The Board was advised by Mr. Lewis that in all of the Items submitted and recommended to the Board where payment is to be made from the proceeds of the following bond issues:

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the significant section in point reading as follows:

"And Be It Further Enacted, That no Department, Board, Commission, Agency, or Institution specified or named in this Act shall begin any work with funds secured pursuant to the provisions of this Act unless satisfactory assurances are made to the Board of Public Works that the work described in the individual items of this Act can be completed with the funds specified for each item respectively."

The Board was also advised by Mr. Lewis that all items submitted and recommended on his Agenda for purchase through the Central Purchasing Bureau have been screened and conform with equipment for which the above Bond Issue Funds were provided.

The Board was further advised of the provisions of Section 8 of Chapter 743 of the Acts of 1965 (General Construction Loan of 1965) reading as follows:

"And Be It Further Enacted, That if any Federal grant is or becomes available to any of the State Colleges, the University of Maryland, Morgan State College, or St. Mary's College of Maryland for Capital Improvements, which grant is to pay a portion of the cost of such improvements as set out in this Act for any of these institutions, then the State appropriation herein provided for any such Capital Improvements in each instance shall be reduced by an amount equal to the amount of the Federal grant.

Chapter 289 of the Acts of 1974 as follows:
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"And Be It Further Enacted, That where Federal funds may be available to help accomplish any specific projects in this Act, the using department or agency shall be obligated to seek the allocation of such Federal funds to apply to the cost of the particular project. In seeking approval of the Board of Public Works for award of a contract under a specific appropriation under this Act, the suing department or agency shall formally advise the Board of Public Works that efforts have been made through proper administrative procedures to obtain such Federal Funds, and the reason, if any, why the Federal funds were not obtained. Availability of Federal Funds where allocated is intended to defray the cost of the approved project, not expand its scope, except in the case of projects of the Department of Forests and Parks, Department of Natural Resources. These latter projects may be expanded in scope beyond that proposed in the specific appropriation in this Act if the addition of Federal funds makes this possible, but not beyond the total park acreage or as evident from the master plan for State parks and recreation areas as adopted by the Department of Forests and Parks, Department of Natural Resources."

# 1. BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS - WETLANDS LICENSES

Formal approval in connection with the following applications for wetlands licenses for projects involving dredging and filling in the navigable waters of Maryland under Title 9, Natural Resources Article, Annotated Code of Maryland (1974).

- Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission to construct 1,650 feet long, 16 feet deep, 65 feet wide trench in Potomac River immediately south of Mockley Point; to emplace 108 inch effluent pipe therein two (2) to eight (8) feet below existing bottom; to deposit 40,000 cubic yards of spoil at the Brown Station Road Landfill, Prince George's County as depicted on revised plans dated December, 1974.

- Mr. Alton Akers to construct a 68 foot bulkhead at varying distances from the mean high water line to 30 foot channelward thereof; to backfill with less than 330 cubic yards of slag as depicted on undated plan revised September 10, 1974 Jones Creek, Baltimore County.

Wooster, Jr. to dredge a 150 foot long, 12 foot wide channel and basin within an existing drainage ditch to a depth of three (3) feet at mean low water; to deposit approximately 350 cubic yards of spoil behind an existing earthen dike; to emplace 150 feet of low profile revetment along shoreline within four (4) feet of mean high water line: as depicted on plan dated December 29, 1974 on the Annemessex Canal approximately 1,500 feet south of Daugherty Creek and the entrance to said canal in Somerset County.

Re: Wetlands Cases 74-444, 75-166 and 75-224

Dear Governor Mandel:

The subject wetlands cases are scheduled to appear on the agenda of the next meeting of the Board of Public Works and, in each instance, there is a change in the description appearing on the agenda from that which appeared on the original Report of Administrator and Report and Recommendations of the Water Resources Administration. The changes appearing in the agenda and the reasons therefor are explained below, and substantiating documentation is attached herewith for your files:

74-444 - The change occurring in this case is a substitution of the names of Gerald A. and Christine A. DeManns in place of the name of the former property owner, Francis E. Hope. Since the requested works remain unchanged, and since the permit runs with the land, the substitution of the name of the new property owner is deemed appropriate.

75-166 - The change occurring in this case is a change in the maximum permissible distance which the bulkhead may be placed channelward of the mean high waterline due to irregularities in the shoreline. Whereas the applicant initially requested a maximum encroachment of only 10' channelward of the mean high waterline, testimony was produced at the hearing indicating that, in several places, as delineated on the plan attached to the application, a maximum of 17' of channelward encroachment would be required. In the preparation of both the Recommendation of the Water Resources Administration and the Report of Administrator, the 10' channelward encroachment figure was which was, in fact, agreed upon by both the Water Resources Administration and the Board of Public Works, Wetlands Administrator. Correspondence attached hereto substantiates this agreement of a maximum 17' encroachment, and the agenda item reflects this change from 10' to 17'.

Honorable Marvin Mandel Page 2 May 2, 1975

75-224 - The change occurring in this case is an amendment to two dimensions in the requested project increasing the size of the concrete block bulkhead from 70' to 100' and increasing the dimension of one of the bulkhead returns from 5' to 8'. The reason for this change is that the originally stated dimensions, 70' and 5', as shown in the original hand-drawn plan dated January 9, 1975, constituted the only dimensions placed in evidence at the hearing held in the subject case and were, subsequently, inserted on the revised plan which was attached to the Report of Administrator dated February 25. 1975, and forwarded to the Board of Public Works with the Addendum to the Department of Natural Resources' Report. Subsequent to that submission, the Department of Natural Resources was advised, via the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, that the applicant's configurations as shown on the professionally prepared plan dated December 27, 1974, including the dimensions in question (100' and 8') were accurate and that said dimensions have been given approval by the appropriate Federal regulatory agencies, but that a permit from the Corps of Engineers would be withheld until such time as the State license was amended to concur with the Federal description of the subject project. Based upon that information, and upon a substantiating site visit by the personnel of the Wetlands Division, Water Resources Administration, said Water Resources Administration advised the Board of Public Works, Wetlands Administrator that the dimensions in the subject license should be changed as indicated above.





### .03 Technical Eligibility

### A. General

Persons for Whom Eligibility Must be Established. Technical Eligibility must be established for the child on whose behalf the AFDC application is signed and on whose behalf the grant is paid; for the recipient of GPA, or Public Assistance to Adults. Need is the only factor which has to be established for other individuals whose requirements are included in the grant.

Except when otherwise specified hereafter in this Rule, AFDC includes AFDC-E and [GPA includes GPA-E] AFDC-FC.

For receipt of assistance under a Federal category, the recipient must be a citizen or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence or otherwise permanently residing in the United States under color of law.

### C. Age-

- [(1) GPA—No age requirement ]
- (1) [(2)] Public Assistance to Adults (PAA)—No age requirement.
- (2) [(3)]AFDC—Under 18 years (the unborn child included) or under 21 if full time or at least ½ time is attending high school or college or a course of vocational or technical training designed to fit him for gainful employment. To include an unborn child, there must be a medical statement confirming pregnancy.
  - [K. General Public Assistance may be granted only for a person technically ineligible in his own right for another (Federal or State) category of assistance. A relative as defined for AFDC is considered technically eligible in his own right for AFDC when living in the household with the related child(ren).]

### [L GPA to Employables—

- (1) General Public Assistance may be granted to meet the temporary needs of any able-bodied person and his family, provided that the County Commissioners or the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore City shall have given written consent to the local department for the expenditure of local funds for this purpose and have provided the necessary matching funds.
- [(2) Eligibility and the amount of the grant shall be determined as for any other grant of General Public Assistance, except for the following limitations:]
  - [a. All cash assets of any member of the assistance unit which can be turned readily into money are to be considered as an available resource.]
  - (b. A monthly grant of assistance to an individual or family otherwise eligible may be paid within the month only when the Employmer t Security Administration has certified for that month that it is not possible to place the applicant or any employable member of the Assistance unit in a job.]

### 1.04 Definition of Need -

- B. The amount of need is determined for the assistance unit but may be met from one or from several categories; the amount from any particular category includes the needs of the eligible individual and in addition may include the requirements of the following persons:
  - (1) The spouse of the eligible person
  - (2) A needy individual whose services are required by the eligible person in keeping house, nursing, or the like
  - (3) Both parents of eligible AFDC children, including the parents of the unborn child; or the payee and spouse who stand in the place of parents for eligible AFDC children
  - [(4) Dependents of the eligible GPA individual, who are themselves eligible for GPA.]
    - The requirements of one person shall not be included in more than one Federal category.
- C. An individual receiving Supplemental Security Income benefits shall not be included in or be counted as a resource available to any assistance unit in a Federal category.

### .06 Determining Available Resources

- A. For Emergency Assistance—For emergency need (Section .08) [and for GPA-E (Section .03.K), ]any current income or liquid assets are available resources. For this purpose, liquid assets are defined as money in the bank, stocks, bonds, or similar holdings readily convertible to cash, but do not include funds which have been conserved from a child's income for future identifiable needs as provided in B(10) below.
- B. (2) Assets Retained—Assets which may be retained to meet current and future needs without being considered a resource are as follows:
  - a. For [GPA] PAA for one or two adults, liquid assets up to [\$2,000.00] \$\frac{91500}{\$1500}\$ for a one-person assistance unit; and up to [\$2,600.00] \$2250 for a two-person assistance unit. [For Public Assistance to Adults (PAA) the amounts are \$1500.00 and \$2250.00 respectively Liquid assets are those convertible to cash, such as money in the bank, real property other than the home, stocks, bonds, cash value of insurance.

Whenever the face value of a life insurance policy exceeds the maximum limitations, the actual cash value of such policy shall be ascertained and the amount by which the actual value exceeds the maximum face value allowed shall be considered a part of other liquid assets.
  - c. The provisions of a. and b. above do not apply to [GPA-E or to] Emergency Assistance grants.

- (3) Disregard of Monthly Income—Before applying any of the following provisions of this Section .06, there is to be disregarded in AFDC [or GPA,] the first \$5.00 per month of any income of any member of the assistance unit

In the Federal category, AFDC, children under 21 are the responsibility of parents living with them. The [absent] parents, ones not living with the assistance unit, AS WELL AS THOSE LIVING WITH THE ASSISTANCE UNIT, are responsible for children under age 18 in all categories of assistance.

# SCHEDULE OF COURT COSTS AND CHARGES ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 548, ACTS OF 1975

## I. DEFINITION

"Circuit Court" - In this schedule, and in the attached Explanatory Notes, "circuit court" includes the circuit court for a county, the Superior Court of Baltimore City, the Court of Common Pleas, the Baltimore City Court, the Circuit Court of Baltimore City, and Circuit Court No. 2.

## II. SCOPE OF SCHEDULE

This schedule applies to court costs, fees, and charges in general relating to civil actions at law or in equity filed or pending in a circuit court. The costs, fees, and charges established are intended to supplant and supplement those formerly established by §§7-201, 7-202(a) and (b), and 7-203 of the Article on Courts and Judicial Proceedings. Portions of this schedule requiring advance filing fees do not apply to juvenile delinquency cases. This schedule does not apply to court costs, fees, or charges expressly set by statute or rule. For example, provisions with respect to appearance fees, or filing fees for appeals to the Court of Special Appeals are not affected. Nothing in this schedule is intended to interfere with a court's right to waive costs, fees, or charges on account of indigency, pursuant to authority granted by statute or rules. Nothing in this schedule is intended to interfere with a court's authority to assess or allocate costs between parties, but costs may not be waived, except in case of indigency.

## III. EFFECTIVE DATE

The cost, fees, and charges prescribed in this schedule apply to every civil action described in Section II and filed in a circuit court on or after June 1, 1975. With respect to any action pending in a circuit court on June 1, 1975, the schedule applies to all subsequent proceedings in that action. In the case of a pending action in which costs have been charged or accrued on the basis of \$1 for every docket entry in excess of 10, charged or accrued costs shall be retained or collected, but no additional costs on that basis shall be charged. Fees for copying, recording, filing, indexing, certifying, or furnishing certificates shall be charged pursuant to this schedule if the request for service is made on or after June 1, 1975.

## IV. COSTS, FEES, AND CHARGES

## A. Payment in Advance - No Refunds

Except as expressly otherwise provided in this schedule, or by statute or rule, the prescribed costs, fees, or charges shall be collected by the clerk of court before he dockets the case, performs the service, or delivers the document for which the cost, fee, or charge is to be collected. A cost, fee, or charge is not refundable. Costs taxed to a party pursuant to a judgment are to be settled between the parties.

## B. Advance Filing Fee

For docketing any appeal or other case at law or in equity, except for an appeal exempted by \$7-201(a) of the Courts Article, a case in which payment of advance filing fee has been waived because of indigency, a case removed from another circuit court, or a case filed in the circuit court because jury trial has been demanded in the District Court, the clerk shall collect an advance filing fee of \$40. The advance filing fee is also required when a party files a proceeding for scire facias, attachment on original process or attachment on a judgment. In any case of waiver because of indigency, removal, or demand for jury trial, the court shall tax and the clerk shall collect the \$40 fee when final judgment has been entered.

## C. Counter-claim, Cross-claim, Cross-bill of Complaint, Third Party Claim

For filing a counter-claim, cross-claim, cross-bill of complaint, or third party claim in an action subject to this schedule, the clerk shall collect a filing fee of \$10. If advance payment of this fee is waived because of indigency, the court shall tax and the clerk shall collect the \$10 fee when final judgment has been entered.

## D. Post-judgment Activity

- 1. For filing a petition or motion to hold a person in contempt, to modify alimony or support, or to modify custody, after final decree, \$10. The provisions of paragraph B apply in the event of waiver because of indigency.
- 2. For issuing a writ of fieri facias, habere facies possessionem, returno habendo, attachment for contempt, mandamus, or supplementary proceedings \$10.

## E. Other Charges

- 1. Entering an order of satisfaction of a judgment rendered by a magistrate's court or People's Court before July 5, 1971 \$2.
- 2. Recording a judgment rendered by a magistrate's court or People's Court before July 5, 1971 \$5.

- 11. For recording any instrument on the financing statement ords \$3 per page plus \$1 per name for indexing the name of each debtor that appears on the instrument. For this purpose, the names of a husband and wife shall be counted separately.
- 12. For recording any other instrument required to be recorded by law, except papers required to be recorded in land or chattel records \$3 per page.

# EXPLANATORY NOTES SCHEDULE OF COURTS COSTS AND CHARGES ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO CH. 548, ACTS OF 1975

The general concept of this schedule is that costs, charges, and fees covered by it are to be collected in advance. They are not refundable. For example, if a plaintiff deposits the \$40 advance filing fee and subsequently recovers a judgment with costs, the plaintiff collects the costs he has paid from the defendant, not from the clerk. If a court fails to include mention of costs in a judgment, they are nevertheless non-refundable. Maryland Rule 604, a general rule applicable both at law and in equity, provides that in the absence of a contrary provision of law or order of court, the "prevailing party shall be entitled to the allowance of court costs, which shall be taxed by the clerk and embraced in the judgment."

The schedule also contemplates that the advance filing fee covers all normal docketing and processing activity by the clerk, from the filing of the suit until final judgment, unless the schedule expressly provides otherwise. The \$1 per docket entry charge for each docket entry in excess of 10, formerly provided by \$7-202 (b) of the Courts Article, is abolished.

The concept of a filing fee for a counter-claim, cross-claim, etc. is a new one. It recognizes the extra activity required of the clerk when such pleadings are filed. (Schedule IV. C). Also new is the charge for preparing the record on appeal (Schedule IV. E. 3).

The concept of additional filing fees for such post-judgment pleadings as petitions to change alimony, support, or custody is also new. It recognizes thatin certain equity cases substantial activity may continue long after final decree, and to this extent, replaces in part the revenues lost through abolition of the \$1 per entry charge (Schedule IV. D.1). The charge is the same as that for issuing various writs (Schedule IV. D. 2).

It should be noted that former subsections (c), (d), and (e) of §7-202 have not been repealed, but only redesignated as subsections (b), (c), and (d).

The schedule omits former §7-203, which was repealed by Ch 548 This section deals with proceedings to forclose the right of equity of redemption in a tax sale. Such proceedings are deemed an equity proceeding, subject to the normal \$40 advance filing fee. The former appearance fee provision is covered by the general appearance fee provisions of §7-204. Charges for service of process should be those paid for service in other equity cases. It was thought inappropriate to include title search charges as part of court costs.







## DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE (BALTIMORE ASSOCIATION FOR RETARDED CITIZENS, INC.) (DUNDALK SEARCHLIGHT TRAINING CENTER)

The Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene requests Board of Public Works approval of a \$324,723.60 allocation of State funds to assist in the construction and equipping of a day care facility for the mentally retarded (MR-22). The facility will be constructed by the Baltimore Association for Retarded Citizens, Inc. and will be located at Old North Point Road and Willow Road in eastern Baltimore County. The project has been reviewed and approved by the Director of the Mental Retardation Administration and found to be in conformity with the Maryland Comprehensive Mental Retardation Plan.

The Association is presently serving 30 children, ages 3 through 21. The new facility will provide space for an additional 40 children for a total of 70 for their day-care program.
