to an existing Right of Entry from the Department of Natural Resources.



The applicant's matching funds for this project were provided through a mortgage from Nations Bank. The building is used to provide vocational training to developmentally disabled adults.



At its meetings on August 10, 1994 (DGS Agenda Item 28-CGL) and November 1, 1995 (DGS Agenda Item 37-CGL), the Board approved grants of \$300,000 and \$203,000, respectively, for a total grant of \$503,000. These grants were approved to assist the applicant in the cost of renovating an existing building at 7215 York Road, Baltimore, Maryland. The building is used to provide services to developmentally disabled adults.

Also, at its meeting on August 10, 1994, the Board approved a Waiver of Priority and Subordination Agreement which allowed the applicant to obtain its matching funds from the Maryland Economic and Community Development Corporation (MEDCO) which issued tax exempt revenue bonds. Initially, the State agreed to subordinate its right of recovery of the State grant of \$300,000 to the bondholders first deed of trust in the amount of \$2,382,144. 

Glendening appointed a Task Force to study, examine and develop a strategy for increased entrepreneurship for African-Americans in Baltimore City. The efforts of the Task Force represent an extension of similar activities initiated under Mayor Kurt L. Schmoke's Ad Hoc Committee appointed November 1995. The vision of the Task Force included the development of a business, cultural, and entertainment district in Baltimore City focused on African-American culture and entrepreneurship. After reviewing several locations throughout Baltimore City, the Howard Street Corridor was identified as the optimum location for the establishment of this "District".

The area that has been identified as the core of this "District" includes the 300, 400, and 500 blocks of Howard Street and is bordered by Centre, Saratoga, and Eutaw Streets as well as Park Avenue.

Copies of the notice of the RFP were sent to 350 potential vendors, including 235 registered minority businesses in Maryland. A pre-proposal conference was held and was attended by five firms. A 14% MBE goal was established for this contract. Only one offer was received, which was from the incumbent.



Long-term PPRP contracts to provide environmental engineering services have been approved and utilized for over twenty-five years. Absent this expertise, Maryland would not be able to meet it's statutory obligation to license power generators and thus assure that Maryland business and citizens would have available reasonably priced electricity with the lowest environmental consequences. Assuring this expertise is available is the rationale behind the special funding provision of the law- the Environmental Trust Fund.

This year alone, six power generators have applied for licenses. Prior to acceptability determination, and license issuance, detailed assessments and studies of each proposed project are required, a process that requires specific expertise --the recommended contractor, ERM Mid-States, Inc. ("ERM")-- and may take from 3 to 4 months to several years to complete. Providing the necessary and definitive evaluation to support the State's position in the adjudicatory licensing process is a DNR statutory mandate. With deregulation of the electric power industry DNR expects generation project applications to increase significantly.

The evaluation committee scored ERM as by far the most technically competent to provide the services requested. Other bidders did not have the qualifications or depth of expertise required. It should be noted that not many businesses perform this service. ERM is the incumbent which has served in this capacity for the last fifteen years. 



<u>REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS:</u> The original three year not-to-exceed (NTE) contract amount (\$39,539,000) was based upon the Lottery's projected media placement budget. The contractor, as an agent of the Lottery, purchases media placements and bills the Lottery for the exact cost of these placements.

The contractor's fee for all work performed for the contract is calculated by taking a commission percentage of 11.79% times the amount of the media placements. The use of BWI's air service consultants has been instrumental in recent successes in the air service program such as Aer Lingus applying to Dublin and Shannon from BWI; MetroJet choosing BWI as its base of operations; and additional service from Frontier, America West and Northwest. Carriers require substantial amounts of data before making a decision to inaugurate new international service, and carriers typically take between three and five years to make such a decision.

The Airport is engaged in high level talks with various European carriers and continuity of service through the Campbell-Hill Aviation Group is deemed pivotal in these negotiations. Because of these factors it is in the best interest of the State to exercise this option to this contract rather than to rebid.

The MBE participation of at least 7.5% of the total contract value will continue to be provided by Colquitt Design, Baltimore MD, and Nancy Low & Associates, Chevy Chase, MD, both MDOT certified MBE firms.



By virtue of the Maryland Health Planning Act, which was passed in 1978, the CCHD possesses the right to provide home heath services in Cecil County. The CCHD ceased providing home health care services on June 30, 1999 due to increasingly restrictive reimbursement practices implemented by Medicare.

However, prior to ceasing operation, CCHD advised the Maryland Health Resources Planning Commission (MHPRC) of its desire to explore the possibility of having another party assume the right to provide home health services. By taking the aforementioned action, CCHD retained its authority to operate a home health agency until MHRPC was notified of CCHD's results in locating a provider to whom it is willing to transfer its rights.

Based on guidance and direction received from MHPRC and the County's Assistant Attorney General, a Request for Expression of Interest (REI) was published in the Maryland Contract Weekly and the Cecil Whig (local county newspaper). By the REI due date, of January 14, 2000, three entities had exhibited an interest and two had submitted proposals. Proposals were received from Union Hospital of Cecil County and the Senior Quality Care of Elton, Maryland.



REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: As part of the State's continuing effort to increase the efficiency and effectiveness of public procurement and to increase the delivery of government services on-line, DGS issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for an Internet-based, interactive procurement system. This system provides for electronic communication between buyer and seller, eliminating the need for costly reproduction and courier services and, at the same time, gives vendors an expanded view of public procurement opportunities.

Broad involvement of key procurement agencies, including the Department of Budget and Management, in an Advisory Committee, contributed to a well defined, innovative approach that puts Maryland in the forefront of Internet-based procurement. After thorough evaluation and three months of testing, the Department has concluded that *eMaryland Marketplace* is that system. "Hyperlinks" will connect the *eMaryland Marketplace* site to the "Maryland Contract Weekly" and other State Internet websites as deemed appropriate.

The system includes on-line bid tabulation, e-mail enhanced approval processing, purchasing card payments, and electronic purchase orders. A bid lockbox, vendor self registration, e-mail solicitation notification, vendor-maintained catalogs, and on-line bid submissions make the system as much an asset to the vendor as it is to the State.

The project was advertised in the Maryland Contract Weekly on October 20, 1998 and 93 prospective offerors requested and received copies of the RFP. Fifty of the prospective offerors included firms located in Maryland, with 43 located out-of-state. Eight proposals were received with three being determined "not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award", and two others merged to form one proposal. This left four finalists to continue the selection process. In addition, as part of the Department's outreach efforts to enhance local resident business participation, direct mail announcements were forwarded to various business and trade organizations in Maryland. The MBE goal for this project is 14%.

This procurement was conducted by the Competitive Sealed Proposals method. Although this contract is intended to be of no cost to the State, financial proposals were required outlining the cost to the vendor community to use the eCommerce system. The Evaluation Committee ("Committee"), consisting of members of staff from the Department of General Services (Office of Procurement and Logistics) and the Department of Budget and Management (Office of Information Technology, Telecommunications Division), recommended award to the offer deemed most advantageous to the State.

SAIC was selected by the Committee as having the most advantageous offer. Pursuant to the RFP, SAIC began a pilot project on October 21, 1999 to prove all concepts set forth in their submission. The project moved to the final evaluation phase on January 19, 2000. On February 8, 2000, the Procurement Officer determined that SAIC had met all mandatory requirements of the RFP.

EXPLANATION: The University of Maryland Eastern Shore requests approval from the Board of Public Works to transfer to the State Highway Administration eight acres (more or less) for the purpose of constructing a direct access road to the UMES campus from Route 13. Of the eight acres being transferred: 1) 5.5 acres are transferred in fee simple as a permanent right of way for the construction, maintenance, and operation of a road; 2) 2.1 acres are being transferred to create a perpetual wetlands mitigation site; and 3) 1.1 acres are being transferred to grant a temporary easement during the period of road construction. Creation of the perpetual wetlands mitigation site is necessary because road construction will disturb existing wetlands area. The combined acreage is taken from property originally deeded to the State of Maryland to the use of UMES from Morgan College, *et al.*, in 1968 and from Thomas James Bozman, *et ux.*, in 1992. This disposition of property will not adversely affect any current UMES program or future campus development and is consistent with the approved facilities master plan.

State and federal funds have been earmarked for the roads project. SHA is scheduled to commence construction during the summer of 2000 with completion planned for 2002. The roads project has the support of the local governments of Somerset County and the town of Princess Anne.

UMES has been advocating for this project for 25 years. Currently, the entrance to the campus is through the town of Princess Anne via Loop Road. The proposed access road would provide a more direct entrance to the campus from Route 13 and bypass town traffic.


<u>NATURE OF REQUEST:</u> The MAA requests approval to update the standard Contract for Aircraft Parking at MTN to better define and improve enforcement of fire code regulations, preventive maintenance, late payment, and liability provisions.

LEESEE: Businesses or individuals that store aircraft at the Airport.

REVENUE: Approximately \$790,000.00 annually in aircraft parking revenue.

<u>DURATION</u>: Standard contract is for one (1) year with two (2), one-year renewal options.

REMARKS: Over 300 aircraft are based at MTN utilizing outdoor tiedowns, T-hangars, and community hangars. The original standard contract received Board of Public Works approval as MDOT Agenda Item 30-GM on July 19, 1983. The proposed changes are a result of recent issues regarding MAA access to T-hangars for preventive maintenance, inappropriate aircraft maintenance by aircraft owners, need for better enforcement of fire code regulations, higher liability requirements, and new administrative remedies for late payments. The new lease provisions will be incorporated into existing leases upon renewal.

<u>REMARKS</u>: The MPA currently leases the North side of Pier 1 at Clinton Street Terminal to layberth military vessels. The tenant's new federal government contract is for the layberthing of two (2) LMSR Ro/Ro Vessels (Large Medium-Speed Rollon/Roll-off Vessels). Each vessel is 950 feet long with a 105-foot beam and requires 36 feet of water depth. In order to accommodate these vessels dredging is immediately necessary. The current depth is thirty-four (34) feet.

The Federal Government contract calls for the layberth to be deepened and available no later than June 1, 2000. Additionally, the Hart-Miller Island Disposal site typically closes on or about April 1 and does not reopen until the fall so that dewatering can occur through the summer to improve disposal capacity.

The MPA proposes to undertake an expedited procurement to accomplish the dredging prior to the April 1 closing of Hart-Miller. Dredging contractors would be solicited for bids to accomplish the required dredging and award would be based on the lowest responsive bid.

The preliminary Engineer's Estimate for this work is \$650,000.00 to dredge approximately 30,000 cubic yards. The tenant has agreed to reimburse the Maryland Port Administration for the cost of the required dredging.
