the significant section in point reading as follows:

"And Be It Further Enacted, That no department, board, commission, agency or institution specified or named in this Act shall begin any work with funds secured pursuant to the provisions of this Act unless satisfactory assurances are made to the Board of Public Works that the work described in the individual items of this Act can be completed with the funds specified for each item respectively."

The Board was also advised by Mr. Lewis that all items submitted and recommended on his Agenda for purchase through the Central Purchasing Bureau have been screened and conform with equipment for which the above Bond Issue Funds were provided.

The Board was further advised of the provisions of Section 8 of Chapter 743 of the Acts of 1965 (General Construction Loan of 1965) reading as follows:

"And Be It Further Enacted, That if any Federal grant is or becomes available to any of the State Colleges, the University of Maryland, Morgan State College, or St. Mary's College of Maryland for Capital Improvements, which grant is to pay a portion of the cost of such improvements as set out in this Act for any of these institutions, then the State appropriation herein provided for any such Capital Improvements in each instance shall be reduced by an amount equal to the amount of the Federal grant.

Mr. Lewis also informed the Board of the provisions of Section 9 of

Chapter 289 of the Acts of 1974 as follows:

"And Be It Further Enacted, That where Federal funds may be available to help accomplish any specific projects in this Act, the using department or agency shall be obligated to seek the allocation of such Federal funds to apply to the cost of the particular project. In seeking approval of the Board of Public Works for award of a contract under a specific appropriation under this Act, the suing department or agency shall formally advise the Board of Public Works that efforts have been made through proper administrative procedures to obtain such Federal funds, and the reason, if any, why the Federal funds were not obtained. Availability of Federal funds where allocated is intended to defray the cost of the approved project, not expand its scope, except in the case of projects of the Department of Forests and Parks, Department of Natural Resources. These latter projects may be expanded in scope beyond that proposed in the specific appropriation in this Act if the addition of Federal funds makes this possible, but not beyond the total park acreage or development contemplated for the State park or recreation area to which it applies, as evident from the master plan for State parks and recreation areas as adopted by the Department of Forests and Parks, Department of Natural Resources."

These improvements will increase the plant treatment efficiency and reduce pollution of the St. Mary's River. The improvements are considered interim at this plant since it will be abandoned within the next two to three years when the St. Mary's County Metropolitan Commission constructs a pumping station, force main and interceptor to convey sewage from this area to the existing treatment plant near Lexington Park.

Federal funds are not currently available for these improvements, so the Environmental Health Administration requests that the entire cost be provided from the Water Quality Loan of 1968. Chapter 445, Acts of 1968 as amended by Chapter 286 of the Acts of 1974. The Environmental Health Administration also ammends that as a condition of approval, all equipment that can be salvaged when the plant is abandoned become the property of the Maryland Environmental Service for use at other treatment plants it may be operating.
