Before spending any funds secured under these Acts, the agency or institution shall certify its efforts to the Board of Public Works and state the reason for any failure to obtain federal funds. If federal funds are obtained, they shall be used to defray the costs of the project described in these Acts, not to expand its scope.

Energy Performance Master Lease Modification

**CONTRACT:** Master lease-purchase financing agreement for Energy Performance Contracts at State facilities (EPC Lease Agreement).

**MODIFICATION REQUEST:** Amend the EPC Lease Agreement to: (1) permit financing of Energy Performance Contracts during the construction phase; and (2) extend the term by three months.

**CONTRACT APPROVED:** 9/22/2004 BPW Secretary's Agenda Item 10.

ORIGINAL TERM: September 30, 2004 through September 30, 2007

MODIFIED TERM: September 30, 2004 through December 21, 2007

ORIGINAL PROCUREMENT

METHOD: Competitive Sealed Bids

CONTRACTOR: Banc of America Public Capital Corp

**FUND SOURCES:** Energy savings from equipment and facility improvements

**AMOUNT:** \$30,000,000.00

**REMARKS:** The Board approved award of this contract for financing, on a consolidated basis, up to \$30 million in energy performance contracts for equipment and facility improvements, under a master lease-purchase agreement. On August 30, 2006, the Board approved the first amendment to the EPC Lease Agreement, acknowledging the assignment of the Agreement from Banc of America Leasing & Capital, LLC to Banc of America Public Capital Corp, and changing the pricing formula by expanding the use of Treasury indices and by modifying the Contractor's discounts used to calculate financing interest rates.

The proposed second amendment permits financing under the EPC Lease Agreement of energy performance contract costs beginning at the start of construction, rather than beginning after construction completion. Up until now the energy performance contract vendors have financed the costs of the improvements during the construction phase, and included those

construction phase financing costs in their final invoices, and were then part of the total amount subsequently lease-financed by the Treasurer's Office. This amendment will allow Banc of America Public Capital Corp to provide construction phase financing at EPC Lease Agreement rates, which are considerably lower than vendor-financing rates. Of the \$19.9 million remaining to be financed under the EPC Lease Agreement, the State could potentially realize savings of approximately \$1 million by implementing this second amendment.

Funds to pay the energy performance contract vendors for the construction phases would be deposited with an escrow agent. Banc of America has agreed to use its best efforts to contract with minority-owned banks to serve as the escrow agents.

The proposed second amendment also extends the estimated term of the EPC Lease Agreement by three months. A major energy performance contract for Spring Grove State Hospital, which will use up the \$19.9 million remaining to be financed under the EPC Lease Agreement, is expected to be presented to the Board for approval in August 2007. Extending the estimated term, will allow additional time in the event of schedule changes for the Spring Grove State Hospital project, and will more accurately reflect the date by which the parties anticipate the \$30 million originally authorized will have been lease-financed.

### 7. MARYLAND SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF

**Recommendation:** That the Board of Public Works authorize the construction of an elementary school/student support services building on the Frederick campus of the Maryland School for the Deaf by overruling the decision of the City of Frederick Planning Commission that found the project's extent to be inconsistent with the 2004 City of Frederick comprehensive plan.

<u>Authority</u>: State law provides that "if a local legislative body has adopted a whole plan . . . , a public building . . . may not be constructed or authorized . . . until the location, character, and extent of the development has been submitted to and approved by the planning commission as consistent with the plan. . . [T]he body that has jurisdiction over the financing of the public . . . building . . . may overrule the decision by a recorded vote of not less than 2/3 of its entire membership." Section 3.08 of Article 66B, Maryland Code. The Attorney General advises that the Board of Public Works is a body with jurisdiction and has the authority to overrule the City of Frederick Planning Commission.

**Background:** Reference is made to DGS Item 2-AE (7/6/2005) in which the Board approved the award of an Architectural/Engineering contract to prepare "detailed plans and specifications for the construction of a new elementary school with an adjoining student support services building and a family education/early intervention center at the Maryland School for the Deaf's Frederick campus." In a companion Item on today's Agenda, DGS is seeking Board approval of the award of the construction contract. DGS Item 1-C (5/23/07).

In accordance with State law, the School submitted its project to the City of Frederick Planning Commission (which adopted a comprehensive plan in 2004). The Commission, by letter dated April 10, 2007, found the project's location and character to be consistent with the 2004 Plan but found the project's extent to be inconsistent. Specifically, the Commission found that:

- The entrance way located off of MD-355 was inadequately designed
- The interior traffic flow could be more adequately planned to conform to the 2004 Plan

# 10. STATE PUBLIC SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION PROGRAM:

Qualified Zone Academy Bond Program

**Recommendation:** The Interagency Committee on School Construction recommends that the Board of Public Works: certify that the grantees have provided and documented matching funds; and authorize disbursing Qualified Zone Academy Bond (QZAB) proceeds for the projects listed in the attached table.

**Background:** The QZAB Program, administered by the Interagency Committee, funds capital improvements, repairs, maintenance, and deferred maintenance of existing school buildings. The General Assembly – through the QZAB Loan Act of 2005 – authorized the creation of a State debt in the amount of \$9,364,000, the proceeds of which are to be allocated to eligible school systems in accordance with the Aging School Program. (Chapter 431, Acts of 2005.) The Act requires grantees to provide a matching fund as specified under the federal law governing this program (10% private business contributions). The Act requires grantees to present evidence satisfactory to the Board that the total matching fund will be provided and is documented no later than June 1, 2007.

Previously the Board approved the allocation of \$12,851,000 in QZABs among the various school systems. (Nov. 16, 2005, Secretary's Item 6.) This total comprises \$9,364,000 as authorized by QZAB Loan Act of 2005; \$2,855,000 from prior QZAB issues being re-allocated; and \$632,000 in accumulated interest.

On December 6, 2006, the Board of Public Works sold the first installment of the QZAB Loan of 2005, in the amount of \$4,378,000 (amount of the federal QZAB authorization for Maryland for calendar year 2004). Matching funds for the projects to be financed by that sale were certified and documented as part of that bond sale.

The remaining installment, in the amount of \$4,986,000 (amount of the federal QZAB authorization for Maryland for calendar year 2005), must be issued by December 31, 2007. However, the matching fund must be certified and the QZAB proceeds encumbered by June 1, 2007. The Interagency Committee has approved twelve QZAB projects for Baltimore City and four additional projects for Baltimore County; the school systems have provided and documented the required matching funds.

Action: Board of Public Works approval is requested to:

- (1) Certify the matching funds.
- (2) Encumber the QZAB proceeds.
- (3) Disburse the QZAB proceeds as needed for these projects. No State funds will be disbursed until the school system presents evidence to the Public School Construction Program that the project is complete and the required matching fund has been expended.

Public School Construction Capital Improvement Program - Fiscal Year 2008


**Recommendation:** The Interagency Committee on School Construction recommends that the Board of Public Works amend the Public School Construction Capital Improvement Program for fiscal year 2008 in Cecil County by:

- approving \$2,000,000 to fund the Perryville High School HVAC/roof systemic renovation project; and
- reducing funding for the Calvert Elementary School Renovation/Addition project by \$2,000,000.

**Background:** Reference is made to the Public School Construction Capital Improvement Program for fiscal year 2008 which the Board approved on May 9, 2007 (Secretary's Agenda Item 10). After the General Assembly session but before submitting recommendations for project approvals to the Interagency Committee, Public School Construction Program staff contacted all school systems to determine their specific project allocation requests for the additional funds allocated by the General Assembly. The PSCP recommendation to the IAC did not take into account a verbal communication from the Cecil County Public Schools concerning desired fund distribution.

Approval of this Item will allow the HVAC/roof project at Perryville High School to proceed to construction in Summer 2007 as requested by Cecil County Public Schools. The total FY 2008 allocation for the Calvert Elementary School Renovation/Addition project will decrease from \$8,088,000 to \$6,088,000. The total FY 2008 CIP allocation for Cecil County Public Schools will remain unchanged at \$9,533,000.

**Authority:** This action is consistent with Section 5-301 of the Education Article, Maryland Code and COMAR 23.03.02.03E.

#### REMARKS

Nature of Emergency: The emergency nature of this procurement arises because of a confluence of events: (1) the filing of two major utility distribution rate cases in November of 2006, which by law requires a decision by June 15, 2007; (2) the re-constitution of the majority of the Commission effective March 26, 2007; and (3) the lack of in-house expertise in the matters presented in the case by the Commission. By statute, the Commission must complete its rate case review no more than 180 days from the proposed effective date of the Potomac Electric Power Company's tariff (June 15, 2007). The proposed increase rate increase by PEPCO would increase revenues from ratepayers by \$55.7 million. The economic consequence of this proposal to Maryland ratepayers is significant, and the public interest requires the Commission to obtain outside expert consulting on an expedited basis. It is therefore essential that expert confidential utility rate case consulting services be available to the Commission.

Basis for Selection: Three vendors known to be capable of performing the requested work were provided the scope of work. Two of the vendors combined their responses. Thus, the Commission received only two bids. EnWater Resource Consultants, L.L.C. possess significant experience and expertise in the area of electric utility regulation and rate-making in particular. Additionally, the background of the principal personnel (higher education professors) also ensures that they possess the ability to communicate clearly and concisely complex utility rate-making principles.

**REMARKS:** On Tuesday, January 9, 2007 MTA personnel, inspecting the Owings Mills crossover (a crossover enables trains to transfer from one track to the other), discovered a two-inch break in the rail and declared the situation an emergency, requiring immediate attention. Movement on the track was halted and a temporary fix was made to maintain service. After the fix, a twelve-mile per hour speed restriction was implemented for safety reasons. The speed restriction must remain in effect until the turnouts are replaced.

Due to the unexpected breaks, the reconstruction project was done as an emergency procurement, as replacement materials for this type of rail project can take up to 5 months to deliver after order. The time to acquire the rail materials required to replace the turnouts following a normal procurement cycle would have caused the project to be performed during the colder weather months. To ensure passenger safety and reliability, Metro Operations has advised against performing these repairs in colder weather.

The work consists of demolishing the existing Owings Mills crossovers and installing replacement crossovers, including all required subballast, ballast, concrete switch ties, special trackwork, signal cabling electric switch layouts and equipment, crib heaters and switch heaters.

The MTA solicited 5 vendors that had successfully completed projects of this type on the MTA Metro system and received 4 bids. The contract for this work was awarded March 6, 2007 to Railroad Constructors, Inc. The engineer's estimate for this project is \$3,004,070.00. This project is 100% State funded.



The solicitation notice was mailed or e-mailed directly to 21 prospective vendors, 17 of whom were Maryland firms, and included 7 MBEs. A copy was also sent to the Governor's Office of Minority Affairs. Seven proposals were received in response to the RFP, all of which were determined to be reasonably susceptible of being selected for award.

The RFP contained a 25% MBE goal. The recommended offeror will meet this goal by subcontracting with a Maryland certified MBE. However, since the recommended offeror is a Maryland certified MBE itself, 100% of the contract activities will be performed by an MBE.

The MTA requires a qualified Contractor to conduct Multi-Media Environmental Compliance Audits at 12 of its facilities. Multi-Media Environmental Compliance Audits (Audits) include the following basic methods to gather the information required to complete the Audits: (1) document review; (2) interviews of facility personnel; (3) site investigations including visual/field observations; and, (4) environmental sampling, testing and/or analysis, only as directed by MTA. The Contractor shall also use media-specific investigation techniques, as appropriate, to effectively audit the statutory and regulatory requirements.

Although the MTA has about 300 total properties, the twelve sites to be audited under this contract are the ones that are the most "industrialized" in terms of fueling, storm water, painting, etc. Accordingly, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has agreed that these 12 MTA sites are the only ones for which Audits are needed.

The Audits will determine if the twelve MTA facilities are in compliance with applicable Federal, State of Maryland, and local environmental laws, regulations, permits and orders, and will identify root causes of any areas of noncompliance.

Peer Consultants is recommended for the awarding of this contract as being the most advantageous offeror for this service. As per the terms of the RFP technical factors had greater weight than financial factors in determining the most advantageous offer. Peer Consultants was the highest ranked offeror technically. Although Peer ranked 5<sup>th</sup> in terms of its financial offer price (out of 7 offerors), the technical superiority of Peer, as described below, was determined to outweigh the price difference with all other offerors.

Peer Consultants' proposal clearly demonstrated superior levels of experience with all relevant statutes and regulations, and all proposed project team members had relevant experience necessary to conduct the work. Peer's ability to assemble a qualified team was an essential element and was successfully demonstrated in the technical proposal. Peer has extensive knowledge of environmental compliance and management activities at transportation/ transit related operations, and the related pollution control technologies and waste management processes that are used in such operations. Peer's proposal noted specific transit operations related experience, to include bus, rail and light rail equipment and facilities, as well as associated maintenance and support facilities.

Peer has performed such audits at LA Transit, DART in Dallas, SEPTA (Southeast Penn. Transit Authority), etc., and all references were positive. **REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS:** The contractor receives payment from two sources for services provided under this contract. Since Holly Center residents are eligible for Medical Assistance the bulk of contract services are paid to the contractor directly by the Medical Assistance Program (MA). Direct payments from MA approximate \$650,000 per year. Overthe-counter (non-prescription) medications and certain other medications are not reimbursable by MA. These non-MA-covered medications are paid to the contractor directly the Center. Holly Center direct payments approximate \$45,000 per year.

When this contract was first awarded the Center erroneously sought approvals based only on the \$45,000 level paid by the Center, rather than the full \$695,000 annual value received by the contractor because of the contract. This oversight was corrected when the Center received retroactive approval from the Board for the first three years of the contract (see Attachment). However, despite this previous retroactive Board approval, for the third and final renewal option the Center again submitted a timely approval request for only the \$45,000 of direct payments by the Center. DBM approved this \$45,000 renewal submission in February 2007.

In reviewing the February 2007 DBM PAAR it was recognized that the third renewal amount for the Center should have been approximately \$695,000 rather than \$45,000. Accordingly, this item has been removed from the DBM February 2007 PAAR and is being submitted in this Item for retroactive approval.

The Holly Center is requesting approval to exercise this contract option due very favorable pricing under the original contract. Other facilities have experienced drastic price increases due to current market conditions. This contract will provide complete pharmacy services to Holly Center twenty-four hours a day – seven days a week.

It is the intention of Holly Center to re-solicit for these services. New contract specifications will be drafted in the summer of 2007 due to the many changes in the Medicare D Plan, which affects this contract. This anticipated timetable would allow for an award of a new contract by March of 2008.

**REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS:** On 7/3/1995, the Department of General

Services issued a Request for Proposals known as "Statewide Communication Sites Resource Sharing", Project AST-9505-RSSC, known as "Resource Sharing". This project publicly offered existing State owned communications infrastructure and real property to erect new communications towers in exchange for equipment, services, fees, or other considerations, including resources needed by the State to implement new wireless communications systems into a comprehensive communications network.

The original lease agreement formed under the RFP issued by DGS used the two tower-mounted antenna platforms for two different wireless communications technologies. One platform was used for "GSM" technology transmissions and the second one was used for "CDMA" technology transmissions. The tower is owned by the State Highway Administration (SHA) which receives the lease payments.

In 1996 the responsibility for telecommunications functions was transferred from DGS to DBM. Accordingly, the first renewal option for this agreement was approved in DBM BPW Agenda Item 14-IT-MOD of 8/7/02. This first renewal option included approval of a modified lease agreement, incorporating modified terms and conditions in accordance with changes in State law and Board policies subsequent to the original agreement.

This Resource Sharing agreement is not a procurement contract as covered by Division II of the State Finance and Procurement Article and COMAR Title 21. Unlike a procurement contract, the renewal options in this agreement require the mutual approval of both parties (under a procurement contract the State has the unilateral authority to exercise any renewal option). At this time the contractor has agreed to exercise both remaining renewal options. Approving these options at this time will "lock-in" the revenue provided by this agreement for a 10 year period at a rate which escalates at 4% per year.

Exercising only 1 option at his time will mean that anytime over the next 5 years the contractor can decide for any reason (changing technology, decreasing market prices, withdrawal from this marketplace, etc.) that it does not wish to renew this agreement. **REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS:** Under this resource coordination contract, services are provided through resource coordinators who facilitate and maintain enrollments in the DDA Medicaid Waiver Program ("Waiver Program"). Each resource coordinator also leads the development and monitoring of annual individual plans for at least 45 individuals with developmental disabilities.

At the inception of this contract at the beginning of FY04, it was expected that Resource Connections of Prince George's County, Inc. ("Resource Connections") would provide services for up to 1,014 individuals. This was a modest increase over the total number of individuals served by the previous contractor. However, Resource Connections has been able to serve many more individuals than originally projected. For example, in June 2006, 1,510 individuals were receiving on-going resource coordination services from Resource Connections. By June 2007, DDA expects that 1,915 will be receiving on-going services.

As indicated in the Attachment, the third renewal option was submitted to and approved by DBM, under delegation authority contained in the original Board Item. This renewal approval will appear on a DBM PAAR. However, despite the above described projection of 1,915 clients anticipated to receive services by June 2007, the 3<sup>rd</sup> renewal amount was based upon the original projection of 1,014 clients receiving services. Moreover, DDA projects that 2,034 individuals will be receiving on-going services by June, 2008. This represents a more than 100% increase in client count versus the 1,014 number the 3<sup>rd</sup> option was predicated upon. This modification for FY 2008 is therefore necessary to adequately fund resource coordination services for the additional 901 to 1,020 individuals with developmental disabilities in Prince George's County which are projected to receive services in addition to the 1,014 for which funding was approved in the 3<sup>rd</sup> renewal option.

REQUESTING AGENCY REMARKS: DJS has determined that it is in the State's best interest to re-open the Victor Cullen Academy as a state-operated facility for 48 male youth. Current law does not permit the facility to operate under a provider contract after July 1, 2008. The Department requests the creation of these new positions for the Victor Cullen Academy to be effective July 1, 2007. A facility staffing chart is attached. Funding for these new positions was included in Supplemental Budget #2 for FY 2008. Not all 100 positions will be filled immediately. Positions will be filled as the youth population of the center increases over the course of the fiscal year. **REQUESTING INSTITUTION REMARKS:** Originally constructed in 1921 and transferred to the University in 1965, the 23,698 GSF Hillcrest Building was vacated in 2000 due to its deteriorated condition and non-compliance with life safety and building codes. The cost of renovation of the brick building was estimated to exceed its replacement cost and the university initiated plans to demolish the building and reuse the site for parking and recreation facilities for resident students.

The State Clearinghouse conducted an intergovernmental review of the project under MD20060713-0783 and has recommended to change the use, and demolish the Hillcrest Building pending the completion and submission of a Determination of Eligibility form for review by the Maryland Historical Trust. In addition to submitting the Determination of Eligibility, per the Trust's request, the University has provided studies evaluating the structural integrity of the building, identifying the potential adaptive reuses for the building, and estimating the cost of the potential new uses. In correspondence dated April 9, 2007, the Trust agreed with the University that the building must be demolished and requested photographic recordation. The University provided the required photographs. The Trust completed its review and indicated that no further action was required as of April 30, 2007.

The University has completed the abatement of asbestos and other hazardous material and arranged for the recycling and disposal of the demolition material to meet the Maryland Department of Environment's programs. The demolition/reclamation plans and the Erosion Sediment Control Permit are completed. Pending Board of Public Works approval, the University intends to demolish the building during the summer 2007 under the previously approved On-Call Design/Build Contract #C-00559 (BPW Approval 06/21/06, Item 1-C) at a cost of \$400,000 using institutional funds under appropriation code R30B31.





The Maryland Department of the Environment has issued final permit review comments and the construction documents are being readied for bidding, with advertisement anticipated in late May. Unfortunately this will not allow adequate time for the construction contract to be brought before the Board prior to the July 1, 2007 expiration deadline necessitating the request for an exception. This temporary exception will allow the Department to expend the remaining funds to construct the project.

The Sassafras NRMA is a critical link in the recently approved Captain John Smith Chesapeake Natural Historic Water Trail. This project includes the relocation of the main access road into the Management Area and will provide for a stable roadbed for public access, and the prevention of further soil erosion at the site.


