"And Be It Further Enacted, That no Department, Board, Commission, Agency or Institution specified or named in this Act shall begin any work with funds secured pursuant to the provision of this Act unless satisfactory assurances are made to the Board of Public Works that the work described in the individual items of this Act can be completed with the funds specified for each item respectively."

The Board was also advised by Mr. Lewis that all items submitted and recommended on his Agenda for purchase through the Central Purchasing Bureau have been screened and conform with equipment for which the above Bond issue funds were provided.

The Board was further advised of the provisions of Section 8 of Chapter 743 of the Acts of 1965 (General Construction Loan of 1965) reading as follows:

"And Be It Further Enacted, That if any Federal Grant is or becomes available to any of the State Colleges, the University of Maryland, Morgan State College, or St. Mary's College of Maryland for Capital Improvements, which grant is to pay a portion of the cost of such improvements as set out in this Act for any of these institutions, then the State appropriation herein provided for any such Capital Improvements in each instance shall be reduced by an amount equal to the amount of the Federal Grant."

"And Be It Further Enacted, That where Federal Funds may be available to help accomplish any specific projects in this Act, the suing department or agency shall be obligated to seek the allocation of such Federal funds to apply to the cost of the particular project. In seeking approval of the Board of Public Works for award of a contract under a specific appropriation under this Act, the suing department or agency shall formally advise the Board of Public Works that efforts have been made through proper administrative procedures to obtain such Federal funds, and the reason, if any, why the Federal funds were not obtained. Availability of Federal Funds where allocated is intended to defray the cost of the approved project, not expand its scope, except in the case of projects of the Department of Forests and Parks, Department of Natural Resources.

The said bids are to be contained in sealed envelopes appropriately identified, and each bid must be accompanied by one certified check upon, or one cashier's or treasurer's check, or any other direct demand obligation of, a responsible banking institution, drawn to the order of the Treasurer of the State of Maryland for two per centum of the total par value of the bends bid for. All bids will be opened at 12 o'clock Noon, E.D.S.T., on the 13th day of October, 1976.

Said bonds shall be dated November 1, 1976, and shall bear interest at the rate or rates set forth in the successful bid to be determined upon opening of the bids by the Governor, the Comptroller of the Treasury, and the Treasurer, or a majority of them (constituting the Board of Public Works). The bidders shall be required to indicate in their bids the rate or rates of interest to be paid on the bonds of each maturity, but all bonds of any one maturity must bear interest at the same rate. The maximum number of rates which may be named is three; any of each rate named may be repeated; and the difference between the maximum and minimum interest rates so specified may not be greater than one per centum. The rate or rates must be a multiple of one-eighth of one per centum or one-tenth of one per centum, said interest to be payable semi-annually on the first day of May and November until maturity. A zero rate may not be named, and the interest payable with respect to each bond on any one date will be evidenced by a single coupon. A bid for less than all of the bonds will not be accepted, and all bids shall be based on an offering to pay not less than par for the bonds. The premium, if any, must be paid in cash as part of the purchase price.

Each bid must be in conformity with the official Notice of Sale and must be submitted on an official bid form.

Said bonds shall be of the denomination of \$5,000 each, shall be deliverable on the 10th day of November, 1976, or as soon thereafter as shall be practicable, shall be paid for in Federal Funds, and all shall be issued with interest coupons attached thereto which shall state the name of the loan, the amount of interest each coupon represents, the number of each individual coupon and the date and place each coupon is payable. The principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the State Fiscal Agent, Baltimore, Maryland 21203. The said bonds may be registered as to principal at the option and expense of the owner thereof on the books of the State Treasurer, which registration shall be noted thereon by the State Treasurer; and thereafter no transfer of such bonds shall be valid unless made on the said books of the State Treasurer by the owner in person, or his duly authorized attorney; but the same may be reregistered to bearer and thereafter shall be transferable by delivery until again registered in the owner's name as before, but in no event shall the registration thereof prevent the negotiability of the coupons thereof by delivery.

On the opening of said proposals, the bonds may be awarded by the Board, or a majority thereof, to the responsible bidder or bidders therefor for cash, whose proposal results in the lowest net interest cost to the State, and the net interest cost will be determined by computing the aggregate amount of interest payable on the bonds from their date to their respective maturities and by deducting from such aggregate amount the premium offered, if any.

If two or more responsible bidders have made bids resulting in the same lowest net interest cost to the State, then such bonds shall be awarded by lot to one of such responsible bidders, as required by the Consolidating Act.

The Board reserves the right, in its discretion, to reject any or all bids.

The Governor, Comptroller of the Treasury, and the Treasurer, or a majority of them (constituting the Board of Public Works) shall cause to be prepared bonds in good and sufficient form for the amount of said loan in substantially the form submitted to this meeting and filed with the minutes thereof.

3. <u>DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE -</u> <u>ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH ADMINISTRATION:</u>

Resubmission of a request by the Environmental Health Administration of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene for the approval of an amendment to the Board of Public Works Policy relating to State Sewer Construction Grants, approved August 28, 1973.

In accordance with the request of the Board of Public Works at its meeting on August 4, 1976, the Environmental Health Administration has submitted an addition to the policy for the use of State Sewerage Construction Grant Funds, approved August 28, 1973, to be known as paragraph "f", and requests the Board's approval.

The entire policy, including the additional section "f" is as follows:

- a. That no Federal-State grant combination shall exceed $87\frac{1}{2}$ percent unless the combined Federal grant exceeds 75%, in which case the State shall contribute half of the non-Federal share.
- b. That Federal grants are defined as the total of Federal grants from all sources for a particular project.
- c. That maximum Federal grant be defined as the largest amount of money offered or likely to be offered by Federal agencies for a particular project.
- d. That, in the event a Federal grant is increased after Board action has occurred on a State grant, an immediate adjustment in the State grant, as appropriate, shall be automatic.

11. STATE PUBLIC SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM:

APPEAL STATEMENT - AUGUST 18, 1975 BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS HEARING FOR THE FAIRMONT HEIGHTS SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL

I AM JESSE WARR, VICE CHAIRMAN OF THE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION.

THE INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE HAS RECOMMENDED THAT \$80,000 BE ALLOCATED FOR PLANNING THE ADDITION AND RENOVATION TO FAIRMONT HEIGHTS SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL. \$257,000 WAS REQUESTED IN FY 1977 BASED ON A CONSTRUCTION COST OF 5.5 MILLION DOLLARS. THE INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE HAS FURTHER STATED THAT THIS ALLOCATION IS CONTINGENT UPON THE COMMUNITY AND THE BOARD OF EDUCATION WORKING TOGETHER TO REDUCE THE CURRENT ESTIMATE OF COST.

REDUCTION OF COST CAN ONLY BE EFFECTED THROUGH REDUCTION OF THE SCOPE AND CAPACITY OF THE PROJECT. BASED ON THE PROPOSED ALLOCATION, ALL NEW CONSTRUCTION, INCLUDING THE AUDITORIUM AND THE NEW INSTRUCTIONAL SPACE, WILL BE SACRIFICED. PLANNING FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$80,000 THROUGH THE DESIGN DEVELOPMENT STAGE WILL PROVIDE FOR A PROJECT ESTIMATED TO COST APPROXIMATELY 3.8 MILLION DOLLARS WHICH WILL BE JUST ENOUGH TO RENOVATE THE EXISTING BUILDING WHICH HAS A GROSS AREA OF 148,278 SQUARE FEET. IN ADDITION, THE CAPACITY OF THE SCHOOL WILL HAVE TO BE REDUCED FROM AN EXISTING CAPACITY OF 1,325 TO 1,125 - A REDUCTION OF 200 STUDENTS OR 8 TEACHING STATIONS.

THE EXISTING FACILITIES DO NOT MEET THE STANDARDS FOR THE EXECUTION OF THE CURRENTLY APPROVED EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM. MANY OF THE FACILITIES ARE SMALL AND/OR INAPPROPRIATELY DESIGNED. FOR EXAMPLE — THE MEDIA CENTER, HOME ECONOMICS AND MUSIC AREAS ARE LESS THAN 50% OF THAT REQUIRED, AND THE INDUSTRIAL ARTS AREAS DO NOT CONTAIN THE FACILITIES TO SUPPORT THE CURRENT PROGRAM. THE DETAILS OF SPACE INADEQUACIES ARE SHOWN IN THE ATTACHED JUSTIFICATION WHICH WAS SUBMITTED WITH THE FY 1977 PROJECT.

THE PROJECT WAS SUBMITTED FOR A CAPACITY OF 1,325 STUDENTS AND INCLUDES AN AUDITORIUM AND APPROXIMATELY 10,000 SQUARE FEET OF NEW INSTRUCTIONAL SPACE FOR THE EXPANSION OF FACILITIES AS REQUIRED TO MEET THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM.

THE FUNDING REQUESTED WAS FOR A CAPACITY OF 1,325 BASED ON THE ALLOWABLE 172,250 SQUARE FEET OF AREA AND UNIT COSTS INFLATED TO JULY 1978 IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE INTERAGENCY COMMITTEE PUBLISHED PROCEDURES. INFLATION IS LESS THAN THAT PREDICTED AND THE ACTUAL COST WILL, IN ALL PROBABILITY, BE LESS. HOWEVER, THE IMPORTANT POINT IS THAT THE PROJECT BE PLANNED TO PROVIDE THE FACILITIES REQUIRED TO MEET THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM FOR THE EXISTING 1,325 STUDENT CAPACITY.

WE REQUEST THAT THE PLANNING FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$257,000 BE APPROVED AS REQUESTED. THIS WILL ALLOW FOR THE PLANNING AND CONSTRUCTION OF FACILITIES WHICH WILL SUPPORT THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM.

IF THIS REQUEST IS NOT APPROVED, THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM AT FAIRMONT HEIGHTS SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL WILL BE SERIOUSLY CURTAILED. COURSES SUCH AS INDUSTRIAL ARTS, HOME ECONOMICS, FOREIGN LANGUAGES, DRAMA, ETC. WILL BE REDUCED IN SCOPE OR PERHAPS ELIMINATED ALTOGETHER DEPENDING UPON THE PROGRAM SPECIFIED BY THE EDUCATIONAL SPECIFICATIONS.

THE BOARD OF EDUCATION, THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE, THE COUNTY COUNCIL, STATE SENATORS AND DELEGATES AND THE COMMUNITY ARE UNITED IN THIS APPEAL TO RESTORE THE FUNDS FOR PLANNING, AND CONSEQUENTLY THE SCOPE AND CAPACITY OF THIS PROJECT AS REQUESTED FOR FAIRMONT HEIGHTS SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL. AN AFFIRMATIVE RESPONSE BY THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS WILL REAFFIRM THE ORIGINAL PRECEPTS OF THE STATE CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM — THAT IS TO PROVIDE A QUALITY EDUCATION FOR EVERY STUDENT IN THE STATE OF MARYLAND.

FAIRMONT HEIGHTS SENIOR HIGH, AFTER BEING BUILT IN 1954, HAS

NEVER RECEIVED ANY FUNDS FOR RENOVATION. THIS, TO THOSE I REPRESENT, APPEARS TO BE AN EFFORT BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION THROUGH PLANNED NEGLECT TO FORCE THE SCHOOL TO BE CLOSED. WE ARE AWARE THAT THE STATE CONSTRUCTION COMMITTEE WILL ONLY APPROVE RENOVATION FUNDS WHEN THOSE FUNDS CONSTITUTE LESS THAN 50% OF THE COST TO BUILD A NEW STRUCTURE; HOWEVER, WE FEEL JUSTIFIED IN REQUESTING THAT THE PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE GRANT MORE THAN THE \$80,000 BECAUSE THE SCHOOL IN QUESTION NEVER RECEIVED ANY MONEY FOR RENOVATION. THERFORE, IN ORDER FOR THE SCHOOL TO RECEIVE EQUAL TREATMENT, WE ARE REQUESTING THAT THE BOARD, IN ADDITION TO GRANTING MORE MONEY THAN REQUESTED BY IAC, DO SO WITH THE STIPULATION THAT FAIRMONT HEIGHTS NOT BE JUDGED ON THE USUAL CONSTRUCTION FORMULA; ALSO, MONIES BE SPENT ON WHATEVER PROJECTS ARE DEEMED NEG * AND THE COMMUNITY AND THE BOARD OF EDUCATION THE DECIDE WHAT IS NECESSARY IN THE SCHOOL FOR EQUAL EDUCATION WITHOUT THE DESIGN OF THE FORMULA BEING PRESENT.

WE MAKE THIS REQUEST WITH FULL KNOWLEDGE OF THE WHAT THE USUAL PROCEIMPE HAS BEEN, HOWEVER, BECAUSE OF YEARS OF NEGLECT WE FELL THAT PARITY CAN ONLY TAKE PLACE IN THIS UNIQUE CASE IF DISREGARD THE FORMULA AND CONCENTRATE ON MONIES NECESSARY TO MAKE FAIRMONT HEIGHTS

- i. The entire industrial arts facilities need to be changed to a new type of program. This would consist of changing the individual spaces for photography, wood, drafting, graphics, trowel trades, and interior decorating into power and transportation, visual communication, construction, and industrial communications.
- j. An area of approximately 5,800 sq. ft. which was designed as an auto mechanics facility needs to be converted to other uses since this course is no longer being taught.
- k. Other program changes need to be made.
- 1. Physical education exercise rooms need to be added as they do not now have them and utilize one of the locker rooms.

The plans for the resulting 53 teaching stations include 11 vocational education teaching stations, there are presently 13 which means 2 are planned to be deleted. (State Department letter on vocational education is attached.)

Planning funds are being requested in FY 1977 for this project in order that it can be completed in FY 1980.

Attachment A

Project Title: Fairmont Heights Senior High School Renovation/Addition

Justification:

This plant was originally occupied in 1951 with an addition in 1955 with few other alterations having been accomplished. Similar to other educational facilities of the county constructed in the same time period, it lacks many of the support facilities and is in need of updating to meet the current educational program requirements of the Educational Master Plan for the Prince George's County Schools. It has no air conditioning system facilitating year-round use which is considered an essential component of an educational facility in this geographical area and in keeping with the Board of Education Policy.

The existing structure is comprised of 148,278 sq. ft. and contains 53 teaching stations which is approximately only 111 sq. ft. per student allocation compared to 130 sq. ft. per student for current standards. Consequently, we are requesting that an addition of 23,972 be constructed for expansion and an 800-seat auditorium. Many facilities are short of space while some needed facilities are non-existant. Following are some examples:

- a. Art area is approximately two-thirds of standard size.
- b. Music area is approximately 60 per cent of standard size.
- c. No multi-purpose room. Cafeteria is small (2,300 sq. ft.) with no stage as normally found in a multi-purpose room. Nor is there any auditorium. A makeshift portable stage is set up in the gym when needed for the purpose of programs, etc. An auditorium is needed to provide for a functional space for large group instruction, lectures, demonstrations, and forum discussions as an extension of the classroom as well as being a required facility for the performing arts, music, drama, and dance. In addition, work experience is provided for other creative arts and combined under stage-craft dealing with wood, cloth, form, color, texture, and lighting. The auditorium provides for extracurricular programs and assembling students for other school purposes.
- d. Two general purpose classrooms are utilized for typing and are small for this purpose.
- e. A storage room is utilized as a student activity room.
- f. No driver ed lab.
- g. Media center is less than one-half the current standard size.
- h. Teachers have one area of 995 sq. ft. for lounge and planning. Since this is a four-story structure, planning areas need to be provided on each of the different floors.

In June, 1972, we acquired a 17 ± acre site on U.S. Route 50, near Berlin, Worcester County, Maryland, for the purpose of constructing a police barracks thereon. Prior to acquisition, percolation tests were made by the Department of General Services. We were informed these tests were satisfactory for a septic system. After the land was deeded to this agency and after plans were in the development stage, we learned from the Department of General Services that the Worcester County Health Department would not give approval for construction since they contend we would need a "back up site" in the event the first septic system failed. There apparently is no second area on the site which is satisfactory and it has become necessary to acquire additional acreage adjacent to the parcel acquired. The Department of General Services has negotiated for another 2.3 acres adjacent to our property. This acreage is owned by Mr. Charles W. Lewis and his asking price is \$13,860.

Mr. Louis L. Goldstein, Comptroller, spoke with me this date and suggested I contact you and ask you to intercede in our behalf with appropriate officials in Worcester County. He is quite concerned over the need for buying this additional acreage, particularly for the sum involved, when we have what appears to be a large site of our own.
