On items where payments are to be made from proceeds of the above listed bond issues, full regard is given to the provisions of each Act and its prospective amendments.

Except as otherwise provided in these Acts, before the State agency or institution responsible for an individual item may begin work with funds secured under the Act, the agency or institution shall provide satisfactory assurances to the Board of Public Works that the work described in the individual items can be completed with the funds specified for that item.

If federal funds are available to help accomplish any project identified in these Acts, the State agency or institution responsible for the project shall make efforts through proper administrative procedures to obtain these federal funds. Before spending any funds secured under these Acts, the agency or institution shall certify its efforts to the Board of Public Works and state the reason for any failure to obtain federal funds. If federal funds are obtained, they shall be used to defray the costs of the project described in these Acts, not to expand its scope, except in the case of projects for State parks and recreation areas of the Department of Natural Resources funded from the proceeds of the General Construction Loans of 1973 through 1980. These latter projects may be expanded in scope beyond that proposed in the specific appropriation in these Acts if the addition of Federal funds makes this possible, but not beyond the total park acreage or area to which it applies, as evident from the master plan for State parks and recreation areas adopted by the Department of Natural Resources.

1. STATE PUBLIC SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM:

Submission of a report prepared by the Public School Construction Program on the maintenance survey of selected public schools in the State of Maryland. During Fiscal Year 1998 a total of 101 public schools were inspected throughout the State. The inspections were performed by the Department of General Services for the Interagency Committee on School Construction. This is the eighteenth year that inspections have been performed. The Maintenance Survey Report for Public School Buildings (September 1998) describes the rationale for the surveys, the methods used, summarizes the ratings from prior surveys, and presents the results of the survey for Fiscal Year 1998.

There were a total of 101 schools inspected in the 24 school systems. Fifty-three (53) were rated "superior" or "very good." Forty-five (45) schools were rated "good," three (3) schools were rated "fair," and no schools received a "poor" rating this year.

The schools that received a rating of "superior" will receive a Governor's Citation. They are identified below:

2. BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS - WETLANDS LICENSES:

Approval is requested of the following applications for wetlands licenses for projects involving dredging and filling in the navigable waters of Maryland under Title 16, Environment Article, Annotated Code of Maryland. THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS' WETLANDS ADMINISTRATOR RECOMMENDS THAT A LICENSE BE GRANTED AS INDICATED IN EACH OF THE FOLLOWING CASES IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE STATE WETLANDS LICENSE PROCEDURES SET FORTH IN COMAR 23.02.04. This recommendation has been fully concurred with by the Department of the Environment.

98-1990 CHARLES LANGLEY - to emplace a 300 feet long stone revetment within a maximum of 16 feet channelward of the mean high water line - Combs Creek off of Rosebank Road near Leonardtown in St. Mary's County.

Application received June 17, 1998. Public comment period ended September 1, 1998. MDE Report and Recommendation approving works as above described received October 1, 1998.

OHESAPEAKE YACHT CLUB, INC. - to mechanically maintenance dredge a 250 feet long by 50 feet wide area to 6 feet depth at mean low water and a 60 feet long by 20 feet wide area to 5 feet depth at mean low water; to transport approximately 110 cubic yards of dredgate to the approved Annapolis Sand and Gravel Company disposal facility; and to construct a 30 feet long by 15 feet wide floating dock, a 12 feet long by 4 feet wide ramp and a 96 feet long timber wave break within a maximum of 43 feet channelward of the mean high water line - South Creek off of Hine Drive at Shady Side in Anne Arundel County.

This marina has pumpout and waste reception facilities.

Application received June 24, 1998. Public comment period ended September 1, 1998. MDE Report and Recommendation approving works as above described received September 21, 1998.

The replacement cost for a new chiller is approximately \$95,000 with 8 weeks delivery time.

On May 18, 1998, the motor section of the Trane Chiller in the Central Power Plant failed. This failure was the result of the fiberglass tape that was used to wrap the windings being destroyed by the refrigerant resulting in fiberglass strands clogging the return oil and refrigerant lines. The tape utilized was a manufacturer specified material. The motor failure caused the University to take emergency measures to maintain the air conditioning to several dormitory and academic buildings since classes were still in session. This entailed the rental of a temporary chiller and installation of lines necessary to keep the buildings cool. Green Contracting Company was contacted as they had successfully performed two large mechanical contracts at Towson University over the past several years, including replacement of the cooling tower and installation of boilers. Towson University determined the price for this temporary chiller to be fair and reasonable.

The Office of the State Comptroller has verified, under Control Number 98-6405-1111 that the recommended contractor is not delinquent in the payment of its Maryland tax obligations. Verification has also been obtained from the Comptroller's Office, that the contractor is appropriately registered to conduct business within the State to the extent required by the laws of Maryland. The contractor IS a resident business under the guidelines of BPW Advisory P-003-95.



REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Request for Proposals (RFP) was advertised in the Maryland Contract Weekly. Copies of the solicitation were mailed directly to 14 prospective vendors, 11 of which were Maryland firms, as well as to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs. A 14% MBE goal has been established for this contract.

Four offers were received in response to the solicitation. Of the four offers received, one was found to be not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. All selected contractors have agreed to commit to the 14% minority business enterprise requirement of the solicitation. Vendors who did not submit bids indicated that the scope of work was beyond their capacity or they were only interested in sub-contracting opportunities.

These are blanket purchase order contracts that allow State and local government agencies to purchase Toll Free and Call Center services on an as needed basis.

Maryland law requires all State agencies to have toll free access to their agencies and officials. By providing 800/888 services, the caller is not assessed long distance charges for dialing any State agency or official. Thus, citizens are assured telephone access to State government at no cost. Since both recommended toll free services contractors are providing inter-state and intra-state, inter-LATA toll free services to the State, the resulting contracts are controlled by federally filed tariffs.

Due to a recent Supreme Court decision related to federally filed tariffs under the Telecommunications Act of 1996, all contracts entered into with any telecommunications carrier subject to the tariffs are controlled by the terms of the tariff. Such tariffs are filed with the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and/or the Maryland Public Service Commission (PSC), and the tariff controls any rates and/or all state claims made under or in conjunction with those contracts.

The use of multiple providers in this circumstance gives the State a greater variety of service offerings. Selecting two Toll Free service providers will protect the State in the event either toll free service provider substantially alters its tariff in the form of services or cost of services available to the State under the tariff and this contract. The contract allows the State to terminate with either or both vendors if existing tariffs are altered in a manner which is not in the best interest of the State.

The Call Center category of services will allow agencies to further enhance services to Maryland citizens. By dialing a toll free number provided by one of the above contractors, citizens will reach an answering point located in Bethesda, Maryland that will be staffed and operated twentyfour hours per day and 365 days a year. Citizens will have quick and easy access via one toll free number to any agency utilizing the service. The result will be a timely and more uniform response to any citizen inquiry.

It is anticipated that in addition to answering citizen calls promptly and courteously, the provision of a database feature will enhance the ability to provide pertinent information to the caller on demand. The database will contain information agencies deem essential to provide to their customers. All of this will improve customer satisfaction.

The Office of the State Comptroller has verified, under Control Numbers 98-6022-1111 (AT&T), 98-6437-0011 (MCI), and 98-6038-0111 (Biospherics), that the recommended contractors have no known deficiencies in the payment of their Maryland tax obligations. REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: The solicitation notice was advertised in the Maryland Contract Weekly. In addition, over 200 copies of the Request for Proposals (RFP) were mailed to various public and private entities, including Maryland certified Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) contractors. Five proposals were received. One proposal was deemed not reasonably susceptible of being selected for award. Of the four remaining technically acceptable proposals, MS Technologies Corporation was determined to have the most advantageous offer and is recommended for the award of this contract

Although MS Technologies' price was much lower than the other acceptable offerors (see Atachment), it has considerable experience in the area of the contract and is judged to be capable of providing the required services at the offerred price. MS Technologies is also a Maryland certified MBE contractor.

There are approximately 260,000 covered lives (individuals) in the State's health benefits programs. This number includes approximately 70,000 employees, 27,000 retirees, 2,000 Satellite employees, 1,500 Direct Pay members, and their covered dependents. Approximately 30% or 30,000 of the employees and retirees make enrollment changes during open enrollment. Outside the open enrollment period approximately 2,000 new enrollments and non-open enrollment transactions are processed each month.

The current administration of benefits is a very labor-intensive, antiquated process that lacks both efficiency and integrity. At this time, enrollment and eligibility information for the approximately 260,000 covered lives described above, is housed in 13 fragmented old legacy databases on a combination of mainframe and personal computer platforms.

The Interactive Voice Response (IVR) and the Benefits Administration System (BAS) will facilitate health benefits enrollment both during the open enrollment period and for all other benefit transactions throughout the year. The systems will consolidate existing enrollment and eligibility data onto one database (BAS) while allowing data input by telephone and other electronic media by eligible members.

ITEM: 2-S (Cont)

The use of these systems will facilitate the correction of current operational difficulties created by the existing 13 fragmented legacy databases and help maximize customer service. The BAS will consolidate all enrollment and eligibility information into one database, streamlining operations and making access and dissemination of the information much more efficient.

This will allow current data processing staff to be better utilized as customer service representatives, increasing the number of staff who can speak directly to members to assist with enrollment questions. Data consolidation onto BAS will also maximize the efficiency and accuracy of data transferred to our health plan vendors, and allow vendors to perform their internal systems updates more timely.

The IVR system will supplement, but not entirely replace, the current use of scannable forms for gathering enrollment data. The IVR will be a much more convenient medium for members, allowing them to enroll at a time most convenient to them, as well as providing a means to confirm enrollment and benefit selections by telephone. Confirmation of benefits may be faxed or a confirmation letter will be mailed to a member the same day that the member's request is received

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Invitation For Bids (IFB) was advertised in the Maryland Contact Weekly and posted on the Comptroller's Bid Board. Initially copies of the solicitation were sent directly to eight vendors, three of which were certified MBE's. Subsequent to the initial mailing, eleven additional solicitations were mailed. Of the 19 total solicitations distributed, 11 were Maryland vendors. The solicitation was also listed in the Comptroller of the Treasury's contract brochure that has been distributed throughout the year at various MBE Outreach fairs.

There were two phases of the bid, technical offer and financial bid. The technical phase determined which bidders were capable of performing this service. Two technical offers were received, both of which met the minimum technical qualifications. Two vendors that declined to submit bids indicated that they were inexperienced in the work/commodities required and the minimum specifications required for the solicitation, and stated that the bonding/insurance requirements were too costly. Another reason for a low response rate to this solicitation is because contractors must be able to provide national coverage and have a minimum of three state-vendor experience.

ITEM: 3-S (Cont)

It is beneficial to Maryland to have as many qualified contractors as possible providing this service. Different vendors have different specialties, different databases, and different geographic focus. Hence, multiple contractors offer greater combined revenue potential for Maryland than any single vendor could afford. Accordingly, since both vendors which submitted offers are technically acceptable, both are recommended for award. In fact, the Division would have preferred for even more technically qualified vendors to have responded and received awards.

However, having multiple contractors introduces the potential for duplication of effort. To avoid this, the Compliance Division requires each contractor to provide advance notice of each intended recovery intiative. The Division will not approve an intiative another contractor has already started. It will also not approve an initiative in a state that performs its own recoveries, since such states notify Maryland of any recoveries and will share the revenue from those recoveries with Maryland without the involvement of a contractor.

The RFP under which these contracts are being awarded had a MBE subcontract participation goal of 14%. This is the first time an MBE subcontracting goal had been established for this type of service. However, both vendors requested, and were granted, waivers from this goal. Both contractors are located outside of Maryland and do virtually all of their revenue efforts outside of Maryland. No Maryland certified MBEs operate in the revenue recovery field outside of Maryland, hence there are no subcontracting opportunities which could satisfy the goal.

Nevertheless, both contractors have provided documentation that they contract with non-Maryland certified minority businesses in their home states. Both have also committed to using Maryland certified MBE subcontractors if they should perform work in Maryland.

Reciprocal preference was reviewed but was not applied under the recommended awards because no Maryland based vendors submitted proposals. Moreover, New York and Massachusetts, the home states of the successful offerors, do not apply a residency preference for resident vendors of services covered by this contract.

The Office of the State Comptroller has verified, under Control Numbers <u>98-6227-0000</u> and <u>98-6213-1000</u>, that the recommended contractors, NAPPCO and State Street Bank & Trust, respectively, have no known deficiencies in the payment of their Maryland tax obligations. REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Although services are described as being provided to 36 individuals, 2 individuals will receive both day and residential services. Hence only 34 separate individuals are covered by this contract. Of these 34 individuals, 2 are diagnosed with mild mental retardation, 2 individuals with moderate mental retardation, 3 individuals with severe mental retardation and 27 individuals function within the profound range of mental retardation.

All 34 individuals need awake overnight staff coverage, 1 individual needs direct nursing services, 2 individuals need sign language interpreter services and 4 individuals need 20 hour per week additional staff support. Twenty four of these individuals are non-ambulatory and incontinent. Individuals #1 and #4 will receive both residential and day augmentation services. The following describes each individual's disability:

Individual #1, is a 34 year old male who is diabetic and deaf.

Individual #2, is a 22 year old male who is deaf and has behavioral problems.

Individual #3, is a 43 year old male who is frequently awake at night which results in behavioral problems. If not closely supervised at night, he frequently injures himself.

Individual #4, is a 27 year old male who is diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy with extreme spasticity.

Individual #5, is a 51 year old male who has limited control over his body movements due to severe spasticity and an active seizure disorder.

Individual #6, is a 56 year old female who is a double amputee with chronic ulcers on stumps; she is unable to sit unsupported.

Individual #7, is a 39 year old female who is totally dependent on others for all of her needs.

Individual #8, is a 26 year old female who has seizure disorders, is unable to take anything by mouth and is fed throughout the night through a gastrostomy tube.

Individual #9, is a 25 year old female who is unable to maintain body positions without support.

Individual #10, is a 48 year old female who is unable to maintain a sitting position without support and is totally dependent for all her needs.

Individual #11, is a 47 year old female who is blind and will engage in severe self abuse, if not closely and consistently monitored and worked with.

Individual #12, is a 30 year old female who is dependent on others for all of her needs.

Individual #13, is a 40 year old female who is blind and is medicated for an active seizure disorder.

Individual #14, is a 35 year old female who is dependent on others for all self help skills.

- Individual #15, is a 34 year old female who is dependent on others for all of her personal care needs.
- Individual #16, is a 27 year old male who is blind and is medicated for an active seizure disorder.
- Individual #17, is a 25 year old male who has continual leakage of urine and skin problems.
- Individual #18, is a 39 year old female who is dependent on others for all of her personal care activities. She is also very resistant to being touched, which complicates the ability to care for her.
- Individual #19, is a 35 year old female who must be very closely supervised because she has no sense of danger.
- Individual #20, is a 39 year old female who requires assistance in all areas of self care.
- Individual #21, is a 34 year old female who is medicated for an active seizure disorder.
- Individual #22, is a 56 year old male who is dependent on others for personal care activities.
- Individual #23, is a 31 year old male who is medicated for an active seizure disorder.
- Individual #24, is a 41 year old male who exhibits autistic symptoms of avoiding eye contact, is reluctant to interact with others, and is medicated for an active seizure disorder.
- Individual #25, is a 23 year old male who has a tongue thrust, which increases the difficulties in feeding him, and a seizure disorder.
- Individual #26, is a 36 year old male who has verified kidney damage and suffers from gastric reflux disease.
- Individual #27, is a 46 year old female who is unable to meet her personal care needs without the assistance of others.
- Individual #28, is a 44 year old female who is dependent on others for all of her personal care needs.
- Individual #29, is a 51 year old male who is totally dependent on others for all personal care activities.
- Individual #30, is a 22 year old male who is unable to take anything by mouth and has an active seizure disorder.
- Individual #31, is a 22 year old male who has a genetic defect which is characterized by malformation of the upper extremities (arms are about 8-9 inches) and growth retardation. He also has severe visual and hearing impairment.
- Individual #32, is a 23 year old male who has a diagnosis of cerebral palsy which is characterized by paralysis on the left side.



REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: A notice of the availability of the Invitation For Bids (IFB) was advertised in the Maryland Contract Weekly. A copy of the solicitation notice was sent directly to five vendors, three of which were Maryland firms. DLLR contacted the MD Department of Transportation's Minority Business Enterprise Office (MDOT-MBE) in an attempt to locate certified MBEs to which this solicitation could be mailed. MDOT-MBE reported that currently there are no Maryland certified MBEs providing credit reporting services. Therefore, no MBE subcontract participation goal was established for this IFB.

The MHIC requires new applicants for contractor's licenses to use a credit report to demonstrate solvency as required by Business Regulation Article, Section 8-303 (c)(1), Annotated Code of Maryland. Similarly, the Maryland Real Estate Commission (MREC) requires new applicants for real estate brokers' licenses to submit a credit report to establish financial solvency.

These new applicants (to either the MHIC or the MREC) are required to include a valid credit report with their application. In the past, new applicants have been faced with a wide range of charges and service response times for essentially identical credit reporting services. 

Effective 7/1/98 the annual per client rate increased by 4.7%, from \$86 to \$90. Federal and COMAR regulations also specify a base caseload funding amount which is not tied to the actual number of clients being served.

As of 7/1/98 this base amount increased from \$90,000 per year to \$100,000, an increase of 11.1%. \$54,333 is also being added to expand the Langley/Takoma Park clinic. The increases in these funding rates are partially offset by a decrease in the number of non-English speaking participants being served with a corresponding decrease in specialized funding for this purpose of \$77,868 for FY 99.

The Federal government provides virtually 100% of all WIC funding. This service was first put out for competitive procurement in the fall of 1995. At that time Federal regulations specified both the per client payment rate, as described above, that would be paid to the winning vendor and the type of vendor which had to be awarded the contract. Accordingly, it was interpreted at that time that these Federal requirements prevailed over typical State procurement provisions, which rendered this procurement exempt from normal State approvals, including that of the Board.

Since that time, the Federal regulations pertaining to the selection of a contractor have been relaxed. The previous rigid hierarchy is now only a mild preference. Therefore, if this contract were recompeted currently, it would no longer be considered exempt. Because of this, it is deemed appropriate to submit the described modification for Board approval, rather than continue to treat this as an exempt item.

Because of the former exempt status, the WIC Program did not anticipate obtaining Board approval before implementing the above described modifications. For this reason it did not submit this item for approval prior to 7/1/98.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: Since 1991 the Hospital has gradually lost most of its staff therapists because of pay disparity with the private sector. Beginning in 1993 the Hospital has had to rely on contractural physical and occupational therapists in order to provide basic services required by licensing and accrediting agencies.

The current procurement marks the first time since 1993 that there has been real competition for the provision of these services. Previously, only one or two bidders typically participated and bid prices were very high. Even then, however, the contractors had difficulty hiring staff to fully perform needed services.

The hourly rates under the contracts currently being submitted for approval are lower than the rates under the previous contract. The hourly bid rates under the contracts to be approved are \$38.50 for both occupational and physical therapists, \$46.50 for speech therapists, and \$29.42 for COTA. In comparison, the hourly rate for the incumbent for occupational and physical therapist services (speech therapist and COTA services weren't part of the previous contract) is \$48.50 per hour, \$10 per hour higher than the requested contract rates.

It is projected that under the requested awards, the contractors will provide 35-40 hours per week of each physical therapist, occupational therapist, and certified occupational therapist assistant (COTA) services and about 10 hours a month of speech therapist services.

Bowie State University requests the Board to make this finding explicit with respect to the Sodexho Marriott contract.

On September 28, 1998, the Circuit Court for Prince George's County entered a temporary restraining order, barring Bowie State University from commencing performance under the Sodexho Marriott food service contract because the Circuit Court found that "the Board of Public Works has not made a finding that the execution of the food services contract with Sodexho Marriott Services without delay is necessary to protect substantial State interest, as required by COMAR 21.10.02.11A". Bowie State University, consistent with the Board of Public works decision on September 2, 1998 believes that awarding the contract without delay is necessary to protect substantial State interests for the following reasons:

On September 17, 1998, DGS notified the Budget Committees of its plan to proceed with the above project.

The Office of the State Comptroller has verified, under Control Number 98-6462-0101, that the recommended contractor has no known deficiencies in the payment of its Maryland tax obligations. Verification has also been obtained from the Comptroller's Office, or Department of Assessments and Taxation, as applicable, that the contractor is appropriately registered to conduct business within the State to the extent required by the laws of Maryland.

The contractor IS a resident business under the guidelines of BPW Advisory P-003-95 Revised.
