On items where payments are to be made from proceeds of the above listed bond issues, full regard is given to the provisions of each Act and its prospective amendments.

Except as otherwise provided in these Acts, before the State agency or institution responsible for an individual item may begin work with funds secured under the Act, the agency or institution shall provide satisfactory assurances to the Board of Public Works that the work described in the individual items can be completed with the funds specified for that item.

If federal funds are available to help accomplish any project identified in these Acts, the State agency or institution responsible for the project shall make efforts through proper administrative procedures to obtain these federal funds. Before spending any funds secured under these Acts, the agency or institution shall certify its efforts to the Board of Public Works and state the reason for any failure to obtain federal funds. If federal funds are obtained, they shall be used to defray the costs of the project described in these Acts, not to expand its scope, except in the case of projects for State parks and recreation areas of the Department of Natural Resources funded from the proceeds of the General Construction Loans of 1973 through 1980. These latter projects may be expanded in scope beyond that proposed in the specific appropriation in these Acts if the addition of Federal funds makes this possible, but not beyond the total park acreage or area to which it applies, as evident from the master plan for State parks and recreation are as adopted by the Department of Natural Resources.

MARYLAND AGRICULTURAL COST-SHARE PROGRAM GRANT REQUESTS (CONT.)

Each of these projects has received technical certification from the appropriate Soil Conservation District Office and has been determined to be eligible for cost-share funds by the Maryland Department of Agriculture. The farmer has signed the requisite cost-share agreement and accepts the conditions under which the grant is made.

The Maryland General Assembly enacted Chapter 405 (H.B. 1202) of the Agriculture Article, "Cost-Sharing - Water Pollution Control", in 1982 to create a program allowing persons to seek State cost-sharing funds for projects that will reduce agriculturally-related non-point sources of water pollution. State regulations (15.01.05) governing the Maryland Agricultural Cost-Share Program were promulgated in May, 1983.

The Maryland General Assembly further enacted S.B. 125, "Conservation Grants Capital Appropriation for Fiscal Year 1999", to provide a source of funds for the cost-share program. Under this appropriation "5.9 million dollars (\$5,900,000) may be used by the Board of Public Works to provide grants for the projects to control agriculturally related non-point sources of pollution. (This is authorized by Agricultural Article Section 8-701 to 8-705)."

GAP manufacturers fabricated pipe, pipe fittings and valves, specializing in pipe fittings and wholesale plumbing equipment. GAP's sales and administrative offices are located in Langhorne, Pennsylvania. The present owners acquired all of the assets of GAP in 1995 including the right to use the trade name Trenton Pipe Nipple Company (TPN). Present owners took over the lease in 1995, and retained all of the employees. This project comes about because GAP is exercising its option to purchase the facility.

The MICRF loan will have a term of 15 years with an interest rate of 4.69% per annum with quarterly payments of principal and interest. The MICRF Loan will be secured by a first deed of trust. Other participants involved in financing this project will subordinate their interest to the Department. We have received two appraisals on the property for an average of \$1,270,000 (loan to value of 32%). Federalsburg will be providing a 40% full faith and credit guaranty.

Currently GAP employs 20 full-time workers in Federalsburg, Maryland and hopes to hire up to 13 additional workers over the next few years. As a result of GAP owning the property rather than leasing, stronger ties will be established with the Town of Federalsburg and Caroline County. For this reason, DBED considers this project an appropriate use of MICRF funds and endorses approval as presented.

The Department of General Services is requesting approval to amend COMAR 04.03.01.04 to read: "Excess Property that is no longer needed by the State may be sold without obtaining competitive bids or donated to a local jurisdiction or nonprofit organization upon approval by the Secretary of General Services or the Secretary's designee at no lower than the Assistant Secretary's level.

The purpose of this proposed amendment is to allow the Department to dispose of excess property without Board approval of every disposal, as permitted by Section 4-504. This change would allow the Department of General Services to process the donations and preferential sales more expediently so that the non-profit organizations and local subdivisions can gain the maximum useful life of the assets.

If the Board approves this item, the Department will submit the proposed change to the AELR and to the Maryland Register in accordance with required procedures.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Request For Proposals (RFP) was advertised in the Maryland Contract Weekly and on the Internet. A copy of the solicitation was sent directly to 50 vendors, of which 22 were Maryland firms and 5 were MBEs. There were 4 offerors that submitted proposals in response to the RFP. Of the 4 proposals, 3 were fully consistent with the requirements of the RFP. In addition, 1 proposal, from Essentium, Inc., provided an alternate approach for the delivery of services included in the RFP. Since alternate proposals were permitted by the RFP, this 4th proposal was evaluated concurrently with the other 3 proposals.

All 4 offerors were determined to be technically qualified to provide the required services or an acceptable variation thereof. The 3 offerors with proposals which are fully compliant with the RFP are being recommended for award. The alternate proposal is not being recommended for an award because its initial cost to provide the alternate solution was judged to exceed the anticipated benefit. All 3 offerors have agreed to attempt to achieve a 14% MBE subcontracting participation in this contract.

**REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS:** A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised in the Maryland Contract Weekly. A total of 30 copies of the RFP were mailed to vendors, of which 22 were Maryland firms and 5 were MBEs. A total of 6 offers were received for the DHMO dental plan and a total of 3 offers were received for the POS dental plan.

Copies of the RFP were mailed to 29 vendors, of which 20 were Maryland firms and 3 were MBEs. Five vendors responded to this proposal. Two vendors indicated they were unable to submit a competitive proposal for self-insured PPO benefits coverage at this time.

An MBE participation goal, at either the prime or sub-contractor level, of 15% of the total administrative fees has been established for this contract. The recommended vendors have agreed to meet this goal by sub-contracting with Maryland MBE firms.

This is a multiple award contract for PPO plans. The PPO health care plan offers the largest selection of health care providers for State employees, retirees and their dependents with limited management of care. The State currently offers 2 PPO plans. This procurement maintains the employees/retirees choice of selecting from among 2 vendors.

The plans summary for the benefits booklet, all materials to be used at over 100 benefit fairs that will be held around the State during the open enrollment period, and any other advertising materials related to the plans must be approved by DBM's Employee Benefits personnel prior to publishing or implementation. Consequently, the selected vendors must start its contract implementation/outreach efforts in August 1999, in order to meet the various above described time frames.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised in the Maryland Contract Weekly. Copies of the solicitation were sent directly to 17 public and private entities within the State of Maryland. Additionally, a one page Notice of Funding Availability was sent to 17 other public and private entities within Maryland. No MBE subcontracting goal was established for this solicitation because current vendors are either local government agencies or are the type of private non-profits which can not be certified as MBE's. 



On September 23, 1998, via DOT Item 22-GM, the BPW approved the MAA's request to delegate to the MAA authority to enter into contractual agreements regarding the acquisition and relocation of residents of Ridgewood Mobile Home Park (Park). The Park was acquired by MAA (Item 18-RP, 7/17/98 BPW) to remove residents from areas exposed to noise levels incompatible with residential land use. In Item 22-GM the BPW approved delegated authority not to exceed \$30,000.00 for single-width mobile homes and \$50,000.00 for double-width mobile homes.

The subject single-width mobile home exceeds the dollar limit due to the expense of relocating the owner's legal business operation which is located on the property. Consistent with the Federal Uniform Relocation Act, the owner is entitled to a fixed payment of \$20,000.00 as compensation for business moving expenses and business re-establishment costs.

### REMARKS

The renovation of the Tawes A Pod allows for the transformation of the existing building into a new, up-to-date building housing the administrative offices of the District Courts of Maryland and the Administrative Office of the Courts. Upon the opening of the nearby Robert F. Sweeney District Court last year, all other agencies vacated the A Pod building with the exception of the Department of Natural Resources Communications Center, located in the Tawes A Pod basement.

The DNR Communications Center is a 24-hour facility which provides two vital functions for the citizens of the State of Maryland. It is the center for all radio communication between DNR ranger and police personnel. More importantly, it serves as the central emergency center for all DNR police communication, search and rescue situations.

The new Center's design will continue to provide essential communication services to the citizens of Maryland, even in times of natural disaster.

The approval of this construction contract modification will allow for the renovation for the Courts (A Pod) to proceed unimpeded by the ongoing daily operation of the DNR Communications Center and also allow the Communications Center to move from their cramped three room location in the basement of the Tawes A Pod into renovated offices in the basement of the Tawes E Pod. At the same time, this move makes the A Pod exclusively Judicial and Pods B, C D and E exclusively the Department of Natural Resources.

#### REMARKS

Fort Frederick is a stone-walled fortification built 1756-57 to protect English frontier settlers during the French and Indian Wars. The Fort is unique because of its large size and stone construction, most frontier forts of the period were built of wood and earth. Though never attacked, Fort Frederick served as an important supply base for English campaigns. The Fort was abandoned in 1763, but then converted to a prison camp during the American Revolution. After the Revolution, the Fort was allowed to deteriorate and was sold by the State in 1791. The Fort was briefly occupied by Union Forces during the Civil War, and it was part of a a farm when purchased by the State in 1922 for use as a park. Excavation and stabilization were undertaken by the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) during the 1930s. Additional historical and archeological investigation and some reconstruction took place during the 1970s.

Historical Research - After reviewing previous research, the consultant will carry out new research utilizing computer searches, indexes, and other aides developed during the quarter century since the last sustained historical research on Fort Frederick. A preliminary written report will be submitted to the Department of General Services.

Eligible project costs total \$360,875 and consist of Construction (\$327,500), Contingency (\$16,375), and Utility Hook Up (\$15,000), and Permits and Testing (\$2,000). These costs will be funded as follows:


There are no Federal grant funds available for this project.

"If within 30 years after completion of a project or facility with respect to which funds have been paid under Subtitle 6 of Title 24 of the Health General Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland (the "Subtitle"), the Property is sold or transferred to any person, agency or organization that would not qualify as an applicant under said Subtitle, or that is not approved as a transferee by the Board of Public Works, or if, within the same period, the improvements cease to be a "facility" as defined in said Subtitle, then the State shall be entitled to recover from either the owner, transferor, or transferee an amount bearing the same ratio to the then current fair market value of so much of the Property as constituted an approved project, as the amount of the State participation bore to the total eligible cost of the approved project, together with all costs and reasonable attorneys' fees incurred by the State in the recovery proceedings."

No State funds will be disbursed until such time as the loan recipient has presented suitable evidence to the Comptroller that it has expended its portion of the required matching funds for this project. After the loan recipient has met this requirement, all future invoices will be submitted to the Comptroller, who will disburse the State portion in amounts equal to the invoices submitted.

Bonds to support this transaction have been sold and monies are available.

As part of the Department's outreach efforts to enhance local resident business participation, direct mail advertisements were forwarded to various business and trade organizations in Maryland.

The MBE goal for this project is 20%.
