
Maryland Environmental Trust

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works ratify an amendment to a conservation easement the donation of which the Board ratified in 2004. The amendment will strengthen the easement's conservation values by describing further a two-acre house site.

Background: The Board ratified Chesapeake Bay Foundation's donation to the Maryland Environmental Trust and the Patuxent Tidewater Land Trust, Inc. of a conservation easement on a 132.253 acre property in Oakville, St. Mary's County (Item 7 on the Secretary's Agenda of January 28, 2004). Subsequently, the Board ratified changes to the approved easement (Item 8 on the Secretary's Agenda of April 21, 2004). The easement was recorded in the land records.

The property's current owners, Russell and Michelle Leitch, now request the Board to further amend the easement to strengthen its conservation values. Specifically, the amendment adds a plat of a two-acre house site to the recorded deed. The Maryland Environmental Trust has no basis on which to estimate the market value of this restriction.

An assistant attorney general has approved the transaction for legal form and sufficiency.

Permitted Use: By a tenant or subtenant whose mission, business, operations or programs are

marine-dependent, maritime related, or promote the Maryland seafood industry

or the vitality and economy of the Chesapeake Bay.

This facility was gutted following Hurricane Isabel and requires investment to revitalize and make operational this historically productive property on the waterfront in Rock Hall. The Town will undertake to attract an appropriate subtenant or subtenants and the investment required, and will take responsibility for monitoring usage of the facility.

Elevator #4 is the only secure means of safely transporting prisoners from the holding cells to the courtroom. A load test performed by ThyssenKrupp Elevator determined that the hydraulic system in elevator #4 had failed due a malfunction in the cylinder allowing fluid to leak into the elevator pit. Until repaired, the elevator had to be removed from service and prisoners escorted through public areas to reach the courtroom.

REMARKS

The Board of Public Works was advised of an interior mold problem at the Bard Building, Baltimore City Community College, located in downtown Baltimore by letter dated September 22, 2005 which required immediate attention. As indicated in the letter to members of the Board dated September 22, 2005, the remediation was to be procured in several phases.

Phase I, conducted in August, 2005, provided for the remediation of the apparel tech classroom and the library to allow the college to open to students in September 2005 for the fall semester. Classrooms and offices were relocated to other floors within the Bard building which were not contaminated. Report of the emergency procurement conducted for Phase I work was accepted by the Board at its meeting of November 16, 2005 (Secretary's Agenda, Appendix 1).

The second phase required the services of an A/E firm to determine how best to eliminate the moisture infiltration, repair the HVAC system, remove the contaminated materials replacing them with new ones and prepare the mold remediation specifications. That document, received in April 2006, recommended the work be undertaken in three-phases: (1) waterproofing; (2) remediation and; (3) restoration.



REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Each year since 1960, DNR has conducted a "Shell Program" for oyster habitat rehabilitation that involves three main components: shell dredging, shell washing, and shell planting. In this Program, dead buried shells are dredged up, washed, transported by barge and tugboat, and are planted on the Bay bottom to enhance the recruitment of baby oysters (called "spat").

Shell dredging, washing and planting activities require very different equipment and specialized processes from those used for the dredging of navigation channels. Since 1960, only the incumbent has had the specialized equipment, knowledge of Maryland's Chesapeake Bay habitat, and the abilities essential to provide the required services for this Program.

Up to a billion new oysters have been created yearly from this Program. Oysters help filter the Bay and they improve the Bay's ecology. The Maryland oyster industry harvests about 80% of its catch from areas that are treated with the dredged shells as a result of this Program. If this Program were ended, the \$4 million dockside value of the industry would decline significantly.

To test the competitive procurement environment, in 1999 a notice of an Invitation for Bids (IFB) was advertised in the Maryland Contract Weekly and over 19 copies of the IFB were mailed to potential bidders. There was only one response to the IFB, the incumbent contractor. An evaluation has determined that since 1999 no new company has entered this market. To the Department's best knowledge, the incumbent is the only company in the country that has the highly specialized skills and equipment to provide this service. Accordingly, the Department is requesting approval of this sole source contract.

As indicated in the contract Term, this contract includes a one year renewal option. This option will only be exercised if all requirements of the contract cannot be completed during 2006. If it is necessary to exercise this option there will be no increase in the 2.6 million dollar contract value.

Nine percent of the MBE goal (from 10% to 1%) was waved because, aside from fuel transporters, the contractor received no responses from advertising in the Baltimore Sun and telephone solicitations. Two MBEs will be used to transport fuel.

The total award amount of \$3,892,788 assumes that each slot purchased will be occupied by a child 334 days during the initial fiscal period and 365 during the option period covered by these contracts. Based on history, this is unlikely to occur. The renewal amounts for each contractor are estimated and are based upon an expected IRC rate increase of approximately 6.5 %. The vendors are paid solely for the actual children placed with them during the year, and then only for the actual number of days each child is with the vendor.

The service providers in this request were obtained through a non-competitive negotiation process. 

EPBs are used by election judges to look up voters, verify information, capture that a voter has checked in to vote, and when used with Maryland's statewide voting system, encode a voter access card for use with the voting system. By virtue of the original contract and need to have equipment compatibility, only the Diebold Election Systems hardware and services can meet the State's requirements for this requirement.

As discussed below under the Contract Status section, Phase 1 delivery by the contractor is meeting SBE's expectations. REMARKS: A national trend for residential students is that they no longer arrive on university campuses with handsets to plug into the University's landline phone jacks. Instead, 90% of students across the nation arrive on university campuses with mobile phones. Since most students are reluctant to provide universities with their personal cell phone numbers, or due to credit issues, have cell phone numbers that change often, this has created a situation whereby it is extremely difficult for academic and administrative units to communicate with individual students. Further, in the event of emergency situations, universities have found themselves in a situation where it is even more difficult to efficiently communicate with large groups of students at the same time.

RaveWireless is the first of its kind to integrate a number of communication tools tailored to the higher education market (particularly students) under a single handset application. This application provides the mobile tools to allow: (1) students to communicate with each other (e.g., to build social groups, study groups, and circles of friends); (2) faculty and students to communicate more efficiently with each other (e.g., in-class surveys, assignments, scheduling appointments, grades, course material); and (3) staff to proactively communicate with students to address areas that will help increase retention rates (e.g., ensuring students are aware of financial aid, drop/add, course withdrawal, registration, and housing deadlines).

UMES has reviewed the wireless services offered by Verizon Wireless, Cingular, and Sprint that are available through BPW-approved competitive contracts through the State of Maryland's Department of Budget & Management, the University of Maryland College Park, and the federal GSA Schedule 80. During this review, it became apparent that Sprint is the only wireless provider that is able to meet UMES' distinct needs. To date, the only wireless provider that has been certified by RaveWireless is Sprint (with Nextel).

More importantly, in the event of severe weather (e.g., tornadoes, hurricanes, strong storms producing lightning, hail, heavy snow, or ice), emergency situations (e.g., fire, bomb scare, hostage situation), or health issues (e.g., avian flu or meningitis outbreaks), the University will have an efficient and flexible means of locating and/or communicating with students as individuals or groups. In short, the RaveWireless application, in conjunction with the underlying wireless service, will become part of UMES emergency communication plan.

- 4. The University and the purchaser have jointly consulted with the Maryland Historical Trust (MHT) regarding MHT's recommendations. As a result, the University and the purchaser are entering into a memorandum of understanding, with the consent of MHT, regarding purchaser's historic preservation of the property.
- 5. USM submitted a letter dated February 13, 2006, to the chairmen of Senate Budget and Taxation and House Appropriations Committees for review and comment on the disposition and was subsequently notified that no comment was planned to be provided.
- The University has held preliminary meetings with the Town of Riverdale Park, the City
 of College Park, and Prince George's County and found them to be supportive of the
 development proposal.
- 7. The state-owned condominium units are proposed to be used to attract to the University of Maryland a select group of graduate students from around the world as part of a package that would supplement existing graduate student stipends and employee health care with high-quality housing at below market rental rates.

REMARKS: The Agreement of Sale requires Shoreland, Inc to demolish and remove all improvements. This includes: (1) demolishing the 138,000 square foot freezer warehouse, an 800 square foot vacant residence and a 26,000 square foot warehouse used for dry storage; and (2) terminating an existing commercial lease for use of that warehouse space. The University is providing a relocation reimbursement to the current lessee in an amount not to exceed \$20,000. Shoreland is also required to remove three above and one below ground storage tanks, remove any harmful materials associated with the freezer warehouse (e.g., PCBs, ammonia), and remove contaminated soil. In consideration, the University will pay Shoreland a demolition allowance of \$953,000. The demolition allowance was independently validated by the Department of Architecture, Engineering and Construction of the University of Maryland, College Park which estimates the cost of this work to be exceed \$1 million.

The demolitions were anticipated to occur before closing. Therefore, the University would not take ownership of these improvements. Subsequent to this agreement, the bank carrying the current note on the property requested Shoreland not to begin demolition of facilities before closing. However, Shoreland had previously engaged construction services and demolition has commenced. Completion of demolition and environmental abatement will continue after closing. The University will grant Shoreland a post-closing right of entry to complete the work. The demolition allowance will be held in escrow until such time as work is completed and will be paid to Shoreland upon completion.

Because demolition will occur until after closing, the University will, at closing, become the owner of improvements and not just the owner of vacant land. The University must thus seek review and endorsement of the demolition from the State Clearinghouse for Intergovernmental Review . A letter requesting that endorsement was submitted to the Clearinghouse on July 5, 2006.

In early 2006, the owner of the Shoreland, Inc. property informed the University that he had received a buy-out proposal from another company. He stated that he wished to give the University a right of first refusal to purchase the property consistent with a prior informal commitment to do so.

Salisbury University needs additional property in order to construct new facilities in response to projected enrollment growth. Opportunities for expansion are limited due to significant commercial and residential development to the north, west and south of the campus and along Route 13 on the east. The property for which the University is seeking the Board's approval to acquire is a rare opportunity that will not be available in the future. Shoreland, Inc. is a property the University has considered in its facilities master plan as a viable development site to respond to future University growth.

REMARKS: (continued)

In the short-term, the University intends to use the property for needed additional surface parking and recreation on the open space portions of the site. For the long-term, this property would be ideal for locating a field house, a performing arts facility, relocation of the maintenance department, a parking garage, or other facilities that would be needed in response to institutional growth.

The Agreement of Sale also provides that the parcel be transferred free of any and all environmental issues or concerns. Phase I and Phase II Environmental Assessments were conducted. While nothing of a serious nature was found, the seller retains full responsibility for environmental compliance. The Phase II assessment revealed minor subsurface heating oil contamination in the vicinity of a previously closed 15,000 underground storage tank. The seller will remediate all areas of contamination during the demolition process.

The University System of Maryland Board of Regents approved the acquisition of this property in April 7, 2006.

Based on criteria established in the RFP, and the proposal submitted by Energy Systems Group SE, Inc. (ESG), the firm was evaluated to be the highest ranking firm and was selected for award.
